## ROUNDLEERS PRESENT CHARLIE BALDWIN

Charlie Baldwin has been to square dancing in New England as Pappy Shaw has been to the activity as a whole. In fact, Charlie was instrumental in bringing to New England in the 40's and 50's, clinics and institutes headed by such people as Dr. Lloyd Shaw, Herb and Pauline Greggerson and other pioneers in the revival of square dancing at that time. Charlie himself danced as a teenager when a fiddler/prompter was all there was in place of today's high priced equipment and caller; and he began his calling career, as did most others at that time, with his own square dance orchestra. He became one of New England's most beloved and sought after callers with his unique ability to combine the best of the traditional with the best of the contemporary improvements all along the way to today's modern Western Style Dancing. He also has taught some of today's most promising callers, having conducted callers clinics and workshops, not only in New England, but also for various State Educational Departments and Universities. In 1955 he conducted the first of several "Short Courses" in square dancing, along with Nita and Manning Smith, at the University of Florida at Gainesville. Bill and Nora Camp, as members of the Florida Callers Association, also participated in these courses for several years.

Charlie was instrumental in making the New England Callers Association one of the most productive and respected of such groups in the country, and has been editor of the 'New England Square Dance Caller' magazine since its beginning almost 19 years ago. This has been one of the most successful area publications in the square dance field. His current pet project is the formation of a Square Dance Library or Museum where memorables, artifacts, records, or anything pertaining to the heritage of our activity can be kept and preserved. In this vein, he is currently offering a square dance program of fun and challenge, dancing the classics of the past twenty five years. Charlie and Bertha frequently vacation in Florida, usually quietly and not accepting calling dates, but this year, since they are stopping in Jacksonville to visit friends, he has agreed to call one of his very special dances for the Roundleers 6th anniversary Square Dance on March 25th.
