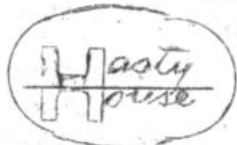

Orange Park Promenaders' agreement with the Lion's Club was one-half the gross income per dance. According to our treasurer, we've made payments to the Lion's Club for the last six months averaging \$72.14 per month. This only includes Friday night dances since the Lion's Club cancelled our Tuesday night class time this fall in favor of bingo. Over the years square dancing has paid almost \$300.00 a month and as little as \$49.00 which was this December since we cancelled two dances. We've checked our records for the last five years and discovered we've paid better than \$6,500.00 in rent to the Orange Park Lion's Club for Friday night dances only. Class records were not readily available to our treasurer.

February 3rd, the Lion's Club manager conveyed their Board's decision that starting March 1st Orange Park Promenaders must pay \$60.00 a night if we want the hall (about \$240.00 per month). We, of course, had to cancel. We would like to extend our best wishes to Orange Park Lion's Club and their future endeavors knowing that square dancers helped to make the beginning possible.
