WHAT IS CALLERLAB?

In February, 1971, fourteen members of The American Square Dance Society's Hall of Fame formed CALLERLAB as a means of encouraging caller-
leadership throughout the square dance activity. By February, 1972, the membership was increased to about 30 members, and at the 1974 convention all the callers present were asked to join. The members of this group have proved through many years of service to the activity, their devotion to American Square Dancing and their desire to help improve the professional standards of calling. A number of successful CALLERLAB projects include the endorsement and encouragement of the 50 Basic and 75 Basic Programs of American Square Dancing, the establishment of a teaching curriculum for caller/leadership courses and the concept of the First International (invitational) Square Dance Callers CONVENTION. Projects now underway include the Experimental Basic Selection each quarter-year, and a number of research programs participated in by all members and designed to improve, promote and perpetuate the activity. Membership in CALLERLAB is invitational and its eventual goal is to be of complete service to square dance caller/teachers in particular and the Square Dance Movement in general.

Sandusky, Ohio — Plans are moving swiftly ahead for the largest gathering of square dance callers in history. On March 24, about seven hundred callers and wives from every state and Canadian province will convene at the Marriott Motor Hotel in Chicago for the second annual Callerlab Convention.

Stan Burdick, executive secretary of Callerlab, also known as the International Association of Square Dance Callers, announced that over five hundred persons have registered to date, and he predicts a "sell-out" affair.

Dave Taylor, convention chairman, points out that this is an "invitational" conclave. Most of the "greats" of the calling profession will be there, as well as an equal number of strictly area and local callers.

For three days, March 24 to 26, these professional entertainers will be involved in discussions and hear speakers to help improve their skills and trying to resolve some of the key issues of the square dance activity. Matters of styling, standardization, list of basic movements, an identification system, training of callers, accreditation, and promotion will be on the agenda. No actual dancing will take place.

Resolutions are expected to result from this event that will undoubtedly have an effect on the activity for some two and a half million square dancers coast to coast and internationally.

Previous to the convention opening at two o'clock on Monday, twenty-three members of the Board of Governors will meet on Sunday to discuss organizational matters. The convention theme is "Time For Action." A special highlight of the event will be the Tuesday night banquet, at which time three special "Milestone Awards" will be presented to callers who have made an outstanding contribution to the activity.

In addition to Taylor and Burdick, other members of the convention committee are Frank Lane of Colorado and Marshall Flippo of Texas. Canadian liaison is Angus McMorran of Ottawa. Further information may be obtained from the Callerlab office at P.O. Box 788, Sandusky, Ohio 44870.

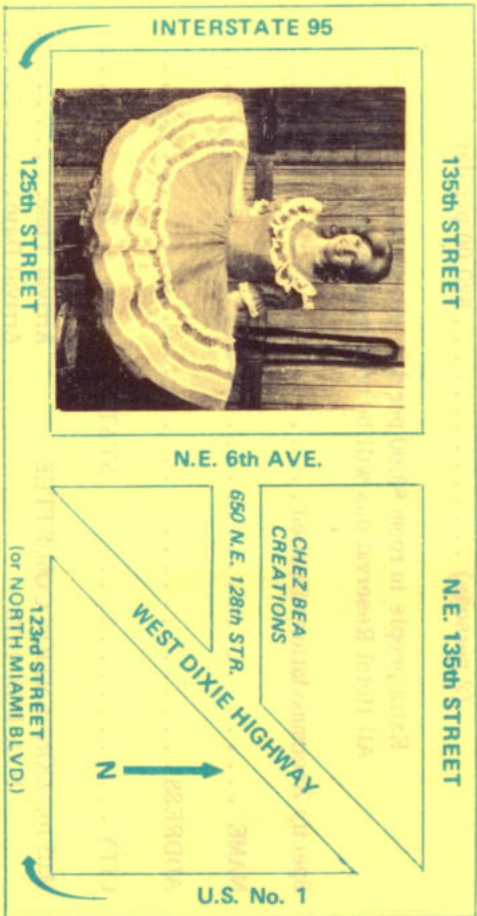

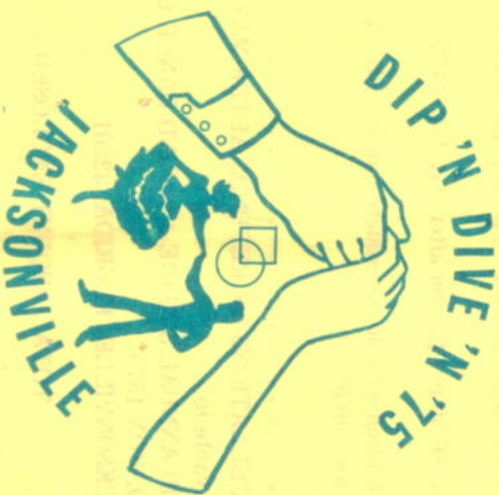

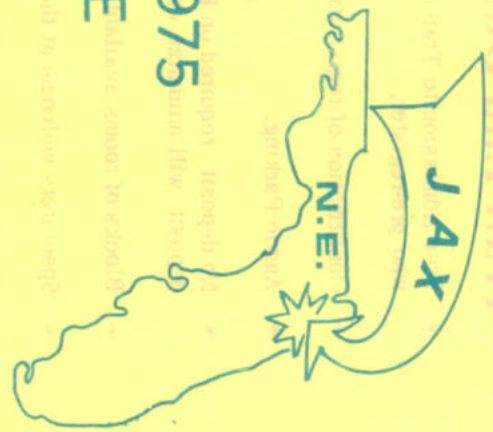
