CALLERLAB

The International Association
of Square Dance Callers

For the quarter beginning October 1, 1982, CALLERLAB is pleased to announce the selection of one Mainstream Quarterly Selection. The selection is not a new movement as such but one which offers some interest to the Mainstream dancer. The move was first introduced before the call Pass the Ocean was written and the use of Pass the Ocean makes the figure easier for the dancers to complete. The author is Ross Crispino and the figure is GRAND SPIN.

GRAND SPIN by Ross Crispino

Starting Formation - Static Square.

Heads Part - Pass the Ocean, Spin the Top, Star Thru, step forward and California Twirl at the sides of the square to become new sides.

Sides Part - Face your partner and back away (as in Grand Square take three steps and turn on fourth step). Turn in and walk towards your opposite and do a Do Sa Do. Star Thru with that person and become the new heads.

Each part takes 16 beats to complete and each dancer will do each part twice to complete the figure.

Comment: The beauty of this figure is the dancing to the music. This figure cannot be rushed and if the dancers take shortcuts, the beauty will be lost. When using this with a group for the first time, stress the Heads part and then the Sides part and remind the dancers that each person will do each part.

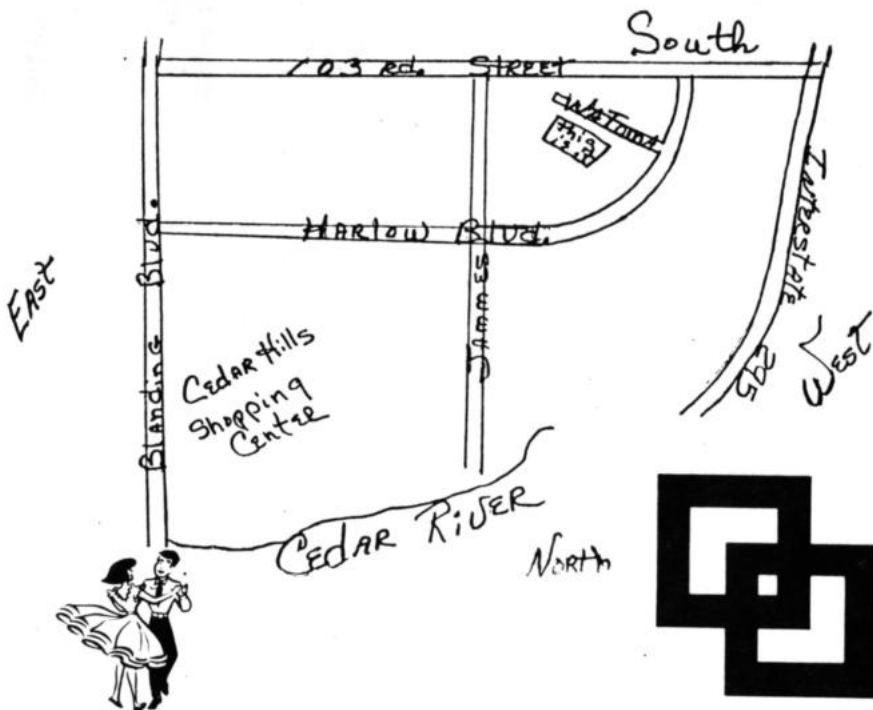

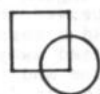

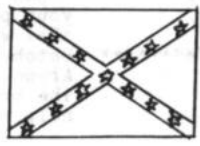

CALLERLAB

The International Association
of Square Dance Callers

At the Reno CALLERLAB Convention, the membership of CALLERLAB voted to establish a new program called the Plus Quarterly Selection (PQS). This program is aimed at the Plus Program clubs and dancers who desire to expand their dancing to a limited degree but who do not choose to enter into a more elaborate program. One of the purposes was that a PQS selection committee could help provide guidance to callers to help screen material that might be suitable for inclusion at workshops for Plus Programs.

The PQS program is designed to allow callers and dancers to dance some new material that is suited to the Plus Programs of dancing. However, not all clubs nor all dancers will desire this program. This PQS program is written in terms that presuppose a working knowledge of the Plus Programs. For instance, the two calls selected for this initial offering include terminology of Track II as well as Diamonds.

PLEASE NOTE: There is no implied pressure by CALLERLAB that any caller or club should use this material if the group is not ready for it. Caller judgment is the key to the appropriateness of this material. The definitions and timing of these descriptions. The dancing examples are for your information and guidance and are not the only ones to be used during this quarter or during workshops for these calls.

This PQS program will operate under similar guidelines to the Mainstream QS Program now in effect. Jerry Schatzer heads up this active CALLERLAB Committee consisting of approximately 100 callers using the PLUS Programs. Any comments may be directed to the CALLERLAB office or directly to Jerry Schatzer. His address is: Jerry Schatzer 1203 N. Sweetzer Ave. Los Angeles, CA 90068.

TRACK TO A DIAMOND (8 beats)

From columns, the #1 and #2 dancers do a Track II. Each of these dancers becomes one "point" of the final twin diamonds. At the same time, the #3 and #4 dancers Single File Circulate once (to a momentary box of four) then Cast Off 3/4 forming an ocean wave. Movement ends in parallel, center-to-center diamonds.

ZING (4 beats)

Starting from a DPT, completed DPT, or Box Circulate formation, the leaders in each foursome do a Zoom 3/4 (270°), as the trailers step forward into the vacated spot, then turn a quarter to face the center of the foursome. Movement ends in facing couples.

CLUB MEMBERS SUPPORT YOUR CLUB LESSONS

Much has been said by many people for many years about Club members supporting their Club lessons. This is an important enough of an issue to be repeated time and time again.

Most of our Callers welcome and encourage their Club members to be very active in the support of their lessons.

There are some basic rules which we should adhere to very religiously while supporting the lessons and they are:

1. NEVER let a New Dancer miss the chance of meeting and getting to know YOU. Make a special effort each meeting night to greet each and every New Dancer with a warm handshake and a friendly smile.

2. NEVER let a New Dancer sit out a tip. Always ask, prior to the music starting, if you may have the pleasure of their company for the next tip.

3. DON'T dance with the same persons or in the same square each time. Dance with all of the New Dancers in different positions and in different areas of your hall.

4. REMEMBER - There is only ONE INSTRUCTOR and that is your CALLER. DO NOT attempt to answer any questions or give any instructions during the tip. Answer questions only after the Caller has dismissed the squares and then answer only the questions you are competent in answering, otherwise take the New Dancer and his questions to your Caller and ask him to answer and/or demonstrate as necessary.

5. DON'T congregate in a corner with your club members. Mix with the New Dancers, visit with them, bring them into your conversations, make them feel they are important to you and your Club.

6. IF you have refreshments during or after your lessons, make sure the New Dancers are AWARE of this and that they are YOUR GUESTS OF HONOR. Help them relax, sit down with them, find out who they are, what they do for a living what are their hobbies. LET THEM know that you are sincerely interested in them.

7. SET EXAMPLES for the New Dancers.

a. Be attentive to the Caller. Do exactly as he says, no more, no less. NO short cuts, no fancy steps or swings.

b. Be clean, wear your Foo-Foo power and Gentlemen, PLEASE your long-sleeve shirts.

c. Remember you were once a New Dancer, DON'T let your disappointment show when someone in your square does not do as well as you think they should.

d. BE prompt to square up with your New Dancer partner when the music starts and NEVER-NEVER let your Caller have to waste valuable instruction time asking for help in filling a square.

Maybe if each of us would try a little harder at practicing the above mentioned basics we could increase the growth of our HOBBY much more quickly.

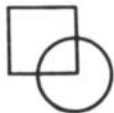

NEW DANCERS

Dance with others even though you came with friends, break up after a dance or two. Get acquainted with others. Don't continue to hold a place in the square for a friend, but accept the first couple that offers to join you. Who knows, you may end up with the "Queen of the Ball" or the "Grown Prince". Don't forget that shower or bath AND that bottle of deodorant. Hoedown is hot work and it is only good taste to make sure that you don't offend.

Show your enjoyment by the way you dance. Swing the girls as though you enjoyed it. Lead her. Start her off on each figure, but please don't push. There are lots of dancers who resent your help in this way and this doesn't increase your popularity. When your set has broken down, men just go back home and take your lady with you. Overlook the mistakes. Your neighbour feels badly enough about lousing up the set without you adding to his misery. Remember, a smile can go a long way.

A habit that learners (not only learners) get into is holding on too tightly to arms and hands. This comes about by not being sure of your moves. You should only touch hands. If you hold on too tightly you could give your partner a very badly sprained muscle or arm. This has been known to happen and we are sure that none of you would like to be responsible for such a happening. So, NOT TIGHT GRIPS!

There is also a tendency on the part of newer dancers, who on hearing one call while they are executing another, cuts the first one short. The result, of course is that you will be out of position and in all probability cause a square to break down. Remember where you should be at the beginning and ending of each call. Failing to face the correct direction at the end of a call may put you out of position for the next call.

Don't take square dancing too seriously (yours or others). Mistakes are half the fun of dancing provided you don't make too many mistakes of the same kind. If someone "goofs" just laugh it off and keep pitching. Don't grumble and gripe if a less capable couple fills in your set. Take whatever comes gladly and willingly and do your best to have fun with them. Rudeness certainly has no place in square dancing, but tolerance and kindness rank high.

BEGINNERS, remember you are not the only ones who make mistakes, so don't feel too badly. MANY senior dancers make the mistakes usually only beginners are thought to make. The queer way of forgetting which is your left and right comes over us all some time or the other, no matter how long we've been dancing. Many other mistakes are made, too. Try watching when a senior tip is being done. The only thing is that most senior dancers know how to cover up their mistakes and to you it likely looks as though they are doing to all perfectly. Not always!

BANNER STEALING GUIDELINES

REQUIREMENTS:

1. A banner may be stolen by a minimum of one full square, in good standing as club members, displaying club badges of the club they are representing and paying admission.
2. The banner can be stolen only on a regular club dance night.
3. If two clubs appear on the same night to steal a banner, the first visiting club to announce their intention to steal the banner to the host club President or the highest ranking office present will be allowed to steal the banner.
4. The banner may be retrieved by the owner club by observing requirement #1.
5. A club cannot retrieve their banner and steal a club banner at the same time, even if more than the minimum visitors are present.

ETHICS:

1. A club will not steal a banner from another club more than one time every six months.
2. A club will not travel more than 60 miles to steal a banner except by invitation of the intended host club.
3. A club having had its banner stolen will make every effort to recover stolen banner in a reasonably short time. If a club does not recover its banner in six months, the banner will be returned to the owner club.
4. If a banner is stolen, the officials of the host club should be notified of the date, time, and place the visiting club has its regular dances.
5. A club will not have more than one traveling banner.
6. If a traveling banner has been stolen, the club will not display its club banner except at a special dance.
7. A club cannot steal a banner or retrieve its banner when their club caller is a guest caller of the club they are visiting.
8. If a large group is traveling to steal a banner, it is strongly recommended that the host club be notified. A recommended time is at least three days prior to night of dance which gives the host club ample time to make preparations for the extra number of guests.

NOTE:

These Banner Stealing Guidelines were voted on at a NEFSDA Meeting and approved by the majority of clubs attending. If you are a member club of NEFSDA, you should be abiding by these guidelines. We will all have better times banner stealing if everyone follows the same rules.
