In the mid thirties, a frail young housewife and mother interested in joining a movement to establish a community Sunday school, since none existed in our neighborhood-- Her loyal support to that Sunday school, the many family get-togethers during those depression years-- She owned a cow, therefore milk, others would furnish other ingredients, results; home made ice cream, oh boy! She was always the champion of the underdog or lost ones, always a worker allowing others to take the praise and glory. During the early war years (WW II) she was a tireless worker in various patriotic movements, knitting for servicemen, helping in Red Cross projects; a member of Army Air Force aircraft spotting service and anything else that needed doing. Her efforts were tireless in community activities, civic clubs, library, women's club, Home Demonstration club, but where she really stood out was in her devotion to her God and church. Many of us knew the kitchen as "Dot's Kitchen" for while it wasn't too hard to get volunteers for other duties, not many would take the kitchen - Dot was always there. Our association was so close-- while home on Navy boot leave I was introduced to the twins, Sandra and Linda (I'm their god-father) -- My wife and Dot visited a TB mobile unit for a test - Dot's was positive - she spent a year in Sunland Sanatorium, accepting all this in her usual way, knowing God was with her.

Annual church conventions with her were such a privilege - Camp Weed as counselor for girls, that was Dot. When I lost my wife I always felt free and at home with her for a meal, a cup of coffee or just a gab session. Company for dinner was no problem, she said "the soup may be a little thinner but there will be plenty". While on a visit to Fontana, I discovered Square Dancing, signed up for a class upon my return home, liked it so much I persuaded a teacher to start a class in Mandarin, and who was the first to sign up? Dot and Charlie.

But for them there very well might not be such a club as the ALLEMANDARINS, for it was through their efforts that we were able to use the facilities of Church of Our Saviour to get started. When it was discovered that she had cancer she said "I have faith in God and my doctor - why should I worry?" She came through with flying colors.

The rest most of you know for no one that ever visited or knew anything about the ALLEMANDARINS didn't know and love Dot. In recent years we have danced and trailered to many interesting places and spent so many memorable hours together. I never knew Dot to say a harsh thing about anyone - "Love thy neighbor as thyself" - that was her creed. Even though she engaged in so many things, her family always came first, and she left the best memorial any wife and mother could leave -- such an outstanding family.

NATIONAL SQUARE DANCE CONVENTION

The 22nd National Square Dance Convention in Salt Lake City, Utah on 28, 29 & 30 June 1973 is the Place to Be in '73 and the youth of the nation are already registering in "droves". Such outstanding groups as the Mavericks of Seattle, Wash. will be doing their "thing" at exhibition time. The youth will have their own dance hall (larger than past conventions) with shiny tile floors and the parents can attend if they think that they can keep up.

There will be youth after-parties on Thursday and Friday nights with special callers especially for the youth.

Don't tell anyone, but on Friday morning at 8 a.m. all of the youth should slip away to go on the tour to Timpanogos Cave. This is a National Monument and is one of the most beautiful of all the caves in the nation. It is situated at an elevation of nearly 11,000 feet in a setting of lovely mountain scenery with a view of the Utah Valley that is breathtaking.

Advance registrations continue to flow in at an unprecedented rate for this convention. Some are asking: "Will there be places to stay?" The Housing Committee reports that there are many motels and hotels that are not listed on the back of the registration form because only those that would or could set aside 20 or more rooms are listed. There are many others in the area that will be utilized.

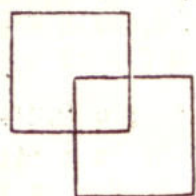

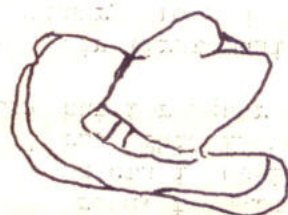
