## CUER OF THE MONTH

### WAYNE & BARBARA BLACKFORD

Wayne is from Jacksonville and was stationed in New York with the U.S. Air Force in 1959 when he met and married a local girl, Barbara. They have two daughters, Lauri and Kathleen. "And one special son, Ken," said Barbara, "who is married to Lauri. They are the parents of my beautiful granddaughter, Kristen."

After the Air Force, Wayne went into the Service Station business with his father for about 20 years. Then, he and his brother opened the Blackford Brothers Used Cars, specializing in Antiques and Classics. "Wayne has been working with cars all of his life," said Barbara, "and this past January some thing unusual happened. We were coming home from a dance and we were tired. Wayne and Barbara are members of the Round Dance Council of Florida, Dixie Round Dane Council, URDC, AIDTA and currently serve as Board members of ROUNDALAB and chair the Phase 5 Standardization committee. They are staff members of many festivals, including the Florida Sunshine Festival, Copecrest, WASCAs, and Round-A-Rama Institute in Bloomington, Indiana with the Easterdays and Gosses. They just recently returned from a six day engagement in Alaska at the 8th Annual State Caller's Appreciation Festival in Anchorage and Wheel of Fortune Round Dance Festival in Los Vegas.

Choreography is going through my head all of the time, said Barbara. "I love it." Their latest dance is **More**. Other dances are: **Rainbow Foxtrot, Fence Building, You're the Top, Bill Bailey Charleston, What Is This Thing Called Love, Cover Girl, Unchained Melody, Lullabye of Broadway.** "Lovelace said if it doesn't have a diamond turn, it's not a Blackford dance," said Barbara. "So, now we always put one in."

For fun and relaxation, Wayne plays golf and Barbara likes to read. This is her 8th year to sponsor and direct Sacred Heart Catholic Junior High School cheer leaders.

"We believe in always striving to be the best we can and therefore continue to study and learn," said Barbara. "We say thanks to four very special people for giving us the encouragement, support, friendship and love which enables us to share our love of Round Dancing with so many."

## PETITION CAMPAIGN - H.R. 2067

**WRITE A LETTER TO CONGRESS**

TO: All members of the square dance community, related cultural dance forms, relatives and friends.

Ask your Congressman to be a Cosponsor of H.R. 2067 the Bill to have the Square Dance permanently designated the American Folk Dance of the United States of America. The Square Dance is truly the American Folk Dance which is Called, Cued or Prompted to the Dancers and includes: Squares, Rounds, Clogging, Contra, Line and Heritage Dances.

Generally, Members of Congress will respond only to the residents of their Congressional Districts. They do want to learn how constituents feel about Public policy issues. They will usually respond well to carefully written and concerned letters. Keep your letter reasonably brief and limit your subject matter to the single issue. State the topic clearly in the first paragraph so that your letter can be assigned to the appropriate Legislative Aide.

Make sure you refer to the title of the Bill and the number assigned. Explain why you are seeking their Cosponsorship and make the letter your own and not a "form letter". Give a good reason and be positive in your approach.

Mention your particular activity, Club name and number of Dancers. Relate your involvement and that of your Club members in local Community activities and County Festivals if any. Be courteous, do not threaten or beg a Member of Congress. Always appeal to the Law maker on the merits of your issue.

Let's get more than the required 218 Cosponsors before September 17, 1987, the 200th Anniversary of our Constitution. When your Congressman agrees to Cosponsor, please notify the National Folk Dance Committee at the above address.

For us and everyone!



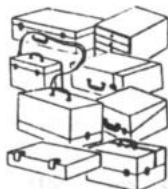
