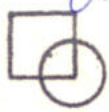

PRESS RELEASE FROM CALLERLAB

We would like to call attention to several changes in the Mainstream and Plus Programs that reflect significant differences from previous lists. The Mainstream list consists of two segments. The Basic Program (B) reflects a combination of the previous Basic and Extended Basic Programs. The calls are the same although there are some changes in suggested teaching order and there are some minor changes in the way in which the calls appear. We have added the dates of the calls where known. We would also urge all of your readers to read the narrative on the back of the page since this provides suggested guidelines on the use of levels and makes some additional suggestions on classes and the logical progression to other levels when dancers are ready to try some additional plateaus.

The Plus lists reflect some major changes. Several Quarterly Selections were added to the Plus I list and two Plus II calls were moved to the Plus I list. The end result is that the Plus I list is now 17 calls long. CALLERLAB members voted to drop three calls from the Plus II list in addition to the calls moved to the Plus I list. Grand Swing Thru and 3/4 Tag the Line have been added. Swap Around, Curley Cross and All Eight Swing Thru have been dropped from the Plus II list. It is anticipated that the two lists will be combined at the CALLERLAB Convention in 1982.

Please also note that the Mainstream list has been frozen for a period of three years. Additions to the Mainstream list can only be made to the list in the calls 49-68 area and only if the calls recommended meet the eligibility requirements of having been on the QS list for a period of three

years. CALLERLAB feels that this stability will benefit square dancers all over the world and we hope that all clubs and callers support this new designation.

EDITOR COMMENT: We include this press release for the purpose of dancers knowing what this fine organization is doing. While all callers in the NE area are not members of CALLERLAB, most follow the subscribed guidelines. Also included in this issue are the two lists mentioned above. The cost to provide these lists (printed by Callerlab) were paid by the Grapevine as an educational service to our subscribers. We intend to do more of this in the future.

SUBJECT: CLASSES

Recently there appeared in the GRAPEVINE (NEFSDA Minutes) a negative reaction to callers who were starting classes in the winter and early spring. The implication was that the reason for starting classes then was to feed dancers into clubs in a shorter than usual time. From the caller's standpoint the reason that the classes were started was that there were interested persons who wanted to dance and that the time to teach them well was available. There was no attempt or purpose to reject the excellent program that now exists and is supported by the Northeast Association.

All callers in the Gateway Association support the current Callerlab programs and they are teaching the calls well within a 30-week minimum period of time. As all callers and dancers know the 30-week minimum only allows for introduction to the mainstream program. Dancers and callers are committed to a strong club program that will continue to build upon all previous knowledge. Since a major objective of dancing is the fun and fellowship of being with dancers from other clubs and areas, no caller can, nor is interested in, having his/her dancers unable or afraid to dance outside their own club.

The slogan "Teach them well" is subscribed to by the Gateway Callers Association and clubs that have callers who are active members of the Gateway Association. Association will not have to worry about dancers flowing into their clubs without a good fundamental program. The Northeast Association and the Gateway Association have, for many years, been mutually supportive of quality square dancing. The Gateway Callers Association will continue to work in a positive manner with all efforts of the Northeast Association to promote square dancing in Florida.

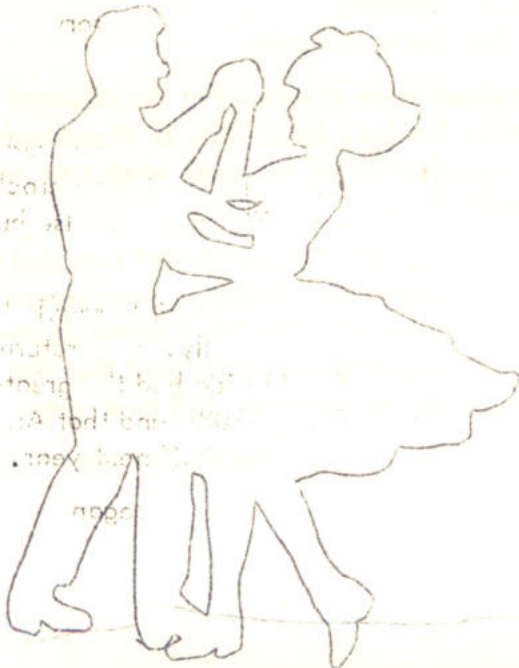

1984 STATE CONVENTION

During the 97th Congress, Rep. Mineta introduced a joint resolution (H.J. 151) making Square Dancing the National Folk Dance of the United States. This resolution was referred to the committee on Post Office and Civil Service.

The rules of Congress are strict and complicated (218 Co-sponsors are needed to move a commemorative resolution out of committee) and there is no way to move this resolution through Congress without a combined effort of all those concerned.

As a dancer, write your House Representative and request that he co-sponsor H.J. 151. Also, write your two Senators.

He has received an answer from the cuers, thanking him and saying that they would be glad to participate in the after party. The tickets will be sent to them about Oct. 1. Flippo will not be able to call here in 1983, as his schedule has changed. Another caller will be chosen at the Fall Round-Up Committee meeting today. Under consideration are Jon Jones, Jerry Haag and Paul Marcum. Round dance cuers also will be chosen today. The Fall Round-Up Committee outfits are nearly

completed. Fred thanked Jessie Hart for making a lot of the numbers and letters on the outfits.

GRAPEVINE: Paul Walker, Editor, gave the following report: The transfer of Editor responsibilities was completed in Mar. 1981. Paul & Mita Walker, Editors, and Ernie & Ruby Holt, Co-Editors, with the assistance of Jim & Mary Jo Wright, published the April-May issue.

The Wrights have kept \$100 to clear up some outstanding Grapevine bills. When these are paid, the balance will be returned to the Grapevine account.

Paul stated that the Grapevine will be used as a vehicle of education and exchange of information. Clubs are encouraged to submit material concerning club activities and they encourage the leaders of the NE Fl. Callers Assoc., Round Dance Council, Clogging Council and NEFSDA Officers to submit articles for publication. From time to time letters to the Editor will be published. The Editors reserve the right to edit submitted material.

They plan to have feature articles in each issue. He introduced Ernie & Ruby Holt, Co-Editors. Ernie mentioned several new ideas for the Grapevine--they want to set up a special page of ads that will run every month from callers or vendors, giving them a special rate, and ads from dancers who have items to sell. They plan to Spotlight one club in each issue, with pictures, history and anything the members want to tell the other dancers about their club. They hope to give a full page to the article so that all the clubs can learn more about the other clubs in NE. They plan to visit new classes in about the 6th week to introduce the Grapevine to class members and hope the callers will cooperate with information that will be helpful to new dancers--such as styling, etiquette, etc.

Ad rates and subscription rates of \$3 has not changed for over 5 years. They want to increase publication from bi-monthly to monthly in Jan. '82 and, at the same time, announce an increase in the ad and subscription rates. They want to have a monthly calendar of activities, including club dance nights, in each issue. Their major objective is to make the Grapevine so useful that every dancer becomes a subscriber.

Paul asked for permission to write a check, payable to cash, for miscellaneous small purchases from time to time. The

Board granted the permission, provided he kept receipts of the purchases. Paul also said they would like to visit each club twice a year and, when visiting on Grapevine business, asked that they be admitted free to the dance. Lou Connally made a motion that the NEFSDA recommends that when the Walkers and Holts visit a club on Grapevine business that they be admitted at no charge. The motion was seconded and carried. If any club does not wish to do this, the Editors will pay their own way in and be reimbursed from Grapevine funds.

Paul said they were thinking of putting out a directory of all clubs in the area with information as to location, time, contacts, etc. Frank Hamwey said he had been contacted by MW, who had changed their minds and would now like to join with NE in putting out a directory.

PICNIC: Frank Hamwey thanked Paul and Nita Walker for the great job they did as Chmn. of the first NEFSDA picnic. Between 175-200 people attended and had a great time. Paul thanked the Picnic Committee members for their help and recommended that it become an annual event on the first Sat. in April. A motion was made, seconded and carried that the NEFSDA picnic be an annual event. Ray & Margaret Kaczmarczyk were appointed Chmn. for the 1982 picnic with location and date to be decided later.

BLOOD BANK: June Keiser, Chmn., reported 44 pints on hand. Betty Collins, a member of Dixie Chain Gang, received 2 pints; Frank Smith, past Pres. of NEFSDA and current Pres. of the Fl. Fed. of Square Dancers, received 2 pints; and the father-in-law of the Chmn. of the Mill Creek Junction Squares received 3 pints.

It was reported that Frank Smith, who was recovering from heart surgery, was sent flowers from NEFSDA and a "thank you" note from him was read.

FIFTH SATURDAY: Frank Hamwey reminded everyone of the next 5th Sat. Dance on May 30, at Forrest HS--Doc Gray calling; Ted Keiser on the rounds. Host clubs are Quartermores and Riverside Ramblers.

SOLO: Marie Fisher reported that the Seabreeze Singles have been approached by the Fl. Assoc. of Single Square and Round Dancers to have the Singles Conv. in Jacksonville in Oct. 1982. It has not yet been discussed in the Club but, if they decide to have it here, they will need a lot of help. Flyers are out for their July 4th dance--Dale McClary will be the caller with the Blackfords on the rounds. There will be both square and round dance workshops.

CALLERLAB recommends 29 sessions of 2-2½ hours each or approximately 60 hours of instruction to teach the BASIC PROGRAM (Calls 1-48). 41 sessions to teach the MAINSTREAM PROGRAM (Calls 1-68). Do not teach from just a single position/formation and remember to teach styling as well. Calls in italics may be deferred until later.

CALLERLAB

WHY LISTS AND LEVELS?

CALLERLAB lists have been developed to provide guidance to those who teach Square Dance Classes, to Callers for programming the appropriate level of the dances they call and to dancers for scheduling dances they will enjoy the most. The levels or programs are not intended to segregate dancers into exclusive groups or to indicate that one who chooses to dance at his or her own preferred level is any better or any worse than any other dancer. Dancing skill can be achieved at many levels, and the quantity of calls is not necessarily an indication of dancer proficiency. It is hoped that the lists will be used as intended to aid in a logical teaching progression and thorough coverage of basics in classes and to provide an enjoyable modern Square Dance for dancers of all inclinations. In addition, CALLERLAB's intent is that approved styling and timing of Square Dance movements will be an integral part of all classes and dance programs. It is also hoped that proper teaching to include timing and styling will result in smooth flowing dancing to the music for the greater enjoyment of all.

BASIC/MAINSTREAM - HOW LONG?

The new BASIC PROGRAM (B), which consists of the previous BASIC and EXTENDED BASIC PROGRAMS, may well be an excellent first year program in many areas. 29 sessions of 2 to 2 ½ hour each are recommended to teach the BASIC PROGRAM properly and that fits well into the 30 weeks often available in many areas. It is recommended that 41 sessions of 2 to 2 ½ hours each be used to teach the full MAINSTREAM PROGRAM.

WHAT NEXT?

Quite a few responsible leaders within and outside of CALLERLAB recommend that dancers dance regularly at the level at which they graduate for at least one year before they enter into workshops for additional levels of dancing. This means that if you graduate at the Mainstream or QS level, stay there for a year before going into Plus levels. If you graduate at the Plus Level, stay there for a year before going into Advanced etc. Stay at each level as long as you are enjoying it and having fun.

GREATER ENJOYMENT

Proper execution of the Basics at the BASIC and MAINSTREAM level will result in more comfortable and enjoyable dancing and make entry into other levels that much easier. There should be no pressure for movement from one level to another once a dancer has graduated. Dancers should be encouraged to take their time, enjoy what they are doing and learn to dance well at their chosen level.

ADVERTISE
