We also wish to extend our appreciation to the "Angels" that attended class to help out.

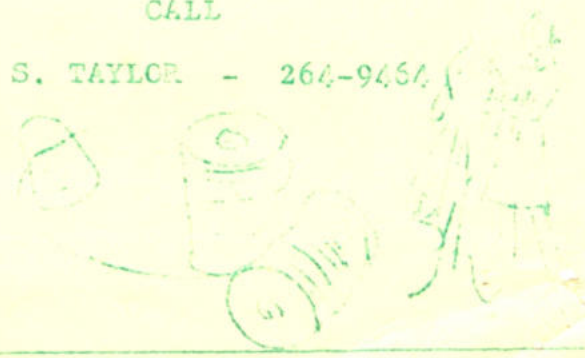

BANNER STEALING GUIDELINES

REQUIREMENTS:

1. A banner may be stolen by a minimum of 1 full square, in good standing as a club member, displaying club badges of the club they are representing & pay admission.
2. The banner can be stolen only on a regular club dancing night.
3. If 2 clubs appear on the same night to steal a banner from the same club the 1st visiting club to announce their intention to steal a banner to the host club Presidnet or the highest ranking officer present, will be allowed to steal the banner.
4. The banner may be retrieved by the owner club by observing requirement number 1.
5. A club cannot retrieve their banner & steal a club banner at the same time, even if more than the minimum visitors are present.
6. No recovering group can retrieve more than 1 banner per evening.

ETHICS:

1. A club will not steal a banner from another club more then 1 time every 6 months.
2. A club will not travel more than 60 miles to steal a banner, except by invitation of the intended host club.
3. A club having had its banner stolen will make every effort to recover stolen banner in a reasonably short time. If a club does not recover its banner in 6 months, the banner shall be returned to the owner club.
4. If a banner is stolen, the officials of the host club should be notified of the date, time & place the visiting club has its regular dances.
5. A club will not have more than 1 travel banner.
6. If a traveling banner has been stolen, the club will not display its club banner, except at a special dance.
7. A club cannot steal a banner or retrieve its banner when their club caller is a guest caller of the club they are visiting.
8. If a large group is traveling to steal a banner it is strongly recommended that the host club is notified. (*A recommended time is at least 3 days prior to night of dance, which gives the host club ample time, if refreshments are being served, to make preparations for the extra number of guests.)

EDITORS NOTE: These Banner Stealing guidelines were voted on at NEFSDA Meeting; & approved by the majority of clubs attending, which means that if you are a member club of NEFSDA, you should be abiding by these guidelines. We have had numerous calls on Banner Stealing & mostly complaints because clubs are not following or do not know what the guidelines mean. If you need copies, we will provide your club with them. We will all have better times banner stealing if we ALL follow the same rules! **HAPPY BANNER STEALING!**

CALLERLAB

The first CALLERLAB Convention held in St. Louis, Missouri in 1974 recognized the need to control the steady flow of new experimental choreographic figures, (many poorly constructed). This was causing considerable consternation among callers & dancers alike. To remedy the problem, CALLERLAB formed an Experimental Basic Selection committee, consisting of 20 members, representing all areas of North America. It has since been expanded to its current membership of 50. Jack Lasry of Florida served as the first chairman of this newly formed committee that was charged with reviewing the vast amount of experimental ideas for quality, body flow & possible usage in the mainstream plateau of square dance choreography. The purpose of the CALLERLAB quarterly experimental selections committee was to provide every caller in the mainstream dance plateau an opportunity to teach dancers worthwhile experimental figures on a limited basis without overwhelming them with a constant flow of new figures at every dance. In addition, with every caller teaching the same quarterly experimental figures at the same time, dancers all over the world would be learning & dancing the same new material. The universal acceptance of this CALLERLAB idea has made it possible for dancers from any section of the nation or from another part of the world, to visit dances at the mainstream plateau & be able to dance with ease & comfort. Al Brundage of Connecticut is the current chairman of the Quarterly Experimental Selection committee replacing Jack Lasry, who is now the CALLERLAB Chairman.

The continued growth of square dance choreography during the past several years has prompted CALLERLAB to take positive steps to standardize & designate various plateaus of square dance basics that dancers should know in order to be knowledgeable participants in this recreational activity. During the past 4 years Callerlab has tackled this problem at their annual conventions & have now formulated a plateau system of basics that can be utilized by callers, square dance clubs, workshops, jamborees, festivals & convention committees to provide dancers with accurate information as to the knowledge required to be able to dance without the fear of being unable to follow the calls.

The current CALLERLAB plateaus of square dancing knowledge are listed as follows:

Basic Program includes all figures from 1-38 in the approved 1977 convention list of mainstream basics.

Extended Basic Program includes all figures from 1-54.

Mainstream Program consists of all figures from 1-68. The CALLERLAB approved Mainstream experimental figures may be used at dances advertised as Mainstream.

Mainstream Plus 1 program dancers should have a working knowledge of the first 3 plateaus plus; Roll (as an extension), Cloverflow, Dixie Grand, Pair Off, Peel the Top, Single Circle to a Wave, Spin Chain the Gears, Substitute, Tea Cup Chain & variations, Triple Scoot, Triple Trade & Turn & Left Thru.

MAINSTREAM PLUS 2 plateau was identified for a 1 year trial period & includes; All Eight Spin the Top, All Eight Swing Thru, Curley Cross, Explode the Wave, Follow Your Neighbor, Relay the Deucey, Remake the Thar, Swap Around, Trade the Wave, Checkmate, Diamond Circulate & Flip the Diamond.

In addition, CALLERLAB members recognized that there are also 3 plateaus of dancing above the Mainstream Plus 2 program & these plateaus have been designated as Advanced Level, Basic Challenge Level & the Extended Challenge Level.

Callers active in the advanced phase of square dance choreography are presently developing a list of calls for the above plateaus.

It should be noted that all programs identified by CALLERLAB can include the all position concept as well as the standard position or teaching positions. With the CALLERLAB suggested plateau system of square dancing all persons interested in this activity should be able to find a place to dance. Finally, it is now possible for square dance clubs, callers & leaders in charge of workshops, square dance weekends, jamborees, festivals & conventions to practice "truth in advertising" when promoting their events.

For the 4th quarter of 1977 the CALLERLAB Quarterly Selection Committee has voted NO NEW MOVEMENTS. This would be for the period covering months Oct., Nov. & Dec., 1977.

There was a strong feeling among many committee members that the 3rd Quarter selections of Follow Your Neighbor & Follow Your Neighbor & Spread have not been workshopped sufficiently at Mainstream Club Level since they came during the summer months when there is a minimum of work-shop activity. The recommendation of the committee is that these 2 movements continue to be workshopped & reviewed.

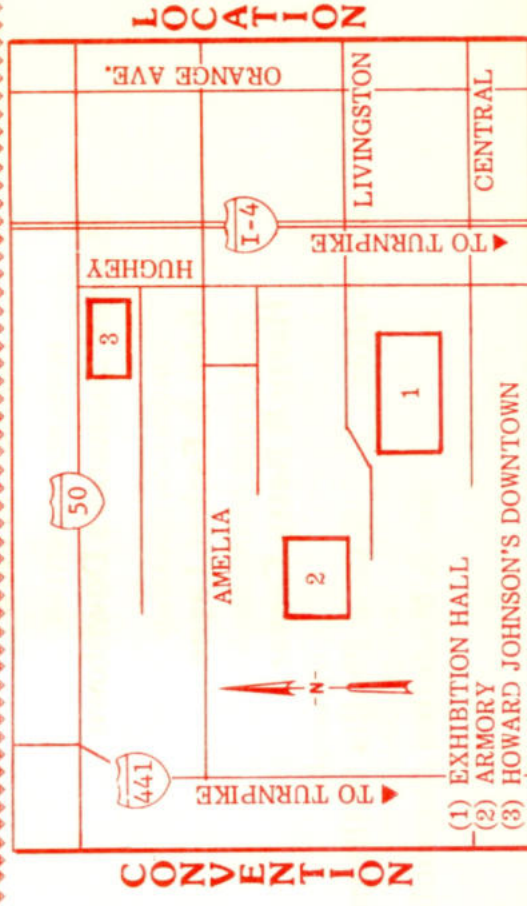
