PHILADELPHIA'S POPULARITY AS A CONVENTION CITY CAN BE ATTRIBUTED LARGELY TO THE VARIETY OF ATTRACTIONS AVAILABLE TO VISITORS, PARTICULARLY ITS HISTORIC BUILDINGS. A walking tour of those closely grouped around Independence Square can easily transport one back to colonial days for a rendezvous with America's renowned past. Independence Hall, most notable of our 18th century architectural achievement, is located in the center of the block on Chestnut St. between 5th & 6th Sts. Constructed in 1732, this imposing structure was the state house where the Declaration Of Independence was signed in 1776. Today it still stands as a monument to our nation's glory housing the Liberty Bell as well as other memorabilia. Just west of this edifice on the Square is Congress Hall where our early lawmakers convened from 1790 to 1800. East of this is Old City Hall (1789) where the first Supreme Court met. On Chestnut St. east of 5th stands the second U. S. Bank, formerly the Custom House from 1845 to 1934. Carpenter's Hall, where the first Continental Congress met in 1774, is situated east of this just beyond 4th St. After a short walk north on 2nd St. one turns east on Elfreth's Alley, reputed to be the oldest street in America in continuous use. So authentic is this fascinating block long restoration of an 18th century Philadelphia St. that one expects a colonial dame to come strolling by any minute. The houses are open to the public. Further along is No. 239 Arch St., the famous Betsy Ross House, where, according to tradition, the first American Flag was made. Numerous other relics and household items are also on display here. These are only a few of the places of interest in old Philadelphia which will be toured by square dancers who attend the "SWEET SIXTEEN" NATIONAL SQUARE DANCE CONVENTION on June 29, 30, and July 1, 1967.
