#### N.E.F.S.D.A. NEWS

The regular bi-monthly meeting of the NEFSDA was held Sunday, September 10, 1972 at the Robert Meyer Hotel with President, Bruce Yongue presiding.

The Treasurer's report indicated a current balance of \$993.44. Several clubs have not paid their dues to the Association and were urged to do so. Those clubs which have not paid their membership dues will not be listed on the program for the Fall Roundup.

George Ephrem, chairman for the Fall Roundup, reported that tickets are now available and

Advance tickets are \$3.50 per adult for both Friday and Saturday (\$4 at door); school children \$1.50 (\$2 at door). Friday only is \$1.50 per adult and \$.75 per child. Saturday only is \$2.50 per adult and \$1.25 for school children.

Program printing chairman for the Fall Roundup, Bettye Smith, urged all clubs desiring an ad in the program to please submit this to her no later than October 1. Letters soliciting these ads have been mailed to all member clubs.

Lou Connally and Len Kaufman reported that the advertising for the new joint classes was going very well. Our thanks to Edith Reisen for cueing the rounds for us at our last dance.

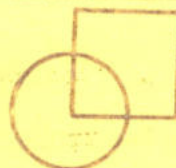
Tickets are on sale for the Fall Roundup. Be sure to get yours early. I'm told they are at "sale price" right now.
