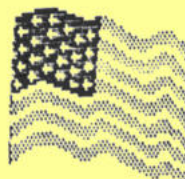
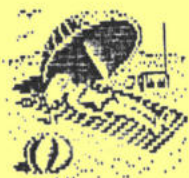

Pres. Wolfert introduced representatives from two new clubs, The Rollaways and The Starlighters.

FALL ROUNDUP '88: Flyers available. Need to start raising funds to cover deposit cost for '89 Roundup at Civic Auditorium. Estimate cost for basics at \$900. Advertisements for Ad Book: Boosters, \$5.00; Patrons, \$10-\$20; Full Page, \$30. Fall Roundup Committee to begin visiting clubs to promote event and sell tickets. Donations and ad deadline is September 30th.

FLORIDA FEDERATION: No report.

USDA INSURANCE: Our new representative is Mr. Harvey Shriver. Seventeen clubs are participating with 744 members. Duval County Schools require this insurance. Dancers only covered at the dance. Special coverage needed for coverage to and from dances.

BLOOD BANK: Kim Keefer reported that last Blood Bank dance was their largest. Sends a big "Thank You" to all Callers who donated their time. Only 15 donors this year. In order to be recognized at the Annual Appreciation Banquet, we need 40 units. The name has been changed to Florida-Georgia Blood Line.

STATE CONVENTION: Four thousand orange with gold ribbons have arrived. Registration blanks also available. Particulars were reviewed. Florida Caller's Assoc, Florida Federation, Round Dance Council and our association are presenting the State Convention and each will receive one fourth of proceeds. Kick-off Dress Rehearsal is May 15th. Have room for 9 more people to participate.


GRAPEVINE: May 10th deadline this month. Trying to subsidize Grapevine income by taking in printing. Will be happy to provide estimates. Need complete club roster from all clubs in order to print Fall Roundup Square Dancer's Directory.

OLD BUSINESS: Callerlab - motion to give \$50.00 to Callerlab for promotion of square dancing. Motion carried.

NEW BUSINESS: Dues - motion made to accept raise in dues for next year to \$15.00. Motion carried. Club dues are payable in July. Request complete roster of each club.

DELEGATES: Only delegates registered with NEFSARDA are eligible to vote. Suggestion that club officers serve as alternate if delegate can not attend. By-laws to be amended to reflect this change. Request that clubs have delegates serve from December to January in order to eliminate extra paper work. Grapevine to carry list of club delegates attending NEFSARDA meetings. Delegates missing two meetings lose voting privilege until reinstated.

GATEWAY CALLER'S ASSOCIATION: Adopted Plus Program Guidelines. Beginning September 1988, plus candidates must have one year Mainstream dancing. Encourage Mainstream graduates to participate in Angel Program. Motion for NEFSARDA to support the callers in their resolution was made and carried.

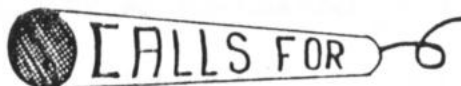

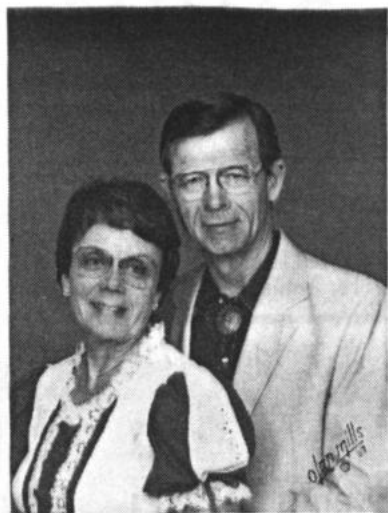

### Here Tis - Square Dancing 100 Years Ago

Here is a list of rules for Square Dancing 100 plus years ago:

1. Admittance 50 cents, refreshments included.
2. The music is to consist of a fiddle, a pip or tabor, a hurdy gurdy. No chorus is to be sung until after dancing is over.
3. No lady to dance in black stockings — nor must she have her elbows bare.
4. Every lady to come with a clean handkerchief with her name marked.
5. To prevent spitting, no gentleman to chew tobacco or smoke.
6. No gentleman to dance in a great coat unless his under one torn.
7. No lady to dress her hair in tallow candle, nor must she have a bunch of hair sticking up, top of her head.
8. Leather small clothes except newly washed are forbidden, as they might soil the ladies gowns — and to prevent the tearing of the planking, no gentleman to dance in nailed shoes or boots.
9. No whispering to be allowed — if anyone shall be found making insidious remarks about anyone's dancing, he or she shall be put out of the room.

10. No scissors or gimlets are to be brought either by ladies or gentlemen unless their pockets are whole.
11. No gentleman to appear with a cravat that has been worn more than a week or a fortnight.
12. Long beards are forbidden, as they would be very disagreeable, if a gentleman should happen to put his cheek beside a lady's.
13. Those ladies who have not white stocking and black morrocco shoes will not be admitted under any pretense whatever. Two old ladies will be provided to examine all who enter.
14. No lady must appear with a veil on even if it be turned aside. If the gentlemen will not have an opportunity of looking at their faces distinct.
15. No gentleman must squeeze his partner's hand, not look earnestly upon her; and furthermore he must not pick up her handkerchief, provided it were to fall. The first denotes he loves her, the second he wishes to kiss her, and the last that she make a sigh for both.
16. For distinction sake, the master of ceremonies is to wear a red coat, buff small clothes, black stockings, green shoes and a furtout. The work of command is, tumble up ladies.

### GATEWAY CALLER'S ASSOCIATION PROPOSAL

Starting September 1988, no caller will teach recently graduated Mainstream students in the Plus Program. Anyone wishing to enter a plus class must meet one or more of the following qualifications:

1. Have not less than one full year of mainstream dancing from date of graduation.
2. Earn an "angel" certificate available from Gateway Caller's Association by angeling a class and not missing more than five times during the entire class year.

In effect, this will slow down the accelerated jump from mainstream to plus and it will also make plus classes easier on the caller by having more experienced mainstream dancers. Also, reduce any dropouts caused by trying to do so much too soon.

## CALLER'S CORNER: THE GREATEST GROUP OF PEOPLE EVER!!



Little did I know back in November 1983 when I finally broke down and went with a friend to "watch" a square dance, that one day nearly 5 years later, I'd be attempting to write an article for a square dance magazine.

Yes, I was one of those men who thought square dancing was for those "other men". However, John Wilder (everybody knows him) convinced me that it was not only fun and that real men did it -- but, that there were many single ladies in the activity, (I was not married at the time). Lorraine? (My wife) I met at a square dance! As I look in retrospect a very important factor was that there would be no drinking, and that I would meet THE GREATEST GROUP OF PEOPLE EVER!

John was right on all counts, of course, and I got the bug!

I had just learned mainstream (well almost) when I had a heart attack and a stroke - guess who was there with prayers, visits, cards, letters and helped with all my needs? That's right! Square Dancers!! The same when I got out of the hospital. They have to be the greatest group of people ever.

A short time later I got the bug again, this time to be a caller. What a fantastic world I entered.

Eddie Millan was my caller/teacher through mainstream and plus. Now with family, a store to run plus calling engagements (three clubs at the time) he found time to help me get my toe in the door. Thanks Eddie, you made it all look so simple and easy. Little did I know what a Pandora's Box I was opening. But, I was hooked.

One man said that knowledge was like an island with a shoreline of ignorance -- the more you learn about something, the more you are aware of what you don't know. This is so true of calling,, the more you learn the more possibilities you can see, its unbelievably exciting!

Since I was a small boy I've had many heros - my Dad; Mom; the locomotive engineer; George Washington, Abe Lincoln, General Patton - as I began square dance calling training another group of heros emerged; Eddie Millan, R.J. Hogan; Jack Lasry; Al Brandage; Dick Barker; Bob Belanger, (who gave several of us new callers a whole summer of instruction); Ernie Rollen, who kept saying "don't give up". Then there's Art Wilson, dear friend, mentor, and a giant in my world of square dancing. The greatest group of people ever!

How do we become callers? One of the most important ingredients - great people in great clubs that put up with our mistakes. Two that have helped me more than I can say - The Sweetheart Squares and The Palm Valley Twirlers. Also a place among friends -- the Gateway Callers Association and Rural Callers Association in Gainesville -- too many to mention.

Last year I was hospitalized again, and again the square dance community was there to help me and my family through the crisis. Thanks!



Here it is 1988, I'm teaching a class of nearly 3 squares. I've come a long way with the help of many wonderful people; no, I'm not really a square dance caller compared to my heroes, but, somehow I feel I am returning in a small way a small part of the investment of THE GREATEST GROUP OF PEOPLE EVER!!

Our donations stand at 15 units this year.

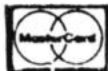

## HAWAII

A L O H A !

What a great trip. The excitement was high as the 22 travelers began arriving at the Jax Airport. Finally, we were off! At Chicago we transferred to a jumbo jet (747) for a direct flight to Hawaii.

We landed seven hours later after two meals, a movie and lots of laughs. Our tour guide (who would be traveling with us throughout) met us and we all received the traditional Hawaiian greeting (flowers).

We would be traveling from Honolulu to Kauai aboard Aloha Airlines. Our guide informed us that there would be a delay because of a problem at Maui. We found out later that a flight into Maui had the top of the airplane blown off. The next morning everyone found themselves trying to call family members to let them know we were alright.

Our helicopter trip around the island was the highlight of the trip. We saw places no one ever gets to visit. Ask Joann Back about this helicopter trip! We had two travelers who had never flown, Luniel Green (non-square dancer) and Freda Smith. So all the air travel just made their trip more exciting.

There seemed to be flowers and fruit trees growing everywhere. Every color and shape. I think this was the most obvious fact, the lush vegetation of the islands. Even though on Hawaii (THE BIG ISLAND) there were deserts of volcano fields where nothing grew and on other parts of the island was a jungle. They obtain 80% of their electricity from water.

Many of us got our chance to "hula". Leo Back, in addition to the hula, had to show his skills with twirling two balls on the end of string. The local Hawaiians provided the traditional costumes and dance on every island we visited.

So many tours. Our 22 people just went every which way. And the food was excellent, especially the fruit.

We watched as the pig was prepared for our Luau. The heated rocks were placed inside the pig. Palm leaves and banana stalks were put over the hot rock, then the pig. On top of the pig was palm leaves and cloth soaked in water. Then came the dirt - so thick that no steam came out. The pork was excellent, but, the island staple, Poi, was like glue (without salt).

We met some great folks. Caller Jim & Mammi Dunn from Lawton, OK and Tom & Ella Manning from Iowa. Skip Smith from Titusville was there along with Dick Leger from Rhode Island.

The Aloha State Convention was small but, was great fun. The five mainland callers called Friday night and all events on Saturday. The evening dances were four hours long.

In WAIKIKI, where the convention was held, is also Pearl Harbor. While going through this monument one can only feel moved. As you read the historical events of Dec 7, 1941 you think of why people can't love one another and fight sickness and poverty throughout the world. There were 17 sets of brothers who died on the USS Arizona. I saw several people with tears in their eyes and could only imagine why.

At the Memorial is a list of names of those Americans who are buried on that ship and you seem to always look for your last name. Nita's maiden name is Fox and she found one and I found B. Walker - I wonder where he was from?

Our trip continued with more food, tours and fun. Finally everything comes to an end and we boarded our jumbo jet for the mainland. We saw Los Angeles at 37,000 feet at night - what a sight. We left Hawaii in daylight and landed in Denver in daylight and then on to Jacksonville, tired but extremely pleased over our trip.

## LISTENING, OBSERVING AND HUGGING:

LEGACY, through its Log and Mini-LEGACIES, has been communicating with the square dance world for the last fifteen years. Although much has been said and written about communication, lack of it has often been deemed the cause for the demise of many organizations and clubs. For most of us, the word *communication* conjures up a vision of the spoken or written word.

Listening is another form of communication. It is listening to what others are trying to communicate to you. Listen to what spectators at an square dance exhibition are saying, "They don't look happy," or "That is for 'old' people." If you hear this, it is telling you that something should be done to change the image we are putting forth.

Observation. How often have you, when attending another club's function, observed what is going on around you? Can you

observe friction among the members or are they just one big happy family? Are you greeted with a smile or do you just have the sign-up sheet shoved at you? Take your observations back to your club as a way of improving its image.

Body language is another form of communication. All of us have attended square dance functions and seen people hugging each other as they renew friendships. Hugging tells people that you like them and are glad they are your friends and members of your square dance family.

LEGACY members hope that everyone will concentrate on listening, observing and hugging so that we may impart an entirely new image to the general public and to members of our activity.

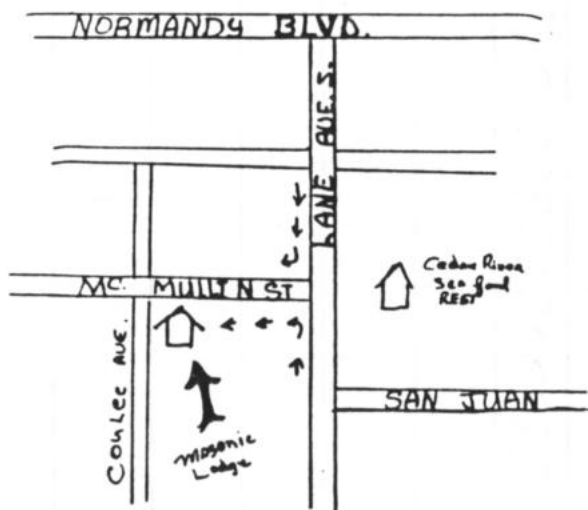

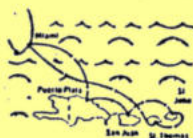
