Milladge & Grace Murphy had been missing for some time & it wasn't until after they got back that this reporter knew they had spent about a month in "jolly Ole England".

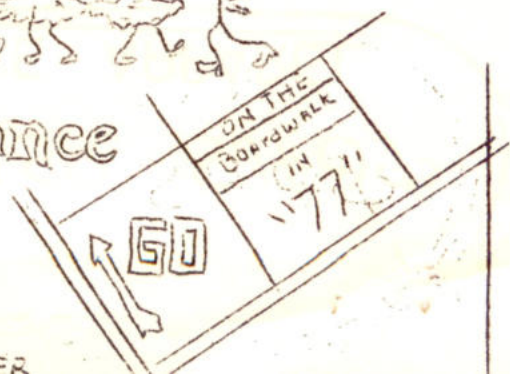
