MINUTES OF NEFSARDA MEETING, May 7, 1989

Roll call was taken, 11 clubs present, a quorum was not established.

MINUTES: Minutes of March meeting were distributed to delegates and approved as corrected.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Treasurer, Mary Downing, reported as follows: Opening Balance \$447.46: Credits \$507.30: Expenses \$449.38. Balance \$505.38 as of May 7, 1989.

FIFTH SATURDAY DANCE: Ray Reedy, Chairman, reported that attendance at the dance was a disappointment. Credits totaled \$223.00; Expenses \$191.94; leaving a net balance of \$31.06 for NEFSARDA. ** The next 5th Saturday Dances will be held on July 29, 1989 and September 30, 1989. Ray is working on these two dates.

FALL ROUNDUP 89: Chairman, Mary Downing, announced the following committee chairmen: Advertising- Hollis & Mary Fowler

Decorations - Shad & Clarice Shadwell

Housing - Virgil & Elsie Green

Publicity - Ray & Eleanor Reedy

Tickets - Marshall & Marcy Catlin

A Advertising: Hollis reported that ads for the Program Books will cost:

\$50.00 for a full page ad; \$25.00 half-page; \$15.00 one-third page; and

\$12.50 one-fourth page. The outside cover will be \$100.00 and the inside front and back cover will be \$75.00.

B Tickets: Marshall reported he has made contact with several people outside of the Duval County area who will help with ticket sales. He will need to have a key person in each club to sell ribbons.

Two months prior to Fall Roundup the committee will be visiting area clubs to steal banners for display at the Roundup and also to sell ribbons. Anyone who wishes to volunteer to steal banners should call Marshall or Marcy Catlin.

Following discussion, it was agreed by general consent that if 1 or 2 clubs visit a club to promote the Fall Roundup they will be given the club's banner. A club wishing to display their larger club banner may exchange their traveling banner at the site of the Fall Roundup.

C Publicity: Mary announced that the fliers are being printed. They will be ready by the July meeting and will be available at the State Convention.

Publicity Chairman: Ray Reedy, reported he will place ads in various area publications promoting the Fall Roundup. Two of the publications have agreed to swap ads with NEFSARDA. The ads will run for 6 months, June through Nov. He will distribute the flyers statewide and at all the S/D Resorts and at various Festivals.

GATEWAY CALLERS: Lawton Smith announced that ABC News will have a segment on Square Dancing at 6:30pm on Sunday, May 7, 1989.

STATE CONVENTION 89: Irma Fry reported that over 1600 tickets have been sold. A couple of changes have been made in the program. All events scheduled in Bob Carr Auditorium for Saturday have been moved to Sunday at the same time. The Contra dancers declined to attend. Decorations are being made by the Yellow Rockers, Silver Foxes, Flagler Ocean Waves and Palm Valley Twirlers. The After Party will be held at the Omni Hotel on Saturday night and will be for all of NEFSARDA. Bobby Keefe will be chairman of the After Party.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS: The president announced that a few of the Dancer Directories are still available and sell for \$1.50 per book.

NEW BUSINESS: The president appointed the following to the By-Laws Review Committee. Harvey Shriver, Millard Brown, Ray Reedy, Fred Brinson and Lou Connally. Millard Brown will serve as Chairman.

Seminar: Glen Cowart presented a suggestion for a seminar which would benefit S/D throughout Northeast Florida. This seminar would provide information to enable club officers to become more effective leaders and stimulate interest in S/D. The seminar would provide information on how to conduct classes more professionally. A straw vote was taken, the majority of the delegates were in favor of a seminar. ** The delegates were requested to poll their clubs and notify the president if they would like to participate in this seminar. Glen volunteered to contact the clubs not in attendance to see if they would be interested in the seminar. There would be no cost to NEFSARDA. Anyone who has an interest in S/D may attend. Additional information will be available at the July meeting.

ADJOURNMENT: Meeting adjourned at 2:55pm.

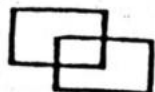
If you work in an air conditioned environment PLEASE consider calling to schedule a blood drive in either July or August. Blood usage never seems to take a vacation, even in the summer!

MAY 26, 27, 28, 1989

These questions have been heard a lot right here in Jacksonville. Here are soon good answers for you to ponder with.

BULLETIN: *There seems to be some confusion regarding the designation of dance programs throughout the square dance world, what are your thoughts on the subject?*

DRIVER: I think they have been grossly misused. The worst thing that happened was the program lists being used to determine dance levels at square dance clubs. They were not intended for that purpose. They were supposed to be teaching aids and teaching orders for callers. The lists came out and suddenly clubs were identifying themselves by level - and that is where I think we got into trouble.

BULLETIN: *Do you think that the activity is in serious trouble?*

DRIVER: It is in very serious trouble. It has become too much of a science rather than fun dancing. We have allowed the tail to wag the dog, so to speak. The advanced challenge callers have dictated how and what should be taught to beginner dancers. Thus, the lists have grown larger and larger. The time it takes a new dancer to reach even the Mainstream level is forty weeks. In many areas of the country, a dancer finds it difficult to dance at the Mainstream level. We have become too involved with various positions, too many figures, and doing it all to perfection.

BULLETIN: *What is the remedy to these problems?*

DRIVER: There is not just one answer to that question. Many have said it before, and I join in and say that we have to get away from this idea that complicated

choreography is what everybody wants. We have to shorten the time spent in lessons and realize that the average person does not want to spend close to a year learning how to square dance. We have to recognize the fact the dancer who dances just once a week, or even less frequently, must be allowed to have a place to dance and come out a winner being able to complete the calls without breaking down most of the time.

BULLETIN: *What about APD and DBD dancing?*

DRIVER: For one thing I believe many people do not realize that those two terms actually do not mean the same thing. They are two different kinds of dancing. APD means all position dancing, meaning dancing the figures from the several possible positions from which the call can be completed. For instance, Follow Your Neighbor can be called with boys, or girls working in the center as well as mixed combinations of boys or girls. DBD means Dance By Definition and that is dancing the calls exactly by the written definition. So, as far as I am concerned, DBD dancing is great. That is what standardization was for; so that the figures are taught and danced the same, everywhere. As far as APD goes, I don't think that it's essential. It puts too much pressure on the average-once-a-week-dancer. He or she doesn't have the time or desire to put in the necessary time to learn it. By continuing to allow that pressure to be put on the average dancer, we are running that kind of dancer away from the activity faster than we can bring in new people.

BULLETIN: *What do you think a dancer should derive from square dancing?*

DRIVER: It doesn't really matter if it's a dance, or a club meeting, or a council meeting. I believe a dancer should leave that square dance experience with a sense of goodness and enjoyment. At meetings sometimes there are differences of opinion that might be stated rather loudly and in disagreement with others. But when you walk out the door, that is the feeling I think you should have.

BULLETIN: *You have been involved in square dancing for quite some time, do you think that the feeling of fun and goodness is the rule now as much as in the past?*

DRIVER: I'm sorry to say that in my opinion, a good feeling is becoming an exception rather than the rule too much of the time. I know a lot of people have said this before, but I believe that we are pushing dancers out of the activity because it takes too long to learn enough figures to join a club. Then we have the level system that is used in many cases as a caste system. That results in so called upper level dancers looking down their noses at people dancing a level below them.

BULLETIN: *How did this situation come to be?*

DRIVER: I don't think you can point a finger at any one thing. However, callers are to blame as much as anybody.

BULLETIN: *Do you think that Callerlab has helped to make things better?*

DRIVER: Callerlab has helped to some degree, however, I think that they have made some serious mistakes that sooner or later will have to be remedied. The standardizing of the calls has certainly been beneficial. But other than that, I really do not see much more that Callerlab has accomplished.

BULLETIN: *What about the mistakes you mentioned?*

DRIVER: Don't get me wrong; no organization of human beings can be perfect and that includes Callerlab. But **one thing that bothers me** is that Callerlab doesn't really stand behind their decisions and they take too long to make those decisions. As an example, it took them ten years to come out and make a decision on hands up or down dancing. Then when the decision was made many of the members did not stand behind that decision. I feel that if a caller is going to be a member of Callerlab, he should go along with the vote of the majority. If that individual strongly disagrees then campaign within the system to get votes to make a change.

BULLETIN: *Is there a formula that you use at a dance that is in keeping with your ideas?*

DRIVER: The caller has to watch out that he is not over influenced or intimidated by that smaller majority of dancers who constantly push for complicated APD dancing; the kind of dancing that the larger majority of dancers will break down trying to do. Dick Jones, who was a well-known caller some years back, was a mentor of mine.

He told me that if a caller uses the 80%/80% rule, he is calling a good dance. What that means is....if the dancers on the floor are dancing 80% of what is being called 80% of the time, it is going to be a successful dance with folks leaving at the end of the dance, with a smile on their face, saying they had a **good time**. Dick also said that every so often, the caller should bring up the intensity a little to satisfy the "hot shots", but as soon as breaking down becomes evident, to back off and get everybody moving again.

BULLETIN: *You said earlier that there is no one answer to the problems we*

face, in your view, how might we begin to rectify some of the obvious problems?

DRIVER: We have to get more people in at the Basic level. We have to teach the new dancer a shorter list of figures and get him/her into the club and out on the floor dancing quickly. After we get them there, we have to stop running them away because of the constant pressure for complicated dancing.

As far as the veteran dancer goes, we, callers and dancer leaders, have to start listening to the silent majority and respond to their needs. Those people who are the "silent majority", should stop being silent and just walking away; they should speak up and let their feelings be heard.

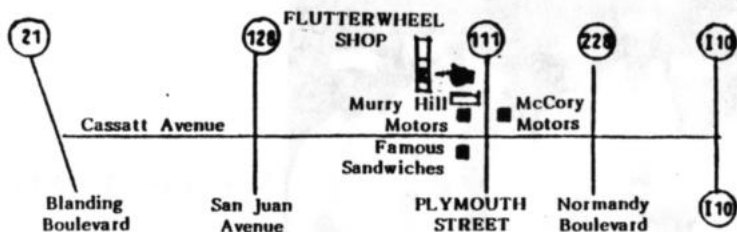

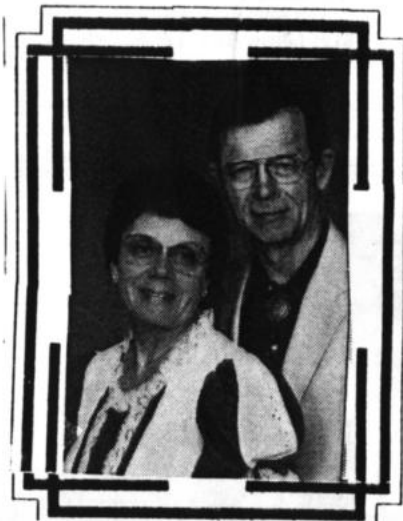

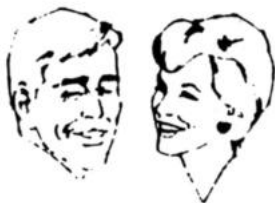

A Real Gift From the 38th National!

Perhaps the most unique gift to the square dancing world will be presented at the 38th National Square Dance Convention in Oklahoma City on its inaugural day, June 22, 1989. The world's only public statue of square dancers will be unveiled in downtown Oklahoma City - a permanent tribute to America's most popular folk dance.

The bronze, life-like sculpture, sponsored by the Oklahoma City Chamber of Commerce and the Oklahoma Square Dancers, is to be dedicated to square dancers everywhere.

Rich Muno, the sculptor, is a veteran in his work, having been involved with sculpturing since the age of nine. He is currently focusing his artistic talents in both bronze and wood.

In 1985, after 20 years of service, Muno resigned as Managing Director of the National Cowboy Hall of Fame in Oklahoma City to devote full time to his sculpturing. Previous works include a life-size statue of a rancher on horseback for the city of

Pampa, Texas; a nine-foot bronze of Zebulon Pike for Colorado Springs; and a seven-foot "Globe Sundial" in Oklahoma City's downtown Kerr Park. Other commissions were completed for Winchester and Colt Firearms Companies, and for Marlboro.

Models for the square dancers statue are Pete and Ester Hughes, the General Chairmen of the 27th National Square Dance Convention in Oklahoma City.

The dress used in modeling for the statue was Oklahoma Green polyester fabric with eight round hand-painted mistletoe medallions on the skirt, done in Oklahoma White polyester fabric. The vest was Oklahoma Green polyester fabric with one large hand-painted green mistletoe medallion on the back.

FIVE WAYS TO GET THOSE WALLFLOWERS INVOLVED

Some people hold back in their associations..and are held back, too... because they don't consider themselves "good mixers". Shy about their good points, over-sensitive about those they consider poor, they forego the satisfaction and advantages which flow from becoming involved. Sad to say, they aren't the only losers. Their knowledge and experience could help the group as a whole, and so (if they would ask), would be their discerning questions.

How can we get these silent spectators into the act? Here are some things everyone can do:

1. Devote part of your time at dances to getting acquainted. Don't spend it all with good friends and old cronies.
2. Look for a "new face" when you enter the room or search for a seat. Don't hesitate. Walk right up, put your hand out and say "I'm so-and-so, I'm glad to meet you." Chances are that they'll be glad, too.
3. Follow through. Don't go away before introducing them to another member. If none "float" by, think up some reason for taking your new acquaintance where the action is. I've got to speak to the treasurer, do you know them?" As an example, "Come along."
4. Chat for awhile. Tell them some of your problems, so they'll open up and tell you theirs. Make a note of their solutions and constructive ideas.
5. Be friendly. This doesn't have to be a hail-fellow-well-met performance. Most people equate friendliness with sincerity. When you ask even the obvious questions about business, home and family, how you ask and how you listen will be observed. Somebody worked hard to recruit these individuals as members. A bit of effort on your part may help to keep them.

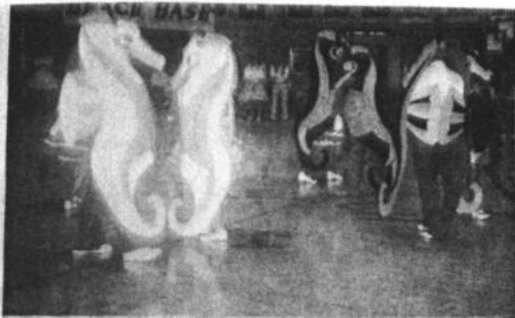
Square dance attire seldom reflects the current styles and "fads" and, luckily, remains suitable and in style season after season. Sometimes it's fun to adapt a fashion trend to our special wardrobe however, and one such item is currently seen in a variety of street wear: the slashed sweatshirt - blouse - scarf which is then threaded with colorful beads. The scarf in particular is a very up-to-date and colorful accent for a blouse and skirt outfit. Thanks to Janice Jones for this idea and details.

Directions are quite simple. Select a pretty fabric and cut a 22" square. Fold diagonally and cut as indicated in the diagram.

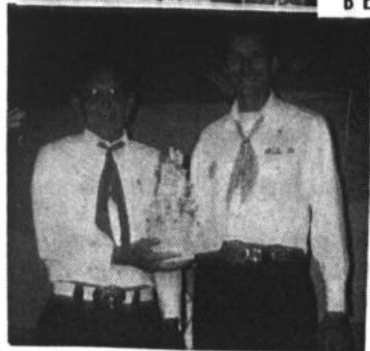


Beads to coordinate with your fabric are now threaded on each of these "strips" of fabric, 3 to 5 beads each, and then a knot is tied in the end. With 48 "strips" and 4 beads on each, it will take 192 beads. These small craft beads are found at Frank's and other craft stores at a nominal cost.

With very little time, effort, or expense, this scarf becomes a classy addition to your square dance wardrobe.

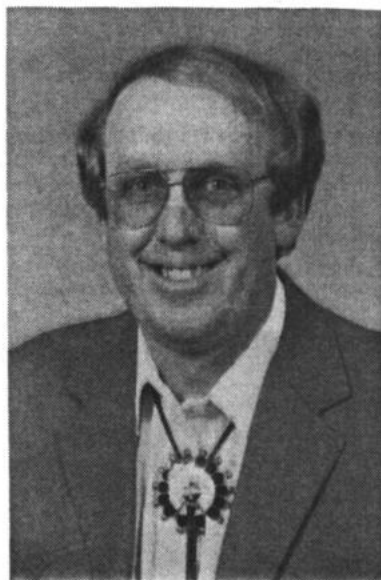

This year ROUNDALAB will also be preparing a teaching progression guideline in the form of a list broken out into the ROUNDALAB Phases by rhythms and updating the ROUNDALAB Reference Manual. The new Video tapes will be previewed at this meeting.

Various committees meet daily from 9 to 5 while evening hours are devoted to educational programs. Although the Convention officially closes Tuesday, an all day Teachers Seminar/Clinic is conducted on Wednesday which most attend.

Following these busy four days, most of the ROUNDALAB members stay for the remainder of the week to volunteer their services and participate in the National Square Dance Convention.

Teaching Units who attend ROUNDALAB and remain for the NSDC are a dedicated group of professional leaders. They are not only giving up at least a week of vacation and/or family time, but are also spending their own money - well over \$1,500. No one ever receives any remuneration for this week. And few ever have any time to even go sight-seeing.

Their reward is in the fun and fellowship of the activity, honing their own skills and expertise, expanding their knowledge and knowing that they are contributing to the forward progress of the round dance movement. If your leaders are among those present in OKC, please tell them "THANK YOU", and that you do appreciate their dedication.

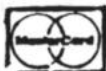
