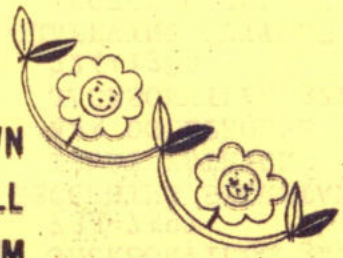
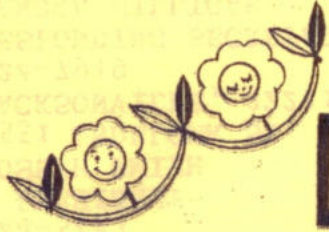

It took some doing and a lot of mis-  
giving to come to this decision. We  
are not a 'moving' konvention. Clear-  
water has hosted 16 of the 17 konven-  
tions held so far, so moving away wou-  
ld be like losing our home and not the  
same konvention at all, AND, the gas  
restrictions and energy crisis, too,  
have played a large part in our final  
decision.

On the GOOD NEWS SIDE - The Crystal  
Ballroom (10th floor of the Ft. Harri-  
son Hotel) is being stripped of the  
old carpet and restored to the parquet  
floors we enjoyed for our dancing in  
the past konventions, years ago. This  
floor restoration provides us with 2

mezzanine floor and the 10th floor Cry-  
stal ballroom. The teens too, will have  
their own room, dancing on carpeted  
floors in their stockinged feet AND -  
the Round Dance Evening Ball will be  
held at the Clearwater YWCA - just a  
short distance away from the Ft. Harri-  
son Hotel (but not walking distance).
