FROM THE EDITORS DESKS



Several dancers have expressed a desire to have us address "cliques". We have two thoughts on this age old "problem".

Yes, if it's a club sponsored activity, everyone should be included. We must remember to try and dance with all members and guests and everyone should be made feel they are as important to the club with equal rights as all other members. If the club as a group goes out after the dance, then everyone--members and guests--should be invited. When jobs are to be done, everyone should be given the opportunity to help. Let's not overlook letting a club member know what is going on "before" it happens! Let's make sure we put ourselves in their place and see how we would feel if we were the ones "on the outside".

NOW, let's explore the other side. As we make friends in our Square Dance activity, it is natural to become closer to those people we have a more common bond with. If two or three couples get together--not as a club function whether before, at, or after a dance (or at any other time) this should not be construed as a clique. It's no different than enjoying the company of friends you have made who do not Square Dance.

Sometimes we "think" there is a

clique when there really isn't one. It may be that those few couples are not aware you share the same likes and



dislikes. Why not say something like, "We like to do that too. Do you mind if we join you sometime?" **OR** Start pitching in to help at your club dances and functions to show you want to be an integral part of your club.

Cliques, whether real, or imagined, have been known to cause dancers to leave a club and even Square Dancing. Cliques have also been known to cause the club to fold. Let's not let social cliques be a problem in our NE Association Clubs.

As club officers and association officers we need to be cognizant of the fact some people want to help but don't know how to get started. Not all people are leaders. Let's try to involve everyone **IF** they want to be involved. If they refuse to assist or join in an activity, then it was their decision to remain "on the outside".

BMI/ASCAP LICENSING PROCEDURES

(By George Wolfert, Florida Federation Licensing Representative)

A press release from the American Callers Association appearing in the May 1996 issue of the Bow & Swing contains information pertaining to licensing procedures for State and National Conventions which may be misleading to leaders of dancer associations in the State of Florida. Please be advised that there is no need for any Association, Club or Dancer in Florida to contact ACA or any other of the licensing agencies for information and, in fact, would be detrimental for any dancer or association to do so.

The Florida Federation of Square Dancers has an existing agreement for licensing with both BMI and ASCAP. The agreement, which has been in effect since 1990, pertains to dancer's associations and/or club

functions only and is separate from any agreement made with CALLERLAB, ROUNDALAB, ACA or any other caller/cuer organizations. Therefore, no further requests for licensing information or forms should be made to any of these organizations.

The licensing agreement between the Florida Federation and BMI and ASCAP would be seriously jeopardized if any individual dancer or association contacted the agencies on their own

We Get Letters

Dear Editor: I'm writing about an old controversy — and that's the problem — it's been a controversy too long. Callers teach the traditional back-to-back Do-Sa-Do but if you do it that way, you are immediately marked as a beginner. Skilled dancers substitute a swing. I value traditional things and honestly feel the traditional Do-Sa-Do is a more interesting move than a simple swing. Furthermore, if the caller wanted you to swing, why doesn't he call for the swing instead of the Do-Sa-Do? It's the callers and CALLERLAB who should take command here and end the controversy. Stop teaching the traditional Do-Sa-Do and stop calling it if you really want people to swing. The main point of Square Dancing is unison, so let's get all dancers doing it the same way — either we Do-Sa-Do or we Do-Sa-Don't.

And another thing while I'm at it — during a recent discussion I suggested that all those fancy moves (like the swing instead of the Do-Sa-Do)

be taught to all dancers once they have become competent Mainstream dancers. You know the stuff I mean — the slap hands, twirls and hop-skips that good dancers do during circle-to-the-left or weave-the-ring, etc. These are pretty moves, and fun, but often cause traffic jams and breakdowns when anyone except skilled dancers try them. Why not teach them so all of us can do them properly? The other individual felt it would destroy individual creative expression, and they have a point. On the other hand, the basic idea of Square Dancing, again, is unity and unison. Does West Point allow one cadet to twirl his rifle twenty feet into the air during precision drill? Do the Rockettes push one belly dancer out in front of the line of kicking legs? I don't think so. My feeling is that we should all be doing these pretty moves together — togetherness is what Square Dancing is all about.

Could you find out how others feel?

(Editors Note: How about it dancers and callers — how do you feel? Let us hear from you. Personally, I like to keep time to the music without holding up others in the square. It makes for smoother dancing and puts me back in position ready for the next move with a minimum of steps. Think how much time it takes to twirl during a R & L Grand as opposed to a simple pull by. There are times I like to cut up in a square but I try to do so without confusing others or delaying their execution of their moves.

CHALLENGES

To every new graduating class, whether it be Rounds or Squares, my favorite saying is "This is just the beginning". A whole new world of fun and friendship awaits you. Congratulations to all the new dancers in our area who have just completed their basic lessons.

Basic lessons? Yes, beginners' classes in both Squares and Rounds are just that. There are further levels to explore, and new rhythms to learn. The possibilities are endless.

In the Round Dance activity, the rhythms and levels of dances are in phases II - VI. Each level has new rhythms and steps and opens doors to some exciting challenges. Often, our new dancers are fearful of taking the next step. How can we encourage dancers to move to the next level?

Fortunately, Jim & I teach two groups on Sunday and the early birds, Phase II & III, can stay as long as they wish. Therefore, when we present a dance for the next group, III & IV (if they think they want to try it) - it's easy to move on. They can also leave if the going gets too tough - we don't lock the doors. Everyone tries to help the newer dancers as we laugh together, cuers included, and have fun together.

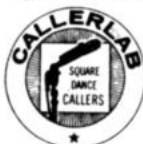
Getting the dancers to extend themselves to the Phase IV, V, and VI experience is a little more challenging. Many are intimidated by the strange sounding rhythms and steps (is he speaking a foreign language?). Once again, on Sunday during a break we "practice our teach" for Monday. Curiosity prevails and tempts some of the dancers to venture out on Monday. Once we entice them there and although they can't dance everything, they realize it's not so scary after all. Soon, they are learning new routines and are on the floor most of the evening.

It's also fun to teach all our groups the dances being "done everywhere". That way everyone can enjoy the Rounds at the Square Dances wherever they visit.

For Jim & I, Round Dancing is a constant learning experience which makes it fun, interesting and challenging. We encourage our dancers to extend themselves and reach for the next level. Time, patience and perseverance will prevail and make Round Dancing a wonderful learning activity and fulfilling experience for each of you - our new friends.

ONE CALLER'S VIEW

When I was asked to write an article for this issue, my first thought was to decline since writing is not an easy task for me. Besides, every topic that I could think of has already been printed in many articles over the years. However, I think that many of the concerns that the writers have addressed still exist today..

One of the subjects that continues to be in the Square Dance media and a topic of concern here in Jacksonville is the overall decline of the number of Square Dancers and Square Dance clubs. My wife, Janice, and I moved to Jacksonville a little over two years ago and in that period of time at least three clubs have folded. The problem is not just peculiar to this area but seems to exist in many other areas across the US. The big question is WHY? Well, I don't claim to have all the answers. However, I do have some thoughts.

One thing I have noticed just about everywhere is that there is **not a shortage** of folks that have identified

some problems but there are **few that are willing** to get involved in finding a solution. One other thing I have observed is that **most keep doing the same thing** over and over each year but **expecting different results**.

Someone once said "Unless you change how you are, you will always have what you've got". Maybe we need to reflect on how we are, what we are doing, what we can do differently to attract new people, how our publicity program is and how we are viewed by the general public. These, among others, are some valid questions and, if answered, might surprise some folks. I think some of our problems could be solved by just getting back to some basic principles.

This is a subject that needs and deserves more attention than I can give in this limited space.

That's my view — I would welcome yours.

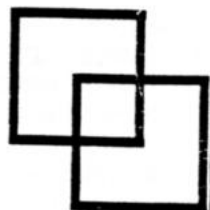
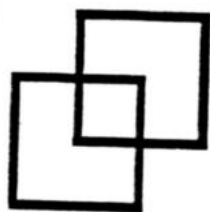

WHAT'S COOKING ?

If you're lookin' for some good **HOME COOKIN'**, read on! I took a peek into **JANICE ATKINSON's** recipe files and found the following yummy dessert. Just perfect for the finishing touche to a successful summer dinner party.



GLAZED PINEAPPLE CHEESE PIE

- 1 can (1 lb 1 1/4 oz) crushed pineapple in its own juice.
- 2 pkgs (8 oz each) cream cheese, softened.
- 1/2 cup sugar
- 1 tsp. vanilla extract
- 1 8" prepared graham cracker crust
- 2 eggs, beaten
- 2 1/2 tsp. cornstarch

Preheat oven to 350 deg. F. Drain pineapple reserving juice. Blend cream cheese with sugar, eggs, and 1/2 teaspoon vanilla. Stir in 1/2 cup pineapple. Pour into crust. Bake 25 to 30 minutes or until center is set; cool. Combine reserved juice with cornstarch. Cook 3 to 4 minutes or until thickened and translucent. Stir in remaining vanilla; cool slightly. Spoon over pie. Arrange remaining pineapple around outer edge of pie; chill. Yield: 6 to 8 servings

I then looked through my "What's Cookin'" file of unused recipes and found something submitted by BETTY SMITH earlier in the year. With summer and "hot" temperatures approaching, the "cold" salad season is just around the corner---making this item perfect for this issue.

VEGETABLE SALAD

- 1 20 oz French green beans
- 1 20 oz English peas
- 1 20 oz whole kernel corn
- 1 green pepper, sliced
- 4 celery stalks, diced
- 2-3 small onions, cut in rings
- 1 2 oz jar pimento, diced

MARINADE

- 1/2 cup salad oil
- 1 tbspn salt
- 1 cup vinegar
- 1 cup sugar

Drain canned vegetables. Put into bowl. Add green pepper, celery, onions and pimentos. Combine marinade ingredients and heat to toiling. Let stand 24 hours in fridge. Drain in colander. Put lettuce leaves in bottom of glass bowl, place vegetables on top and serve. Yield: 8 Servings

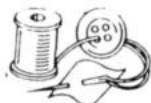

STITCHIN' TIME

Looking for an accessory for your western dress? Try this easy-to-make scarf.

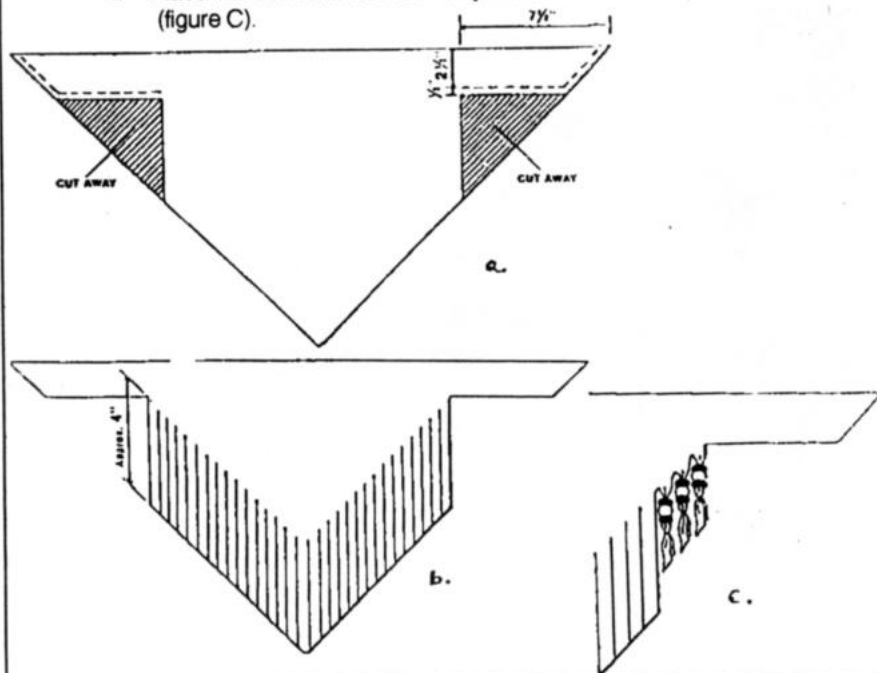
PONY BEAD SCARF

MATERIALS NEEDED:

- 1 Navajo Bandana (any color or print desired)
 - 31 Beads to match color one (color in bandana)
 - 31 Beads to match color two
 - 31 Beads to match a third color
- Bead colors are optional
Needle and thread. tape measure.

INSTRUCTIONS:

1. With wrong sides facing out, fold scarf to a triangle.
2. On the fold, measure 7 1/2" in and 2 1/2" down. Sew as shown and cut off excess material (figure A).
3. Start at the bottom center point and cut a 1/2" wide and about a 4" long strip. Then cut 15 similar strips on both sides of the center strip (figure B).
4. Place the different colored Pony Beads on each strip. Tie the ends (figure C).

JUNE 1966

Dancers at the Starlite Shufflers were treated to the calling of Allen Gurganious. Alan is possibly Florida's youngest caller at age seven, but without a doubt he is the smallest!

JUNE 1976

A dance called by National caller and choreographer Jack Lasry was hosted by the Gateway Callers. Rounds were by Barbara Blackford.

JUNE 1986

On June 14, Jacksonville was the scene of the largest outdoor square dance ever held in the state of Florida when nearly 1500 dancers wearing red, white and blue filled the mile long River Walk to celebrate the "Spirit of '86", a nationwide celebration of 50 years of square dancing in the United States. Callers taking part in the event were Art Wilson, Lawton Smith, Paul Walker and Georgia caller George Shriver.

JULY 1966
