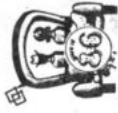

CALLER OF THE MONTH

CHUCK JOYEUSAZ

Chuck was born in Dover, Delaware in 1933 and attended school there up thru 6th grade and then attended Massanutten Military Academy grades 7 thru 9 in Virginia. Joined the Navy (air) and after A/C mechanic school in Memphis Tenn., was stationed at N.A.S. Jax in the Hurricane Squadron until discharged in 1955. Returned to Dover and went into the Real Estate business with his parents and because of recession in that area went to work for USAF as a civilian A/C mechanic. The north's cold weather sent us another snowbird (lucky us) and then Chuck went into furniture sales for awhile. In 1963 he went to work for the City of Jax Police Dept. and retired 21 years later.

Learned to square dance back in '77 from Johnny Robbins and Art Wilson and decided to become a caller before he graduated from these classes. After a few months he decided to specialize in 'One Nighters' and worked with Jim Morgan to develop routines. Later on Jerry Barrett 'prodded' Chuck into applying for his White Badge Status in Florida Callers Assoc. He then met and married Debbie Simpson and then became a member of one of the local square dance families. Deb's mother and step-father are Louise & Herman Ibach; Aunt & Uncle, Liz & Ray Valentine.

His goal is for the State of Florida to have Basic 45 clubs throughout the State of Florida. These clubs are also for anyone who doesn't have time to take the full Mainstream class, can spend just a short time in class and begin dancing a couple of times a month and enjoy square dancing.

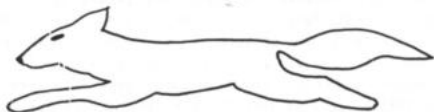

ROUND III: "My Subject"

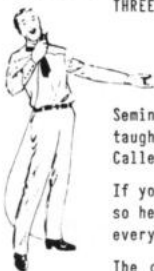

Have you ever wondered who does all the work so we can enjoy square and round dancing, or what this work entails?

In every organization there are people who take, people who give, and people who take and give. The optimum, of course, is to have an organization of people who both take and give.

Every committee serving our square and round dancing community is having difficulty getting volunteers. Have we ever thought of what our dancing community would be like if no one gave? We would have no dancer's association or no caller's association. We would have no publication. There would be no communication to bring us all the nice things we now enjoy - levels of dancing above mainstream would be nonexistent because nobody "gave" to organize them.

It is easy to say "I have no free time, as I dance two nights a week, do other work three nights a week and the other two nights am tired and wish time off" or "I am afraid to try because I just know I would be no good at it". These and many more "reasons"
