LET THEM DANCE

Ahhhhhh, Spring is in the air! You know what time that is right? Exactly, income tax time. Well, I suppose it is, but more important, it's the time many beginner classes graduate from our beloved activity.

We all remember our own graduation. The tricks the club might have played on us. The wearing of the cap and tassels. Walking up to receive our diploma with everyone cheering.

Yes, graduation night is usually an eventful time filled with happy memories. If your club is having one of these, make sure you attend to watch the enthusiasm in the eyes of the new dancers.

Clubs, dancers and callers should take every effort to make the new dancer feel welcome. Go out of your way to say hello and to congratulate them on their achievement. If you haven't bothered to angel the class this year, by all means square up with them and enjoy a tip or two.

This is a very vulnerable time for the new graduate. They have just completed months of classes, and now they can wear their club badge with pride. They haven't gotten their "sea legs" yet regarding club dancing, but with time and

patience from everyone, they will.

Now is the time we should let them dance and enjoy themselves. Make them feel special, because in reality, they are. If your club is traveling, personally ask the new graduate to join you. Don't assume they will know what to do even if they do hear the announcement at a dance.

Now more than ever, with our numbers steadily decreasing, we need to nurture the new graduates so they will not only feel welcomed, but also retain membership in the club. They are the future of the club. Taking some extra time now will save frustration later due to lack of attention.

Some things we should not do is to ask our new graduates to become chairman of a committee or bring refreshments to the next dance. Too many dancers quit after they graduate due to pressures of taking responsibility in the club. Even if your club is desperate for help, please refrain from including the new graduates. All your time and effort of helping them during the past year should not go to waste due to filling committee spots in a hasty manner.

The last thing any new dancer needs is to feel that they were welcomed all these past months just so they can assume a club responsibility.

Another thing clubs and callers should not do is to immediately start Plus Level Workshops for the new graduates. I know I am swimming against the tide here, it might seem futile, but it is worth mentioning.

Let them dance and stay at Mainstream if possible. Yes, if your club is a Plus Club, I realize that dancing at the club dances might be difficult for the new graduates unless they learn Plus. So, do something irrational, change some club dances to Mainstream to accommodate the new graduates. It

won't kill you. In fact, you might actually enjoy a Mainstream dance.

It will require many callers to stop hiding from easy "vanilla" style Plus dances and actually use the Mainstream list as it was intended. There is nothing wrong with the caller actually doing some work for a change!

So, instead of bringing the horse to the water, get some pails and bring the water to the horse. They will probably drink it a lot easier if you do.

No matter what you do this Spring with the new graduates, remember, **you were once a beginner**. Never lose sight of that. Last but not least, **just let them dance!**

History Of The Florida Square & Round Dance Coordinating Committee

In late 1971 and early 72 a problem developed between some dancers and a few callers as to the format of the state convention. It got so bad that each faction threatened to hold their own convention. Chet Vetter, Chairman of the Florida Federation of Square Dancers, figured it was time for cooler heads to take over and requested a meeting with Art Springer, President of the Caller's Association and Chuck Heiss, President of Florida Round Dance Council (RDC). Two meetings were held and it was agreed a joint meeting of callers and dancers might help.

The Caller's Clinic was scheduled for October in Cocoa and as the dancers usually had a meeting in conjunction with the clinic it was felt this would be the best time. On October 22, 1972 the Joint meeting was called to order and chaired by Chet Vetter. He explained the problem and offered as a solution a committee of one dancer, one cuer and one caller from each of the four areas. This committee to meet in a free wheeling atmosphere and

come up with a format they could agree on in principle and it would then go to the three State groups to approve. The committee was formed and met that same day agreeing on a tentative format to be smoothed out with the involvement of the round dancers at a later meeting. The second meeting was held in Orlando on December 10, 1972 and from this the format and procedures were developed and they have changed little since that time.

The original committee whose ideas calmed the waters and were so far reaching few changes have been necessary were callers Vern Johnson, Colin Walton, John Robbins, Cliff Hendricks and Gil Crosby, all appointed by Art Springer. Round dance leaders appointed by Chuck Heiss were Marty Martin, Bill Cascio, Carl Boremann and Bill Fleshman. Chet Vetter appointed dancers Jim Whiteman, Len Levitt, Jack Tucker, Ben Hamilton and Tom Caviness.

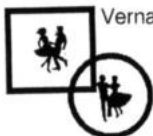

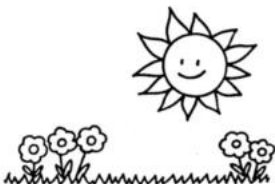

WHAT'S COOKING?

By Val Newsome



Everyone keeps telling me how much they enjoy the column, so I'll continue trying to find interesting and/or delicious recipes to share with you.

In this issue, I've selected a Fruited Chicken Curry which has a preparation time of only 20 minutes and a cooking time of only 25 minutes. Wow! It's made with boneless chicken breasts and is served over steamed rice. The Salad takes only 15 minutes to prepare, but will need at least an hour to marinate. HOPE YOU ENJOY BOTH DISHES!

FRUITED CHICKEN CURRY

2 whole chicken breasts, halved, boned, skinned.

1 1/2 Tbsp. salad oil

1/4 cup sliced almonds

1 1/2 tsp. curry powder

1/4 tsp. ground ginger

1 medium onion, thinly sliced

1 clove garlic, minced or pressed

1/3 cup chicken broth

1 tsp. grated lemon rind

2 Golden Delicious apples, peeled,
cored, cut into chunks

2 tsp. cornstarch, mixed with 1 Tbsp.
broth or water

Dash of Salt

Cut Chicken into 1-inch squares, sprinkle lightly with salt. In heated oil in large fry pan, stir almonds until golden; remove with a slotted spoon. Drain on paper towels and reserve. Stir curry powder and ginger into oil. Add onion, stirring to coat with spice mixture. Mix in the chicken pieces and garlic. Add broth; sprinkle with lemon rind. Bring to boiling, reduce heat, cover and simmer approximately 10 minutes. Mix in apples and continue cooking covered until apples are just tender (about 10 minutes). Stir in cornstarch mixture, cooking and stirring until thickened and smooth. Sprinkle with almonds to serve. Spoon over steamed rice.

CUCUMBER & ONION SALAD

3 cucumbers, 6 inches long OR

2 European type cucumbers
about 10 inches long

1 bunch green onions

Butter or leaf lettuce

Fresh tomato wedges for garnish

Marinade:

1/2 cup white wine vinegar

1/2 cup sugar

1 Tbsp. dill weed

1 Tbsp. salt

1/2 tsp. white pepper

Slice cucumbers thin, turn into bowl. Slice green onions diagonally as thinly as possible & add to cucumbers. In small bowl, mix vinegar, sugar, dill weed, salt and pepper...whisk with fork until blended. Pour over onions and cucumbers. Turn with spatula to coat all pieces. Marinate 1 hour or more.

Lift cucumbers from marinade and serve on lettuce leaves, garnish with tomato wedges. To serve buffet style, drain off some of the marinade and put cucumbers into a large pretty bowl...garnish with tomato wedges.

Both these recipes serve 4. To serve 8, double ingredients of salad, but use only 1 1/2 times the marinade. For 8 servings of the Chicken Curry, double the ingredients, but use only 3 apples. For 2 servings of both dishes, half the ingredients.

LEGACY - What is it?

Twenty-six years ago this May individuals from thirty states and Canadian provinces gathered for three days, at their own expense, in Cleveland, OH to take an in depth objective look at the overall square dance picture and to search for ways to protect, promote and to perpetuate its future. With almost every facet within our activity at that time represented by the attendees, their mission was to communicate together and decide how all these facets within the activity, working closely together, might be of greater service to the square dancer, to the club and to the activity as a whole. By the closing session, ten problems had been identified. Among these were our Image, a need for Leadership training, Standardization, understanding our Heritage & Courtesies, Retention & Recruitment, and better Communications with organizations working together. Possible solutions were offered, one of which was chosen for immediate action in each category.

All who attended realized that this was only the first step and that implementation and follow up would be a key to success. And so LEGACY was conceived as a Service - Leadership organization dedicated to the development of better Communications among those many facets within the activity. It was to be an organization

whose members, from the many facets within our activity, by working together, could provide unlimited benefits for the activity.

Meeting biennially, LEGACY has continued to review the overall picture within the activity and come up with recommendations. It's biennial survey has pinpointed many areas for more concentrated efforts of cooperation between the facets. Its Leadership Training and Marketing seminars have spawned similar efforts by others. So far it's campaign for having the Square Dance designated the national folk dance has garnered thirty states. Suppliers and Round Dance Leaders received their organizational impetus to form at a LEGACY meeting. LEGACY sponsors an annual Summit Meeting at the National Square Dance Convention where representatives from all the national major organizations gather to exchange ideas.

LEGACY XIV will be conducting its 14th biennial gathering, back where it all began, May 14 -16 in Cleveland, Ohio. Its members, called trustees, have been dancing for at least five years or have been in a leadership capacity in the activity for at least three years. IN STEP WITH...

Country, Clogging and Line Dancing

(Copied from "Getting In Line" written by Judie Ishmael for the Nov.'98 issue of "Bow & Swing")

standard vines in any dance that is the "dance of the month" you may choose to use a rolling vine. Many people cannot do a rolling vine so I just say vine. Remember, don't let one uncomfortable step keep you from doing a dance you enjoy. There is always something else you can do in its place.

"Star turns are a series of points followed by a turn. The ones in the following dance are rather simple to do. Keep in mind that whenever you see

Music: "Time Off From Good Behavior" by Doug Supernaw or "COUNTRY" by Joe Diffie.

- 1-4 Right Heel Twice, Toes Back Twice; (R,-,-) 4 beats
tap Right heel forward twice,-, tap Right toes back twice,-;
- 5-8 Star Turn; (R,R,R,L) 4 beats
tap Right toes forward, to right side, to back (take weight), hitch right knee as you turn 1/4 left stepping on Left.
- 9-16 Forward Slide 3; Back Slide 3; (R,L,R,-)(L,R,L,-) 8 beats

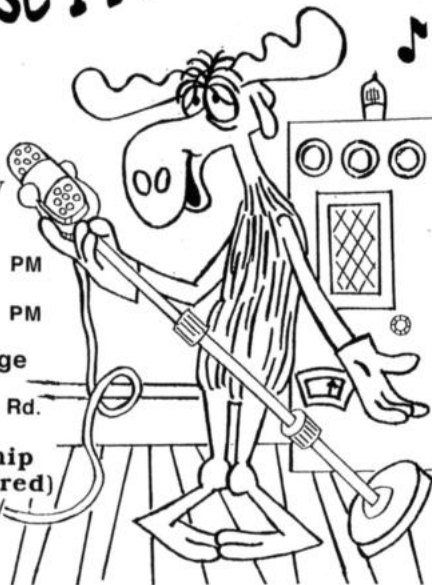

RECOGNIZED GUIDELINES OF ETIQUETTE FOR SQUARE DANCERS

Reprinted from the magazine *Your Caller*.

All dancers should refrain from the use of alcoholic beverages before and during a dance.

Men should wear long sleeves all seasons.

Ladies should wear full skirts.

Personal hygiene is essential when you consider the proximity of eight dancers in a square.

When sets are being squared, step into the nearest one that is not filled. Others don't like to think that you do not like to dance with them.

It is a serious breach of decorum to walk out of a square while dancing. You are preventing seven other people from enjoying themselves.

Try not to distract other dancers when the caller is giving instructions. You may know what he is going to say, but they may not.

The clasping of hands and arms should be gentle, as they are used only as pivot points in square dancing.

Introduce yourself when entering a square and thank everyone when leaving.

Your only competitor in square dancing is yourself. It is a recreation of courtesy-not competition.

If you "goof", keep smiling. The other seven dancers might think you are frowning at them.

Name badges should be worn at all square dance occasions. Without one, you are placing the other dancers at a

disadvantage. Originally it was conceived to keep the relationship on a first name basis. We all have this activity in common, and there are no strangers in square dancing.

Remember your identity when "squaring up". Heads, sides, etc.

Support a club as a dues paying member, and try to serve as an officer or on a committee.

The club is the backbone of square dancing.

Thank your guests for coming to your club and when visiting, thank the caller for his efforts, the club president for inviting you, and everyone who contributed to your pleasant evening.

Let the caller be the instructor unless you are asked to help. Just dance as a student when in class.

There are many ways to offend the set or the club. Avoid them.

That extra twirl or swing may delay the whole set for the next figure.

It is nice to trade dances with guests and to see that the caller's wife is invited into a square when possible.

If you have complaints about the hall, sound, floor, etc., wait and contact some member of the host club tactfully, or, don't complain.

Prearranged squares for other than workshops are not in good taste. If you wish to dance with friends, square up as two opposite couples and allow any other two couples to complete the set.

National Square Dance Campers - Back Where It All Began !

The 1999 International Camp-o-ree will be held at Walworth County Fairgrounds in

Elkhorn, Wisconsin July 13 - 15. This year's theme is most appropriate "Back Where it all Began". For this is where it all began forty two years ago.

In 1957, a group of callers in the Wolf Rivers Callers Association in Wisconsin decided to combine Square Dance workshops with camping and invited some dancers to come along for the fun of it. It proved to be such a success that it was repeated annually drawing more and more participants. By the early 1960's it was apparent that a bigger campground would be required and Bear Lake was chosen.

When a guest camping family suggested starting this camp/dance idea back in New Jersey, the idea of a National Square Dance Campers Association, Inc. began to formulate. The Wolf River Callers Ass'n decided that growth of a campers group depended on separation from the parent organization. By late 1964, conditions for incorporation has been set in motion, the campfire design copyrighted and plans established for the formation of chapters. Ironically, even before the Wolf River Ass'n could even get their own chapter application

completed, New Jersey, with its Garden State Campers, became chapter 001. In rapid succession chapters were formed in five other states and continued to grow throughout the United States and Canada.

While the actual International Camp-o-ree is a three day mid-week event, a number of NSDCA members arrive early to sight see and go on scheduled tours. The Camp-o-ree itself is a very busy three days. Mornings are devoted to various sports, games and crafts, Square Dance workshops and Round Dance teaches fill the afternoon hours while evenings offer a full Square and Round Dance program of dancing.

All International Camp-o-rees are programmed with the family in mind. Youth have their own full schedule of events including their own sporting program as well as Square Dancing, crafts and other special activities. A daily newspaper, "The SNOOPER", keeps everyone up to date on camper news, activities, door prizes, schedule changes, etc. While it is a full schedule of events there is always time to renew old friendships and make new friends.

HOW FRIENDLY ARE WE

(Reprinted from *USDA NEWS*, Oct/Dec 1998)

A couple or a single looking for a square dance club to join, devised the following point system....

* If someone smiled at them — 10 points

* If someone sitting near them greeted them — 10 points

* If someone told them the/r name — 100 points

* If someone asked them to come back — 200 points

* If someone introduced them to another couple — 1000 points

* If someone introduced them to the caller — 2000 points

They visited eighteen clubs. Using the point scale, none of the clubs had more than 100 points! Their conclusion.....

.... The club may be meaningful, do great things for their community, and be

active and friendly, but when a visitor finds no one cares whether or not he/she is there, that visitor's not likely to come back, let alone join your club.

If a visitor came to your next square dance, what rating would they give your club?

At the beginning of each new year, we may see many new faces at club dances and clubs we are visiting. Everyone has the responsibility to make sure that these new faces are made to feel welcome. It takes at least two years to understand the finer points of square dancing; even longer sometimes to understand club organization and member/officer responsibilities and realize the true benefits of being part of the program. In the meantime, we need to make sure new faces are made to feel a part of the group.

Sticking your head in the sand puts your other end in a very vulnerable position.

STITCHIN' TIME

By Val Newsome

("Exerpts taken from "HEMLINE" in the April 1999 issue of the

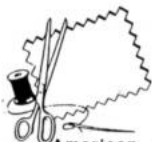
Add one inch to each side of the pattern. Put a tiny hem in the bottom of leg.

Using elastic thread in your bobbin, sew rows of lace 1" apart up each leg to approximately 2" above the crotch.

Sew one or two rows of stitching between each row of lace. Continue with the elastic thread at 1/2" intervals stitching lines up to just below the casing line. (I find it easier to use a fabric marker and a ruler to mark the pieces before I start sewing.) Sew the seams together.

Make a hem for casing at the waist and insert the elastic.

Items needed for the pettipants are 1 1/2 yards of fabric, 20-25 yards of 3/4" to 1" flat lace, 1 spool elastic thread and elastic for the waist."

"For the adventuresome, I am going to give you instructions on how to make your own pettipants. One of our dancers makes her own, but does not add ruffles. Instead, she makes them out of the fabric of whatever outfit she is making so they match the outfit.

Use either a pajama or shorts pattern that does not have a side seam. If you cannot find one try pinning the two pieces together at the side seam; you get the same effect. Using drip-dry cottons or poly/cotton, or batiste or your fashion fabric, cut out two pieces.

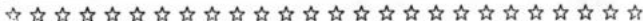
