From The Editors' Desk..

We have been meaning to write an Editorial on this subject for some time, but it seemed that something else took precedence. Now that this is our next to last Editorial we decided this was the issue to write on the subject.

To all Club Reporters, Club Delegates, Club Presidents, or whoever writes your Club News articles:

We'd like to offer a few points to help you write your Club News to make it factual and informative.

1. If you are writing in October, keep in mind you are writing about things coming up...not in the past tense. By the same token, don't write about something that is going to happen in October, because it will be past when the publication comes out.

Some editors print exactly what you write; we have tried to watch for those inaccurate statements. But -- we don't catch them all.

2. Make sure you check the calendar and you have the correct dates your special dance is going to be. Many times, and we're sure we miss some, the date you have in your article about a special dance, takes place on a date other than the date your Club dances. We also have found dates in the Club News that conflicted with something the Club President has given us.

3. To make your article interesting tell about things your Club did, what a great time the dance was, etc. for those dances already past. Don't talk

about somebody on vacation -- the other members of your club might feel left out that their vacation wasn't mentioned. Club News is meant to advertise your Club and how much fun it has at its dances, it's upcoming theme dances when other dancers might want to come and visit. The Club Reporter should think of themselves as the Publicity Director for the Club, not individuals. That doesn't mean to say awards, illnesses, deaths, etc., can not be mentioned. Those are important and should be included. Even special anniversaries & birthdays are interesting reading. Try to make sure you treat every member equally.

4. Read the inside front page of The Grapevine which also gives some insight into what should be in your Club News. Prices of dances are not to be in your Club News, but in your Club Ad.

5. Grammar: Try to make sure your spelling is right, and that you've been concise and not too wordy.

6. **BE ON TIME!** The deadline of publications is given so that the Editor has time to get everything in the right place and get to the printer by their deadline. Just this issue we had 2 clubs late, one arrived the day we were going to the printer. That meant redoing a lot of the work already done before we could go.

The job of **Club News Reporter** is **important** -- it helps bring visitors to your club by advertising the dates of future dances. It tells about your new caller, cuer, dance format, change of place to dance, new officers, and special activities your club did together (like a night out for dinner, a night at a show).

These points were meant to be helpful and we hope they are.

"A Life Devoted to Giving "

I'll bet when most of you meet or see **Erv Oermann**, you see a soft-spoken, white-haired, well-

mannered gentleman who likes to square and round dance. Well, let me introduce you to the 'other side' of **Ervin (Erv) Oermann!**

Erv was born in York, Pennsylvania, one of 4 children, and attended schools in York, and college in New York. Following college he entered the Seminary at St. Louis with the intention of becoming a full time minister in the Lutheran faith.

He later married - for 35 years until the death of his wife in 1986. Erv has three grown children and four grandchildren.

After he was ordained, his first call was as missionary to the Deaf in Austin, TX. Erv learned sign language which was necessary in his missionary work while there.

He next was called to serve as Chaplain at the Georgia State Mental Hospital in Milledgeville, GA where he served for 9 years. As we talked about his service there, Erv said he saw a part of himself in everyone he ministered to.

Erv's next calling was to a Miami Parish. Even though he had a church, he continued to do services for the deaf. While in Miami, he was a newscaster for the deaf on TV 10 Miami.

After service in the Miami community, he was called to a larger church in St. Petersburg, where he was 1 of 4 pastors. As usual, Erv found many ways to minister to the people of St. Petersburg.

As we continued to talk -- and he is most interesting to talk with -- I began to wonder, "When did he ever find time to learn to Square Dance?" But my

answer quickly came because his next call was to a church in Jacksonville in 1984, where he retired from the active ministry in 1989.

He took Square Dance lessons at Clay Wheel Arounds with Lawton Smith as instructor and began dancing in 1988. In 1990 he took round dance lessons with Jim & Barbara Winter and Wayne & Barbara Blackford.

Erv joined the Seabreeze Singles in 1989 and still remains an active and loyal member of that club, participating in all their club activities. Though he did not join other clubs, he dances with many clubs on a regular basis in the Jacksonville area.

He participates in the Florida Association of Single Square & Round Dance (FASSRD) activities, such as the Single-Rama (which Wilma just cancelled this year), Fuzzy Navel (held in Jekyll Island, GA), and he just returned from the National Single-Rama in Ohio.

Everyone who attended the State Convention last May will remember that Erv gave the invocation on Friday evening. Charlie & I have also asked him to open the Fall Festival this year with an invocation on Friday evening. We understand he does invocations and prayers for many other dance activities.

Erv's dance partner now -- and soon to be partner in life -- is Jan Laster. They will be married at a Lutheran Church on December 17th, 2005. He has already pledged his love for her in a gorgeous diamond ring. Our Congratulations and Best Wishes for many years of love and happiness to **Erv & Jan!**

Now we get back to February 1985 when Erv volunteered his service on a Kairos team which makes weekend ministry trips to Raiford Prison. As we talked I thought it must take a special

person to minister to prison inmates, deaf people, and persons in a mental hospital. But I am also firmly convinced that God chooses and calls those who will best carry out His plans for those particular persons.

Erv told Charlie and I that **Kairos** is not a Bible study, not for saving souls, not about recruiting for a church, IT IS about opening the hole in the wall so that God's love can pour through. Initially, I thought this strange, but the team is there to love, to give, to console and try to understand the individuals. Now, Erv says, if someone accepts Christ right there, they are joyful, but that is not their direct job.

Kairos, which means "God's Special Time," was started by a group of Jacksonville people going to Raiford in 1975. A group of about 65 lay people and pastors meet with about 50 inmates from Thursday evening until Sunday evening. They eat in the dining room with the inmates (don't think Erv was too impressed with the food), but they spend the nights in a motel nearby. The team members are there to Listen, Listen, Love, Love...not to do all the talking. "We don't preach," says Erv, "we show them they have a choice. We talk about some of our own experiences and how we got out of things by our trust in God."

Since 1999 studies reveal that of those who come out of prison, only 30% in Kairos programs return. Without Kairos, 80% return. The Director of Florida Prisons estimated that Kairos saved taxpayers \$833,000,000 between 1975 & 2000. With 23,000 volunteers, Kairos is active in 27 states, England, Australia, South Africa and Canada and actively serves 200 prisons. More than 110,000 incarcerated men and women have been introduced to the Christian community of Kairos. Current rate of introduction exceeds 14,000 per year.

In addition to Raiford, Erv also volunteers and serves at Columbia Correctional, Baker County Correctional,

and New River West.

I asked him why he was so ecstatic about the program. His reply was that, "People have to sometimes hit bottom before they turn to Christ...they are so needy, they need love & understanding before they can make a choice." He also said he found it rewarding to receive a hug from an inmate who explains how his life has changed because of his witness.

With the many, many hours Erv gives to the ministry needed in our prisons, I began to wonder where he finds the time to do anything else - or square dance. Then, I am reminded that it is the busy who take on the jobs, the working mother who heads the PTA, and so on. Because of Erv's loving and giving unselfishly to this program, he is making a definite contribution to his fellow man. Then I understood -- he has given of himself to these goals, God has given him the time and talent to go forward.

While it may not have been a lifetime of "giving", he has certainly made it his first priority. **Thanks, Erv**, for using your God given talents and your Christian service to mankind.

I don't know about you readers, but when I square up with Erv Oermann I will look at him a little differently than just a soft-spoken, kind, square dancing, gentleman friend!

The United Square Dancers of America (USDA) held their Annual Board of Directors Meeting on Wednesday, June 22, 2005, in Portland, Oregon. The meeting was well attended by delegates from the affiliates. Special guests attending were Don White, Vice Chairman of the National Executive Committee; Lee & Barbi Ashwill, General Chairman of the 54th NSDC in Portland; Wayne Bowman, General Chairman of the 56th NSDC in Charlotte, NC; Wayne & Mary Ann Kerr, Asst. General Chairman of the 57th NSDC in Wichita, KS; Dana Schirmer, Business Chairman for the 57th NSDC in Wichita and also the Asst. Executive Director in Training for CALLERLAB; Scott Phillips, Secretary of the International Association of Gay Square Dance Clubs; Cliff & June DeWitt, newly elected Secretary for the National Square Dance Campers Association; Jerry Reed, Executive Director for CALLERLAB; and last, but not least, Jim Maczko, representing ARTS (Alliance of Rounds, Traditional and Square Dance).

Charlie Holley, Central Region Vice President announced that USDA had an application for membership from the East Central Ohio/West Virginia Federation. This makes the 24th year in a row that USDA has accepted a new affiliate.

You will remember we asked for "finger food" recipes in our last issue. We are listing some we have received, but keep them coming. We'd like to have a file of recipes to turn over to your new Editor.



FUDGE MOCHA BROWNIE DELIGHT (from Jean Lee)

| 1 | Box Duncan Hines Walnut Brownie Mix (or your favorite brownie mix) | 1 | 8 ounce sour cream |
| 1 | 8 ounce Cool White | 1 | Miniature bottle of Kahluah |
| 1 | 12 ounce Cool Whip | 1 | Regular size Dove or Hersheys chocolate bar |
| 1 | Large box chocolate pudding | | |

Bake brownies as directed in spring form pan. Allow to cool.

Spread filling (12 ounce cool whip, dry pudding mix, sour cream, and 1/2 bottle of Kahluah) on top of cooled brownie.

Mix most of the 8 ounce cool whip with the rest of the Kahluah & spread this topping over the filling. Grate Chocolate bar over the top.

WALNUT BALLS (from Gerry Jesk)

- | | | | |
|-----|----------------------------------|---|-------------------------------|
| 1 | cup butter or substitute | 1 | teaspoon vanilla extract |
| 1/4 | cup granulated sugar or fructose | 2 | cups coarsely chopped walnuts |
| 2 | cups all purpose flour | | Powdered sugar |

Cream butter in large bowl of electric mixer. Add sugar and beat until light and fluffy. Sift in flour, add vanilla, and beat until smooth; stir in walnuts.

Form into balls about the size of a quarter, place on greased baking sheet, bake at 300 degrees 25-30 minutes. Watch to avoid overbaking. Cookies should not be brown. Let cool and roll in powdered sugar and store in airtight container. You can freeze. Makes 60-65 cookies (balls). Gerry says she got this from a 1972 Southern Living Cookbook.

CHEESY APPLE BAKE (from Peg Begley)

| 1 | Can apple slices (plain apples, not pie filling) | 1 | stick butter or margarine |
| | | 1 | cup sugar |
| 4 | ounces Velveta cheese | 3/4 | cup flour (all purpose) |

Melt cheese and butter in microwave. Add sugar and flour, mix well. Place apple slices and juice in bottom of a 8 x 8 square baking pan. Spread cheese/butter mix over apples. Bake at 350 degrees 30-40 minutes til top is golden brown. If recipe is doubled, use only 1 1/2 sticks butter and bake in 9x13 pan.

CHOCOLATE CHIP CHEESE BARS (from Maggie King)

Maggie is a member of our Church and brought these bars to Circle meeting. She agreed to share the recipe with me.

| 1 | tube (19 oz) refrigerated chocoate chip cookie dough | 1 | package (8 oz cream cheese), softened |
| 1/2 | cup sugar | 1 | egg |

Cut cookie dough in half. For crust, press half of the dough into the bottom of a greased 8" square baking pan. In a mixing bowl, beat cream cheese, sugar and egg until smooth. Spread over crust. Crumble remaining dough over top. Bake at 350 degrees 35-40 minutes or until toothpick inserted near center comes out clean. Cool on rack. Refrigerate leftovers. Maggie doubles this recipe and puts it in a 9 x 13 pan.

STITCHIN' TIME

By Val Newsome



We are using another article from the "Sew Finer In Carolina" Sewing Book picked up at the 47th National Square Dance Convention which was held in Charlotte, NC in June, 1998.

"FEET ARE NOT JUST FOR WALKING" -- There are hundreds of specialized presser feet on the market today. However, a select few are all that are needed to execute most sewing techniques. Some of these presser feet come with most sewing machines. Others can be purchased separately where machines or sewing supplies are sold.

Using a **SHIRRING FOOT** is the easiest way to make a ruffle. After attaching the foot to the sewing machine, adjust the top tension on the machine. The tighter the tension, the fuller the gathers will be. Also, different fabrics require different tension settings, so this takes practice. Remember that thinner fabrics will make tighter ruffles. For future reference, it is also a good idea to make a tension chart for each fabric type. (Most sewing machines do not come with a shirring foot -- they must be special ordered.)

A **RUFFLER** is an attachment usually found with older machines. This attachment is more complicated to use than a shirring foot and doesn't work well on all types of fabric. However, if you happen to have a commercial machine, it will work well. The secret to using a ruffler is not to stop and start

but sew continuously until the entire piece of fabric is gathered.

The **PINTUCK FOOT** is useful for twin-needle pintucks. This foot has several grooves on the bottom that act as guides and keep multiple rows of pintucks even and an equal distance apart.

A **BLIND HEM FOOT** is the secret to perfectly straight edge-stitching or top-stitching. Set the machine in the left needle position and sew with the edge of the fabric against the guide on the foot.

The **ROLLER FOOT** is great when sewing thick fabrics such as suede, furs, vinyls and leathers. It has a coating of Teflon which allows it to glide smoothly over the material. It keeps the fabric layers together, stretches it less, and ensures that the stitches will be consistent.

If a serger is not available, the **ROLLED HEM FOOT** or "baby hem" foot is a good investment. It guides the edge of the fabric and makes a fine hem that is no wider than 1/4 inch. The secret to using a rolled-hem foot is feeding the fabric at an angle.

A **WALKING FOOT** (even-feed foot) is great for sewing slippery or hard to handle fabrics. The foot works with the feed dogs to evenly feed the fabric under the needle, thus ensuring that both layers of fabric match at the end of the seam. It also helps maintain the match points when sewing stripes or plaids. It also makes sewing corduroy much easier.

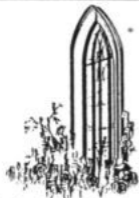

The first pumpkin pudding made by the Pilgrims involved picking the pumpkin, washing it, hollowing it out, filling it with cream or milk and baking it whole. This is what developed into pumpkin pie 50 years after that first Thanksgiving.

The pumpkin, a fruit, is a member of the Cucurbitaceae family with trailing vines. Squash and cucumbers belong, also.

The largest pumpkin pie was more than 5 feet in diameter and weighed more than 350 pounds. It used 80 pounds of cooked pumpkin, 36 pounds of sugar, 12 dozen eggs and took six hours to bake.

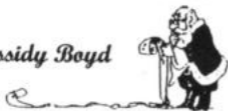
