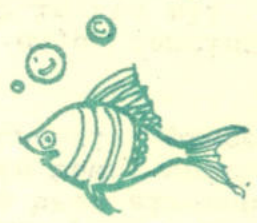

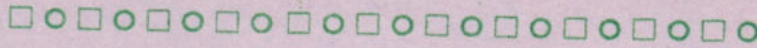

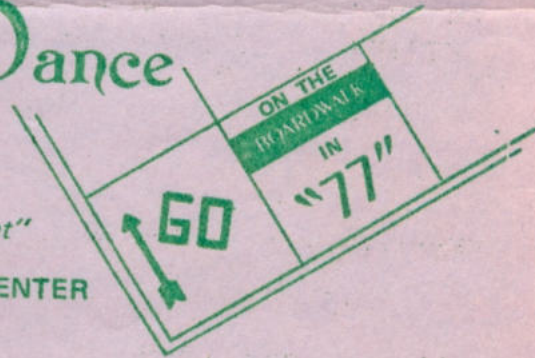

A good majority of our club attended the 5th Saturday Dance with Ron Schneider calling.

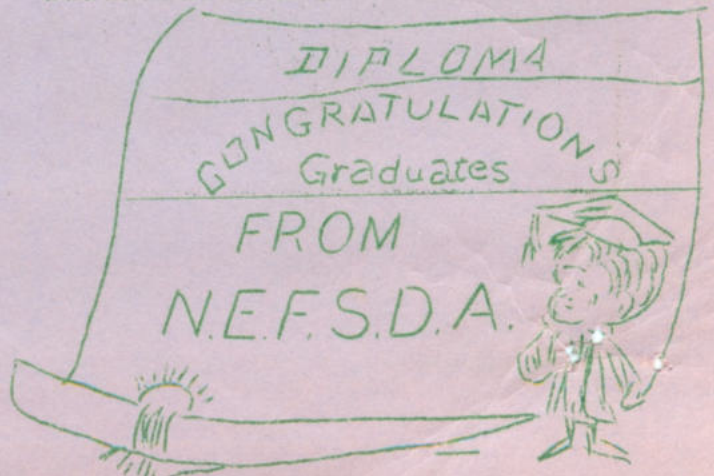

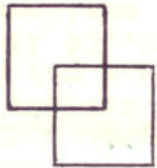

CALLERLAB - THE INTERNATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF S/D CALLERS

Callerlab recently completed its 4th International Convention. The major issue discussed by callers from all over the U.S, Canada & several foreign countries dealt with the relationship of CALLERLAB to the National Square Dance Convention. Callerlab shares the concern to improve major dance events & recognizes that many areas of running a convention do not lend themselves to simple solutions. A resolution was presented calling for the support of the concept of National Square Dance Conventions. This resolution was defeated.

WHAT THIS MEANS: WHAT IT DID DO.

Essentially it maintains the status quo. This still allows the individual Callerlab members to choose to go or not to go, to support or not support individual National Square Dance Conv. This enables Callerlab to devote greater energies to problems & concerns that are primarily of interest to callers.

WHAT IT DID DO: It did not rule out future discussions between Callerlab & National Executive Committee or between Callerlab & a sponsoring National Square Dance Convention group. Callerlab as a body will not take on the responsibility of programming at this time. It did not condemn the National Executive Committee or any sponsoring National Square Dance Convention. Callerlab feels that solutions to problems are only brought about by analysis & discussion of those problems. The defeat of the resolution does not rule out the possibility of the governing body of Callerlab from setting up a committee to respond to specific requests from the National Executive Committee or a sponsoring National Square Dance Convention Committee. MINORITIES

The clique 'can't see the forest for the trees' frequently applies to people being worried & badgered by minority

groups..it is sometimes difficult to derive a proper perspective when being harrassed by minority groups. This article does not concern itself with minorities of the 'loyal opposition' type who openly oppose the current leadership, openly vote against the programs they oppose, yet support their leaders & the organization after the majority opinion is decided.

Minorities are important..they are the critics that show our leaders the areas to consider for change & improvement. The minority's views & opinions must be considered by the organization & its leaders, whether their reason for dissent is concern for the organization or petty or personal jealousies. Minorities must be bound by the same rules of conduct & honesty as the majority if the majority is to give full credence to their views & opinions.

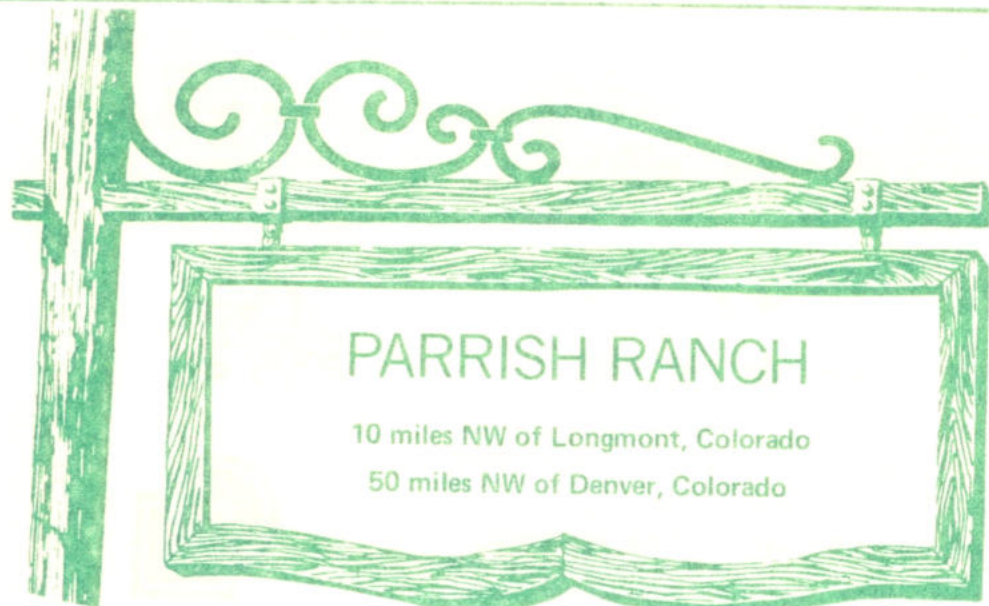
Minorities have certain advantages over the majority. Their advantage lies in their ability to better organize their small group. Their zeal for change sometimes develop into obsession, overshadowing reason. A well organized minority can sound off with the voice that is heard more prominently than the majority. It is often difficult to realize that the majority of an organization does not agree with this vocal minority. It is a sad fact of life that contented people do not shout of their contentment, but the dissatisfied people will always shout of their discontent. One of the tough jobs of an executive is to resist the urge to satisfy a noisy minority that incur the displeasure of the majority.

A fact about square dancing that is the hidden strength of many of its long time leaders: "When Square Dancers are informed of all the facts in any situation, they will decide for the good of square dancing". The education problem of getting all the facts to all the dancers can be a very difficult one.. When bigotry & malice are obvious, square dancing can be very brutal. This has been demonstrated many time in the past. Square dancers are very proud of their organization & will become very ruthless toward anyone attempting to destroy it.

Square Dancers, in general, love & support their organization because it is the basis of all that we have in square dancing.

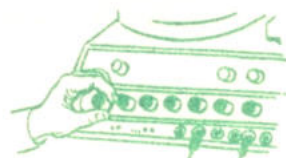

THE QUARTERLY MOVEMENT REPORT

APRIL — MAY — JUNE

BY CALLERLAB

A single movement, *Crossfire*, is the current selection of the CALLERLAB Quarterly Movements Committee

ONCE AGAIN the CALLERLAB Quarterly Mainstream Experimental Basics Committee has selected only one movement for the current quarter—April, May and June. The movement selected is *Crossfire*.

Crossfire by Ron Schneider starts from a two-faced line. The ends of the line will cross fold as the centers trade and then extend (step ahead) to join hands with the dancer who has completed the cross fold.

As a suggested teaching sequence, from normal two-faced lines set up with the boys on the ends and girls as centers (arrived at by having the dancers swing thru and boys run), have the boys cross fold to stand behind the girl who is in the furthest center position. Next have the girls trade and extend (step ahead) to join right hands with the awaiting man. The action—which takes four beats—is now complete. Practice the action so as to have both dancers react at the same time and the movement will time out well. From this setup the ending formations will be columns.

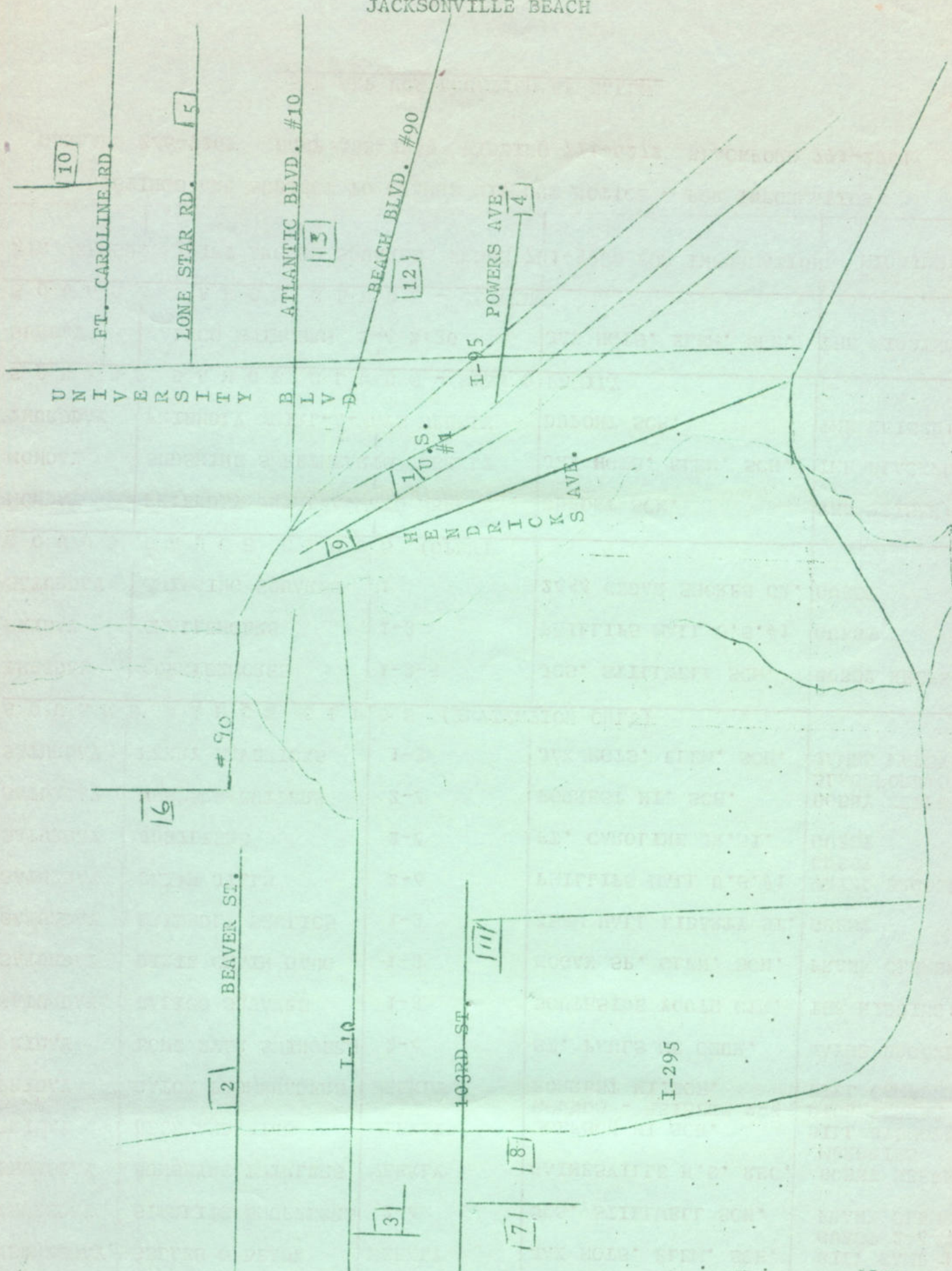

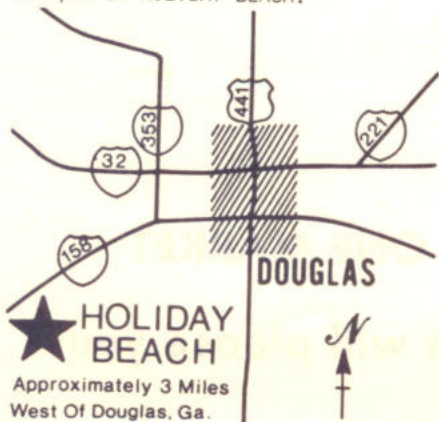

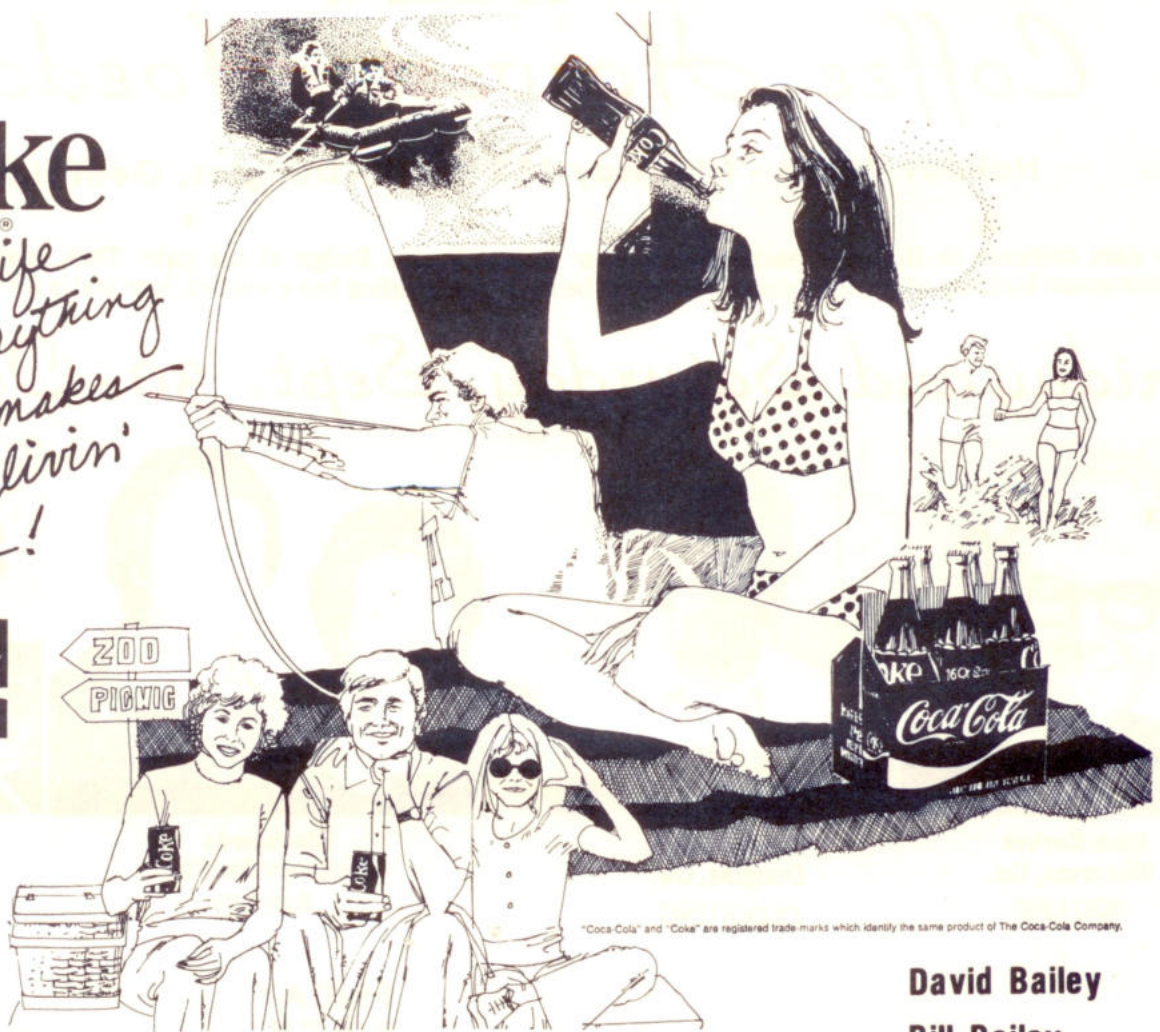
