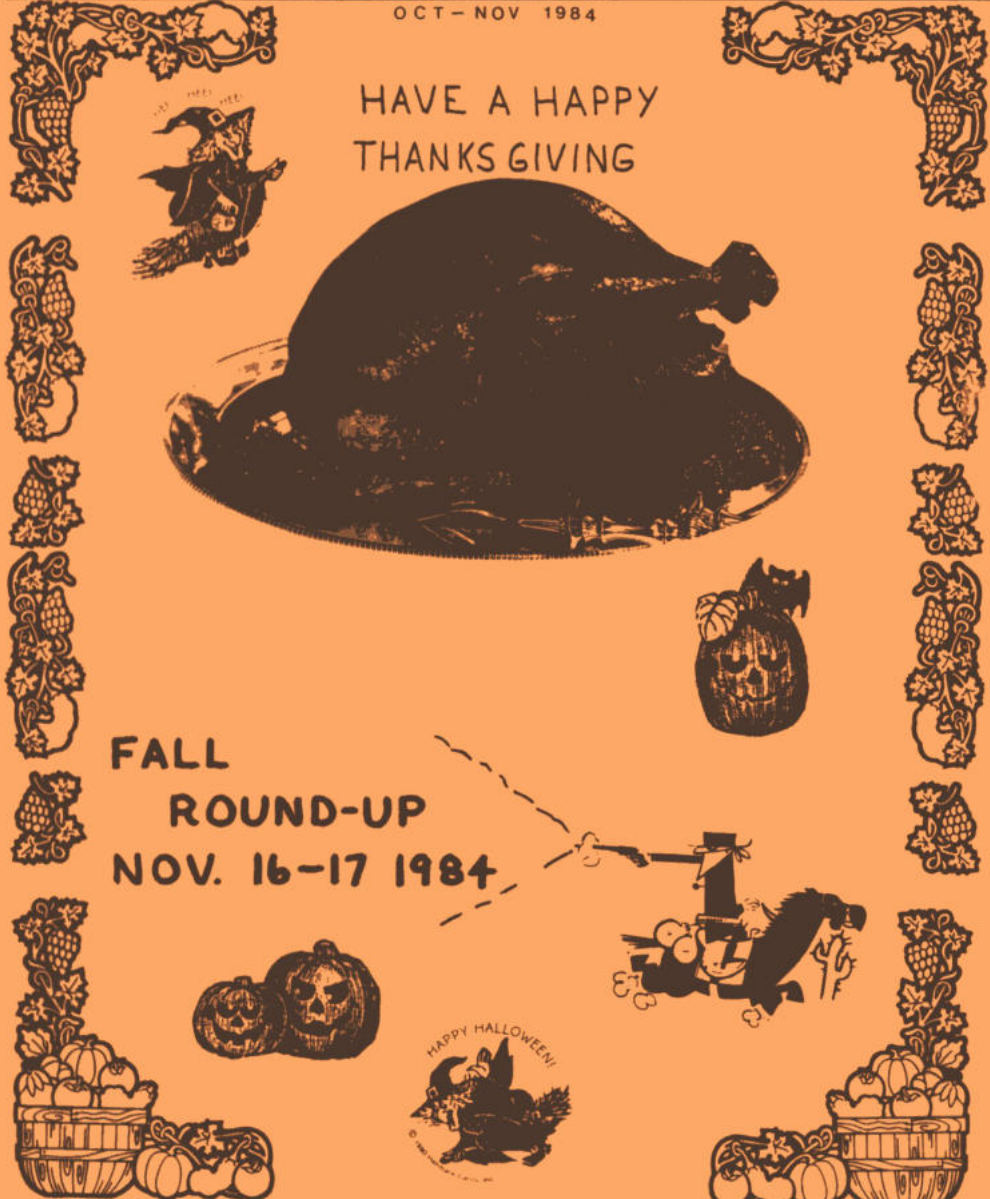

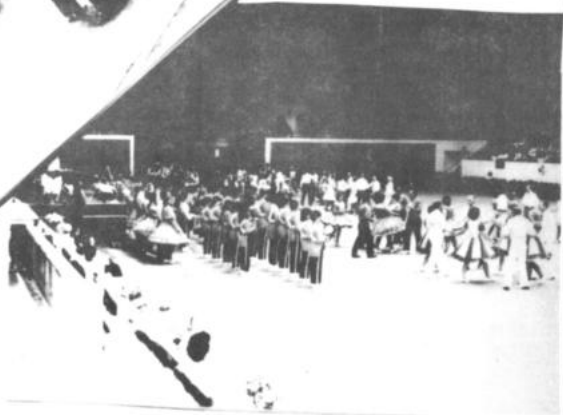
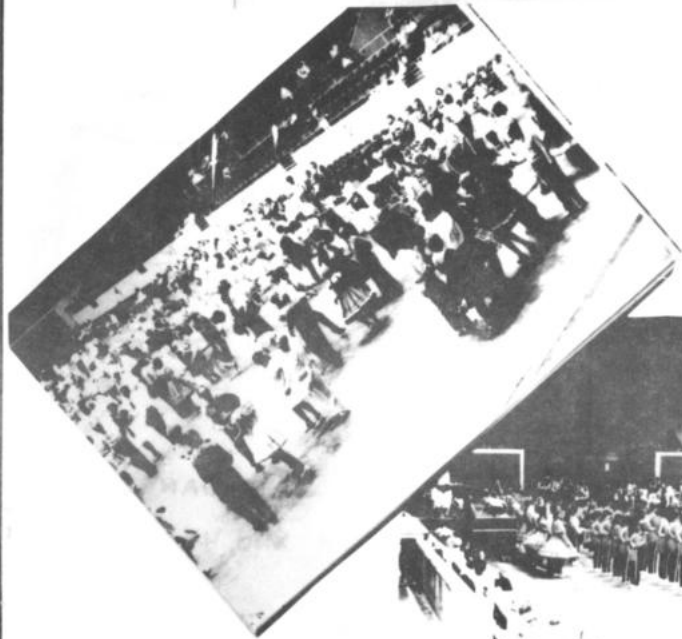

CALLER STRESS

(The following is an excerpt from an article published in "Square Dancing", September, 1984. We thought it might be interesting for dancers to look at calling from a caller's viewpoint.)

Some Thoughts on Stress and the Part it Plays in Everyday Calling

(It never was easy holding down a full-time job then rushing home, grabbing a quick bit, a fast shower and hurrying off to the dance. Several times a week this was our standard procedure, and although we tried to look fresh and ready for that night's program, we're relatively certain some of our daytime pressures came across through the microphone.)

(It had never happened before, but I was in the middle of class instruction and certain dancers were beginning to get to me. That same character was still turning the wrong way on a right and left thru. For some reason I managed to lose my cool. I realized that my patience was running thin - not just for this one individual, but for the whole idea of bringing new people - folks who knew nothing about square dancing - into a club level of dancing in a relatively few lessons.)

(It was a nightmare that evening. The kids were unusually noisy all during dinner and Elizabeth's timing by bringing the tax bill to the table was the crowning blow. The pressure just seemed to build as we drove to the dance. Looking back on it now I realize both of us had reached a pressure point. She had long since given up the idea that the two of us would be doing any dancing and the idea of square dancing being fun had given way to the realization that our whole lifestyle had changed. Calling, which started out as a pleasant lark was now a necessity. The extra carpeting and the new car had come about through the income I derived from classes and clubs. It was impossible to let go. The whole idea of calling wasn't the same fun project it had started out to be.)

The above are a few of the comments overheard made by callers and teachers who have found the rigors of calling to be somewhat overwhelming. The amateur caller of years ago memorized a few calls, blundered, perhaps, through teaching the necessary six lessons which were required for the new dancer, and managed to laugh off the flubs. Today, things have changed. Calling has become a science. While goofing in the middle of a call may not be unusual, it tends to mark the person as something less than a competent caller.

Where would square dancing be today without its great storehouse of modern electronics? And yet what can cause more concern than the power going out in a hall or a microphone cable working loose or a speaker cone working loose from its component parts?

While it's true that square dancing today would be virtually impossible without the convenience of the automobile, still how much a contributor to our stress is the four-wheel beast that tends to run out of gas, get a flat tire or lose its headlights? "It was making rather disconcerting noises as we drove the 20 miles to the dance, but we arrived safely and on time. But all during the evening when I should have been concentrating on the program and the happiness of our dancers, guess what I was thinking of? That's right. How were we to get home after the dance?" Worry, worry, worry.

Is there a solution to the problem of stress - a problem that, in one way or another, besets all callers/teachers at one time or another? Chances are any suggestions will sound oversimplified. "Don't take calling too seriously." "Don't overextend your calling." "Save a good portion of your time just to be a dancer, to relax, and SAVE TIME in your life to enjoy your home, your wife and your family."

CHECK YOURSELF

That's easy for you to say! But how do you do it? How can you take calling less seriously when the curriculum which must be learned today is loaded with technicalities? A caller

CLUB MEMBERS SUPPORT YOUR CLUB LESSONS

Much has been said by many people for many years about Club members supporting their Club lessons. This is an important enough of an issue to be repeated time and time again.

Most of our Callers welcome and encourage their Club members to be very active in the support of their lessons.

There are some basic rules which we should adhere to very religiously while supporting the lessons and they are:

1. NEVER let a New Dancer miss the chance of meeting and getting to know YOU. Make a special effort each meeting night to greet each and every New Dancer with a warm handshake and a friendly smile.

2. NEVER let a New Dancer sit out a tip. Always ask, prior to the music starting, if you may have the pleasure of their company for the next tip.

3. DON'T dance with the same persons or in the same square each time. Dance with all of the New Dancers in different positions and in different areas of your hall.

4. REMEMBER - There is only ONE INSTRUCTOR and that is your CALLER. DO NOT attempt to answer any questions or give any instructions during the tip. Answer questions only after the Caller has dismissed the squares and then answer only the questions you are competent in answering, otherwise take the New Dancer and his questions to your Caller and ask him to answer and/or demonstrate as necessary.

5. DON'T congregate in a corner with your club members. Mix with the New Dancers, visit with them, bring them into your conversations, make them feel they are important to you and your Club.

6. IF you have refreshments during or after your lessons, make sure the New Dancers are AWARE of this and that they are YOUR GUESTS OF HONOR. Help them relax, sit down with them, find out who they are, what they do for a living what are their hobbies. LET THEM know that you are sincerely interested in them.

7. SET EXAMPLES for the New Dancers.

a. Be attentive to the Caller. Do exactly as he says, no more, no less. NO short cuts, no fancy steps or swings.

b. Be clean, wear your Foo-Foo power and Gentlemen, PLEASE your long-sleeve shirts.

c. Remember you were once a New Dancer, DON'T let your disappointment show when someone in your square does not do as well as you think they should.

d. BE prompt to square up with your New Dancer partner when the music starts and NEVER-NEVER let your Caller have to waste valuable instruction time asking for help in filling a square.

Maybe if each of us would try a little harder at practicing the above mentioned basics we could increase the growth of our HOBBY much more quickly.

"If you're going to have 30,000 visitors, we don't see how you can get more ideal ones than those attending the 33rd National Square Dance Convention which started Thursday and ends Saturday. . ."

"A clean bunch, 30,000 people engaged in innocent and wholesome fun -- while spending a great deal of money for lodging and meals. From what we've seen so far, we hereby issue an invitation to the square, line round and contra dancers who are among us. Come back! Hold all your conventions here!"

(Somebody send a copy of this to Jake, since the Northeast doesn't seem to be getting much response to its efforts to have the convention center built to be able to accommodate our hobbies!)

Another, was a letter to the Editor, from "A Weary Office Worker":

"I personally don't know much about square dancing, but there was one distinct feature that I noticed about all the people I saw walk by me. They all looked happy, many of them walking hand in hand with their "partner". They seemed proud to be able to share with the public the spirit and excitement that must accompany their dancing.

"As I left Harborplace to walk to my car, my entire mood had changed. . ."

What's more, 18 square dancers were invited to the White House to meet President Reagan. Pictures were taken, they presented the President with the Baltimore cookbook, souvenir cap and belt buckle, and the Convention Program Book. "Then Jennie Zusauskas asks if she might give the President a Yellow Rock on behalf of all the ladies present. When he inquires as to what a yellow rock is, she demonstrates rather than explaining! The cameras click madly."

34th National Square Dance Convention - Alabama Bound

So far the 34th has 5,585 registered, with 332 from FLORIDA! Highest is Michigan with 468, but Florida is SECOND!

who accepts the responsibility of calling is told that for every two-hour dance he calls he must spend twice that amount of time in preparation. To call several dances a week he must spend anywhere from six to eight hours in preparation. It just doesn't seem to make sense.

The question is: Just how big a role do you expect square dance calling to play in your life? This isn't something you just ask yourself, it must be worked out as a team. You and your partner together. The caller whose children have left the nest is in a much different position than the young caller with school-age children and a wife who needs to get out of the house in a while to enjoy herself. The money derived from calling can be might appealing. On the other hand, consider the value after eight hours at the office or plant, plus traveling, and THEN a couple of hours squeezed in for program planning. Two full-time jobs seems to be just too much. The obvious solution - become a full-time caller. Here's where the danger signals begin to wave. Cut off the regular job with its built-in dependability of income, insurance and other benefits and you are suddenly tied to a calling life which could easily become a JOB rather than an enjoyable avocation.

Solutions to problems such as this aren't easy. Every caller is different and when trying to decide how much or how little he or she can handle, there is a need to look at the possible involvement of stress. Ask yourself "How important is being a caller to me?" If the answer is "More important than anything in the world," then the answer is simple. However, if peace in the family means setting goals a little less demanding, if being satisfied with doing one's best without a commitment to doing nothing but calling, then some adjustment is necessary. Being the person in the middle can be richly rewarding, not just in money but in satisfaction. However, the less responsibility, the fewer the anxieties, the less the stress. If you're looking for the best of both worlds, some possible goals are:

Put family **FIRST**.

Try to have a normal life, allowing for non-dancing friends and non-dancing activities.

Decide how much square dance calling and teaching you will allow for yourself. Avoid building your personal economy on your income from calling.

Make a vow to yourself and your spouse that if square dancing ever gets to the place where it begins to break up a happy relationship, or you find yourself giving in to temptations that may possibly run contrary to the best interests of square dancing, that you will get out.

Keep it simple. Keep it folk. Do everything you can to help rid the activity of stress and pressure.

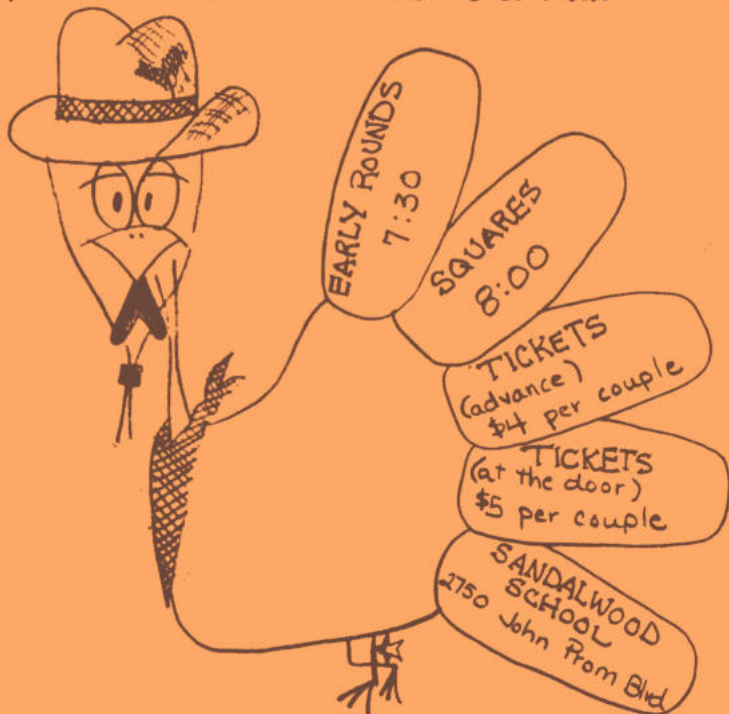
