A leader is a person who accepts and exercises responsibilities which direct or influence the activities of others. Many traits are discernible in a good leader, but the essential ones are dedication, enthusiasm, ability to communicate and a genuine respect for the opinions of others. To be most effective, a leader needs to recognize the talents of others and delegate tasks accordingly, and must have the courage to make decisions that may be unpopular.

In order to lead, one must lead toward something. Without a goal or objective, leadership is vacillating and ineffective. Examples of goals for a square dance club are to increase membership, increase the number of visitors, improve the style of dancing, determine the level at which the club is to dance, plan non-dancing social activities, sponsor a demonstration group, increase club involvement in state and national dance activities, etc. Remember that a plan of action to reach identified goals and objectives will make their attainment much easier.

A leader deals with three groups of people, each of which requires different tactics in order to make full use of their talents, knowledge, and abilities. The first is the group which actively supports the leader or the leader's objectives, the second is the group which actively opposes, and the third is the group in the center which waits to see which of the others becomes dominant and joins in with the majority. These groups are not static, individuals may shift from one group to the other, depending on the issue or the leadership involved. The leader's goal is to expand the supportive group so that the noncommitted will fall in line. Bear in mind, however, that the opposition viewpoints must be heard and carefully considered. Ideas from this group may change goals, plans or objectives in ways which will be most beneficial to the organization.

Leadership is a comprehensive subject which could be discussed in a week-long seminar and still leave many of its facets unexplored.

The "Steamboat Cafeteria" in the West Lobby of the Cook Convention Center will be open from 7:30 a.m. until 11:30 p.m. on Thursday, Friday and Saturday during the 39th National. There will be two different breakfast buffets priced at \$3.95 and \$4.95 and three different buffets for both lunch and dinner where prices will vary from \$3.95, \$4.95 or \$5.95. There will even be two late night snack buffets for \$2.95 and \$3.95. The menus will vary each day and feature, sandwiches, salads and meat and vegetable meals. The Public Eye Caterer is prepared to open up to 11 serving lines as they are needed.

BID SESSION TO DETERMINE 1994 CONVENTION LOCATION

Deciding on the location for the 1994 National Square Dance Convention will happen at the 39th National in Memphis, TN. This decision is made by the National Executive Committee (NEC) and is a very thorough and comprehensive process.

This exciting presentation can be observed by all attendees of the 39th National at 9 a.m., Friday, June 29, in the beautiful and comfortable Dixon Myers Hall of Ellis Auditorium in the Memphis Convention Center Complex. Each bidding city will be allowed approximately 30 minutes to make a public presentation before members of the NEC and interested and supporting dancers with questions about their facilities following.

The winning city is announced to the dancers at the convention on Saturday night after the Parade of States.

1990 IS THE YEAR OF THE CENSUS

Since 1990 is the year of the U.S. Population Census, it seems appropriate for us to follow suit and attempt the first census of the square dancer population.

The S/D Census Committee of Walt Cole, Gordon Goss and Jack Murtha, have completed the format and plans and will be mailing out the questionnaire soon.

Each state and province within the U.S. and Canada will be sampled. The census is based on a variable sample size ranging from 10% for those states/provinces with more than 100 clubs to 100% of those states/provinces with less than 15 clubs. This should give an estimate of the total number of square dancers within each state/province as well as an estimate of the total number of dancers in the entirety. Sampling errors will be slightly larger by state/province but should approximate 10% (or less) for the entire population of dancers in the U.S. and Canada.

There are 6210 clubs in the U.S. sampling frame from which we will draw 617 samples; 490 clubs in the Canada sampling frame from which we will draw 57 samples; a total of 6700 clubs and 674 samples.

Square dancers have a reputation for doing things well. Let's follow through with a high return on this LEGACY census. If you receive a questionnaire, fill it out and return it promptly. Urge others to do the same.

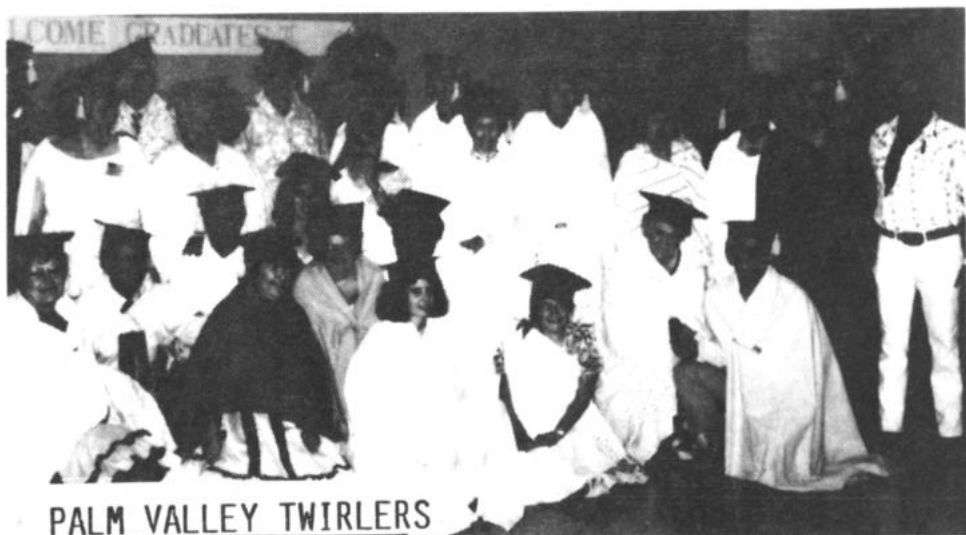

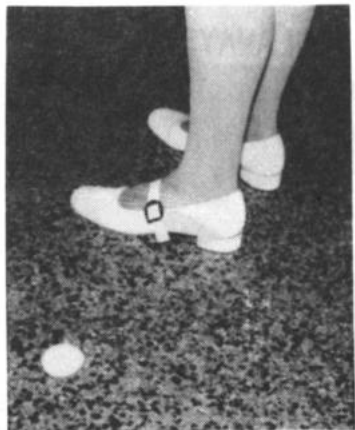

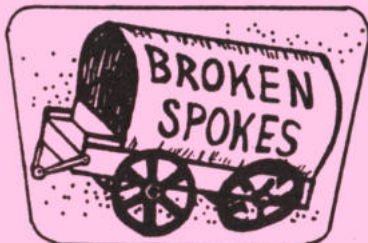
