5th SATURDAY DANCE Chairman, Chuck & Aleen Breedlove announced the next dance will be on June 29 at Forrest High School. All delegates were asked to bring refreshments. Flyers were provided.

FALL FESTIVAL CHAIRMAN Don & Bonnie Bell reported that the search for a dance location is still pending.

BY-LAWS: George Wolfert requested two persons be assigned to assist him in reviewing the NE By-Laws. President Hollis will find those volunteers.

SHOW CASE: Mary Fowler reported that the NE Show Case will have a Fall Season theme. The design is finished and Mary requested delegates provide pictures and clubs provide dangles.

GATEWAY CALLERS ASSOCIATION : President Jerry Reed reported that GCA had approved up to \$500 to support the fall recruitment effort for new classes. It was requested that a joint committee be established to develop ideas for promoting lessons.

FLORIDA FEDERATION: President Dave & Shirley Nihart announced a special fund raising dance for Leo Richardson in Orlando on June 16 (2:30-5:00PM).

NATIONAL CONVENTION: Don Bell announced that the State Federation will be announcing their intention in Salt Lake City to bid for the 1997 National Convention to be held in Orlando. Tickets to raffle off a 1992 Ford Auto will be sold to raise funds for the bid process.

VISITATION: President Hollis Fowler explained how he and Mary have visited numerous clubs on behalf of the NE and they have appreciated the warm welcome received from the dancers.

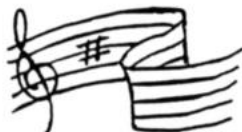

WELCOME NEW DANCER

You are now a part of a great activity, rich in heritage and dedicated to the enjoyment of its participants. This brochure contains information which will help you to get the most from square dancing.

Please read this brochure carefully and then enjoy the fun and fellowship that square dancing offers you.

HERITAGE

Square dancing is the American folk dance. It was born in the days when our country was young, carried westward by our pioneer forefathers and is a treasured heritage of our American culture.

In the 1930's, Lloyd "Pappy" Shaw introduced western square dancing to thousands of Americans with exhibitions by his students from the Cheyenne Mountain School in Colorado. Since then, square dancing has become a favorite leisure time activity for millions of dancers around the world. It has kept pace with many of the styles, types of music, and technological advances of our society while remaining wholesome, family fun.

ETIQUETTE

Square dancers pride themselves on being friendly and courteous on and off the dance floor to both dancers and non-dancers alike. It is good square dance manners to join the nearest square needing a couple. Introduce yourself (A stranger is just a friend whom you haven't yet met). Listen to the caller. After a tip, applaud the caller and thank your fellow dancers. And most important, "Have Fun and Smile".

WHY DO WE . . .

NOT DRINK ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES AT DANCES?
Alcohol inhibits our ability to listen and perform. Alcohol reduces our reaction time making us a poorer dancer. In addition, square dancing is a wholesome, family-oriented activity.

BELONG TO A CLUB?

Clubs are needed to organize dances and establish a means to enjoy the fellowship of square dancing. To survive they need an active membership where everyone helps. Volunteer, don't wait to be asked.

STAY NON-COMPETITIVE?

In square dancing we want everyone to have fun so without winners and losers this can be accomplished.

OVERLOOK MISTAKES BY OTHERS?

We all make mistakes ourselves. Everyone is trying. Encourage them.

WEAR NAME BADGES?

Badges enable us to be on a first name basis which furthers friendly fellowship.

WELCOME NEW DANCERS?

New dancers are the lifeblood of our activity. Only with their enthusiasm and ideas can square dancing continue to flourish.

APPAREL

Our colorful apparel identifies us as square dancers. Proper attire at dances is very important! Men should wear long sleeve western-style shirts and neckwear. Women should wear a dress or a skirt and blouse with a petticoat. Footwear should be comfortable and of a type which will not damage the dance floor. Look Special. Feel Special. Be Special.

VISITING OTHER CLUBS

One of the most enjoyable parts of square dancing is visiting clubs, meeting other dancers and hearing new callers. Before visiting another club, it is suggested that you call or write first as dancing schedules and locations are subject to change. Information on clubs may be found in most area and state publications or the *National Square Dance Directory*.

ORGANIZATIONS

Most dancers and clubs belong to area or state square dance organizations. Many dancers also belong to special interest national and international organizations such as National Square Dance Campers, Lloyd Shaw Foundation, Overseas Dancers Association, etc. Ask your caller or club president about your area organization.

PUBLICATIONS

There are over 200 area, state, regional, national and international newsletters, magazines and directories available to dancers. In addition, hundreds of specialized instructional and informative publications have been printed. Information on publications and organizations may be found in the *National Square Dance Directory*. The publication with the largest distribution is *American Square Dance Magazine*, which is published monthly.

FESTIVALS & CONVENTIONS

Many clubs and most area and state organizations sponsor one or more festivals or conventions each year. These special events are usually two or three days and may feature one or more callers. Conventions usually feature more callers, different programs of dancing, seminars, workshops and clinics on various areas of interest. The National Square Dance Convention is a three-day event which includes the 4th Saturday in June and usually attracts 20,000 to 40,000 dancers.

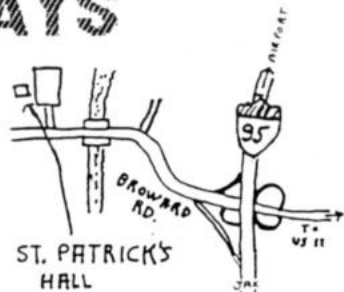

NEFSDA BANNER STEALING GUIDELINES

REQUIREMENTS:

1. A banner may be stolen by a minimum of 1 full square, in good standing as a club member, displaying club badges of the club they are representing and pay admission.
2. The banner can be stolen only on a regular club dancing night.
3. If 2 clubs appear on the same night to steal a banner from the same club the 1st visiting club to announce their intention to steal a banner to the host club President or the highest ranking officer present, will be allowed to steal the banner.
4. The banner may be retrieved by the owner club by observing requirement number 1.
5. A club cannot retrieve their banner and steal a club banner at the same time, even if more than the minimum visitors are present.
6. No recovering group can retrieve more than 1 banner per evening.

ETHICS:

1. A club will not steal a banner from another club more than 1 time every 6 months;
2. A club will not travel more than 60 miles to steal a banner, except by invitation of the intended host club.
3. A club having had its banner stolen will make every effort to recover stolen banner in a reasonably short time. If a club does not recover its banner in 6 months, the banner shall be returned to the owner club.
4. If a banner is stolen, the officials of the host club should be notified of the date, time and place the visiting club has its regular dances.
5. A club will not have more than 1 travel banner.
6. If a traveling banner has been stolen, the club will not display its club banner, except at a special dance.
7. A club cannot steal a banner or retrieve its banner when their club caller is a guest caller of the club they are visiting.
8. If a large group is traveling to steal a banner it is strongly recommended that the host club is notified. (A recommended time is at least 3 days prior to night of dance, which gives the host club ample time, if refreshments are being served, to make preparations for the extra number of guests.)

NOTE: These Banner stealing guidelines were voted on at NEFSDA Meeting and approved by the majority of clubs attending, which means that you should be abiding by these guidelines.

ROUND DANCE MAGAZINES

(Editors of the New Mexico Round Dance Association Newsletter)

In our first newsletter (Oct.-Nov. 1990) we published what on second review was an advertisement from Apart Point Magazine. Since then, we have received questions from some wondering about other round dance magazines and the differences between them. There seems to be at least three national RD magazines: Apart Point, Round Dancer and Cue Sheets. We are not positive that these are the only magazines, but they are the most frequently quoted. Apart Point was provided an opportunity to voice their view (advertisement). Cue Sheet has not requested equal time. However, their magazine is virtually limited to publication of cue sheets and does not frequently publish articles on dancing, styling, or other subjects. We have received a request from Round Dancer to provide their view (advertisement, if you will) of their place in the round dance world. The following is the article Round Dancer provided. We cannot recommend one over another to any of our readers in this magazine. We use information from those and American Square Dance. If you want to see any or all of the magazines, talk to your dance leaders, other dancers, or contact the publishers directly.

FROM ROUND DANCER MAGAZINE

Did you know that round dancers have had their own magazine since 1957? Well, they have, and it all began in Tucson, AZ, under publishing editors Bud & Lil Knowland. In Sep. 1976, Round Dancer Magazine (RDM) was purchased by Jack & Alma Bassett who moved the magazine to State College, PA. In Jan. 1982, Brian & Sharon Bassett took over as publishing editors, and currently RDM is located in Petersburg, PA.

RDM has the distinction of being the first national and internationally circulated RD magazine, AND exists as an important, influential integral part of the RD legacy.

Dedicated to educating, informing and entertaining its readers (who far outnumber its considerable body of subscribers), RDM serves the entire, world-wide RD community...Dancers and teachers.

RDM offers a Free introductory package to all interested dancers. Included in this Intro Pkg is a resume and photograph of Brian & Sharon, and a list of items/services available to subscribers and non-subscribers.

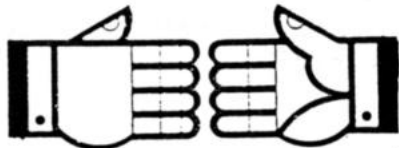

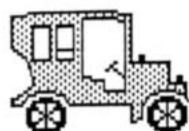

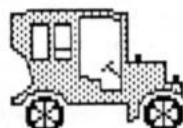

E.C.M.A. is the abbreviation for Emergency Call for Medical Aid. This signal is designed for use by dancers to notify the caller of a medical problem in their square. When such a problem occurs, important minutes are often lost in the frenzy of waving arms and explanations which cannot be heard or understood across a crowded dance floor. The method of an **ARCHED CIRCLE** will assure the fastest possible response time by medical personnel to an emergency on the dance floor. In this way, precious, perhaps lifesaving minutes, can be saved.

- STEP ONE:** When a dancer goes down, a second dancer attends him/her.
- STEP TWO:** Remaining couples join hands and take a step backward. This allows the injured person and attendant air and room.
- STEP THREE:** Raise joined hands as high as possible in the form of an arched circle.
- STEP FOUR:** On seeing this signal, the caller or club representative will immediately place an Emergency Call for Medical Aid.

This system was, to our knowledge, first introduced at the 33rd National Square Dance Convention in Atlantic City, New Jersey, in 1977. It was their hope that callers across the country would take the time to explain the arched circle E C M A signal to their dancers and familiarize them with both the procedure and its purpose. This is not being done and we feel that this is an important part of our being prepared in the event of an emergency.

Clubs and Associations - Familiarize your callers and clubs with this procedure and suggest that it be taught to all dancers. *

USDA EDUCATION PROGRAM

Square dancing has become a very important form of recreation to many people in all walks of life. It has to compete with a great number of other forms of entertainment available to the average person today. The success of any club, area, state or national association can be directly attributed to the competence of its management or leadership. Moreover, it is not just the expertise of the leaders of the higher organizations but the expertise of all levels from committees of a club to the top leaders of the national and international association. All of us are either in a leadership position now or will soon be approached for a position of leadership at some level within the square dance activity. Therefore, everyone should know something about leadership. Likewise, things do not just happen in the wonderful world of square dancing, they are brought about and made to happen! Examples: National Square Dance Convention, State Conventions, Area Festivals, Club Specials, regular dance nights, classes, after parties, etc. To make these square dance events happen requires the appropriate knowledge, skill and attitude. How does an individual obtain these three attributes? Universities and colleges provide the necessary education for people entering the business world, but how about the square dance world?

USDA has compiled and developed many information sheets related to square dance leadership; club operations; club management; duties and responsibilities of leaders, callers, delegates, members; code of ethics; good listening; checklist for club functions & responsibilities; why have organizations; attributes of leaders; good leadership; ten commandments of human relations; club announcements; club newsletters; meeting agenda; caller contracts; ideal club atmosphere; fun ideas; seminar subjects; recruiting new dancers; the class plan; typical class plan; answers to questions people often ask; why join a club; why do we lose dancers; plan to keep dancers; contributions to a no-fun club; and others. These items have been successfully utilized in many USDA "Leadership", "Recruiting and Keeping Dancers", "The Organization" and "Square Dance Fun" seminars.

The USDA Education Committee is presently working to develop educational Information Sheets and Pamphlets for use by the dance community. For more information about the USDA Education Program or single copies of the existing information sheets, please contact the USDA Education Chairman and specify the subject of the articles you desire.

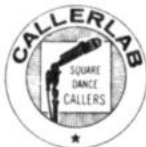

THIRTY-FIVE YEARS MAKES A DIFFERENCE

My wife and I learned to square dance thirty-five years ago. At that time, it was emphasized that square dancing IS dancing. Square dancers move their feet and bodies to the beat of the music. Figures were executed exactly as written - styling.

Not too long afterward, the program entered into an era of hot hash calling. Singing calls were given decidedly second billing in square dance programs. If you weren't a hash caller, you lost prestige. This type of program became quite popular with the dancers, soon the tempo was increased. Prior to this era 128 beats per minute was standard. Soon the standard was 130 or 132 with records being marketed with tempos of 134 and 136 beats per minute. It was difficult for the dancers to dance to the beat of the music without running. Next, the callers started clipping their calling - 8 beats instead of 10 for square thru, 4 beats instead of 8 for Do-Sa-Do, 2 beats for a nose-to-nose right and left thru. Now it was impossible to dance to the music. The Do-Sa-Do was replaced with the Hungarian Swing. This could be done in two beats. It has now just about replaced the back-to-back Do-Sa-Do. Some newer dancers may never have heard of the latter. Now, all swings were being done in two beats of music. What to do with the extra music? So twirl (coffee grind) the girls was born. This is a very awkward movement. Neither dancer ends in a comfortable position for the next call (Promenade, Circle Left, Alemande Left). In the earlier years, a man never twirled the lady. He only offered her the chance to twirl or not to twirl. This was done ONLY at the end of a grand right and left when the next call was a Promenade. The man met his partner right hand to right hand and raised the arms to form an arch. If the lady chose to, she twirled. It was a graceful and comfortable movement and both dancers ended facing counter-clockwise to start the Promenade. All this increased tempo and clipping led to the 24 beat Grand Square just about replacing the original 32 beat figure. Dancers get home with 8 beats to spare. So they do their own thing. They swing or twirl or go into the middle and bump derrieres with the opposite couple.

Now I'm not contending that square dancing, in years past, was better than it is today. I just want to make two points. First, it is somewhat different today. Secondly, changes made by the dancers were a natural adjustment to the change made in the calling program.

The main talking point for square dancing has always been, "Square Dancing is FUN." Today's dancers have fun with the Hungarian Swing, the twirl and the 24 beat Grand Square. Let's keep fun in dancing. It may not be the same for every dancer, but as long as dancers don't try to impose their way of fun on others, we can live with differences and stay healthy.

In another generation square dancing may be enjoyed without music. Who knows? But, if it is still fun, it will be a popular and successful movement. Let's keep and keep repeating the motto, "Square Dancing is FUN", and everybody help make it fun.
