We are running a new directory in this issue; Hope all our information is correct.

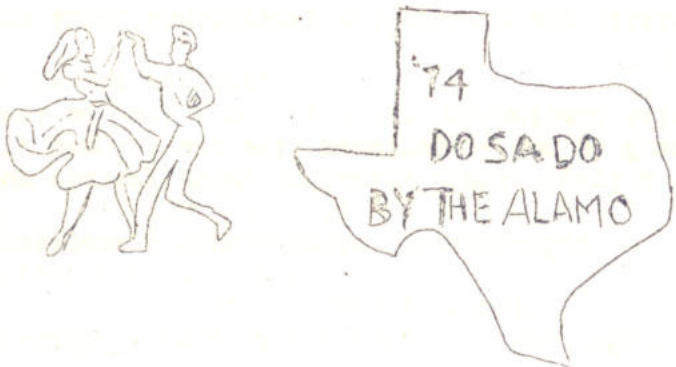
