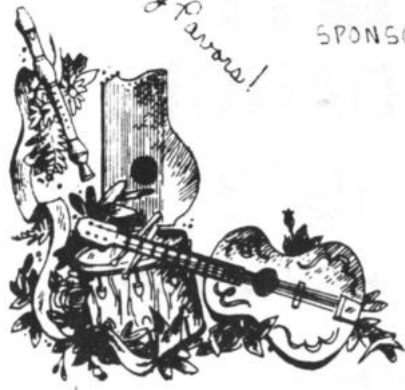

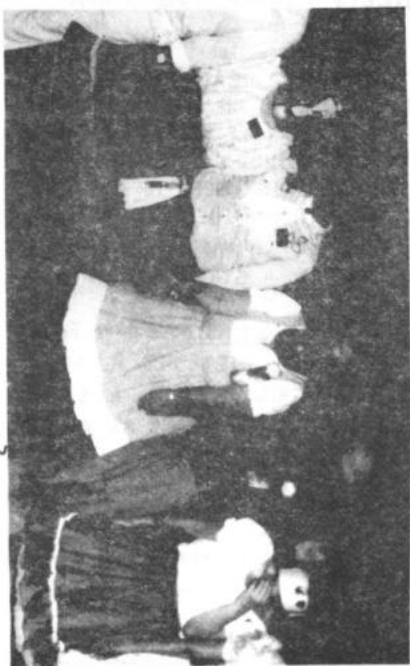

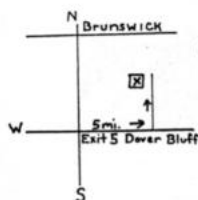

AN OPEN LETTER:

This is written to put before the Square Dance public the sad situation of we hundreds of women who have no male partner and are being kept from this healthy reasonable, fun pastime. Always held in some respectable hall or Church where we are not afraid to go alone at night.

There are at least three women to every man of our age group. Many were square dancers of long standing and at the loss of our husbands we lost also the chance to dance as there are so few men and they mostly have their own partner.

At the learners class we can pair off with another lonely woman and dance but as soon as the beginning class ends we are forced to go no further. Many of us go and just sit and wait, and hope, and eventually the memories and knowing that it is all ended for you makes you quit coming.

All the callers have seen this happen over and over. Some, like the understanding and very popular, Frank Clements are saddened to see so many sit almost all the dances out and stop trying to join in.

I have an idea that if ALL the clubs formed a Stag Gal Square, teaching four of the women to dance the male parts. This would mean they must stay with the same role and wear slacks to identify themselves.

When the classes go on to advanced clubs and enjoy the comradery that is so much fun we could go too, and dance with their Stag Gals. We would have a status of our own and not be looked on as a fifth wheel. Eventually it would be an accepted thing and many who, like myself, have lost our partners could add so much to any club. The women would naturally prefer the womens role but better the learning and staying with the mens part, than not dancing at all.

I went to the meeting of the club representatives (NEPSDA) to propose this and was sympathetically received. The Merry Mavericks Square Dance Club, with Bobbie Lam president has agreed to try to start an all girl set and Frank Clements is starting lessons on Sept. 19th. at the Lions Club, 1240 McDuff. Mr. Clements who is encouraging me in this, has said he will gladly give we lonely women a chance of having a status of our own and participate with dignity.

So come on gals and lets show these clubs we can bring a lot more revenue to them and contribute to the fun and future of this rapidly growing pastime.

It is the only real fun enjoyment for everyone in Jax. That is within our financial reach of everyone.
