Indianapolis is off to a fast start with almost 10,000 registered following the Birmingham Convention—with more coming daily. The earlier you register, the better your choice of housing.

There are plenty of hotels and motels in Indianapolis—enough to house a 40,000 Convention with no more than a twenty-minute travel time to the farthest unit—all with easy access to the Convention Center and Hoosier Dome.

Indianapolis R/V site is at the Indiana State Fairgrounds, about 8 miles from the Convention Center. Up to 2000 sites are available—1800 with electric hook-ups—special area for units with generators.

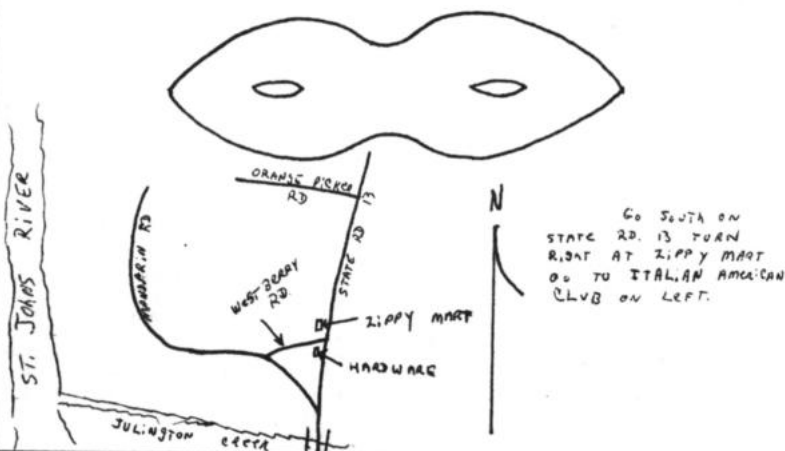

MANDARIN MARAUDERS

MODERN AMERICAN SQUARE DANCING IS AMERICA'S NATIONAL FOLK DANCE

Well over six million people participate in a social activity characterized by music, exercise and good fun

What is Modern American Square Dancing?

Four couples form a "square" and dance a pattern of figures as described by the caller. The dance keeps pace with current pop and country music. Movements are smooth, rhythmic, graceful and easy to learn. The old Barn Dance has been modernized.

What kind of people square dance?

People of all ages and walks of life who are interested in good, clean fellowship and fun. Instead of husbands and wives going separate ways, here is an activity geared to bring couples closer together. Square dancing is also an excellent family activity.

But I'm a single

Both the adult single dancer and teenagers are encouraged to join the activity and learn to dance. We encourage dancing partners since square dancing is a couple activity.

But I never danced before

If you can walk to music, you can learn to square dance. Many of today's experienced dancers had never been on a dance floor prior to learning to square dance.

How expensive is it?

An evening dance program generally costs between \$2.00 to \$2.50 per person.

How do I dress?

Square dancers dress first for comfort and second for show. For a start, the ladies should wear a full skirt and low heeled shoes. For the men, a long sleeve shirt is a must. Dressing for the dance is part of the fun and as you progress, you may desire to get slightly more elaborate clothing.

Am I too old(young) to square dance?

Age is no barrier to square dancers. While most dancers are between the ages of 20 and 70, teenagers may "square up" with 80 year olds.

How can I learn to square dance?

Square dancing requires lessons to learn the basic movements of the dancing of today. These lessons are dances which progress from the simple to the complex.

After the lessons-what?

There are thousands of square dance clubs across the United States and Canada. Generally you can dance any night of the week if you are willing to travel some distance. After lessons, you can dance anywhere in the world and attend square dance weekends and festivals for the time of your life. Every June, a National Square Dance Convention is held with over 20,000 dancers attending each year.

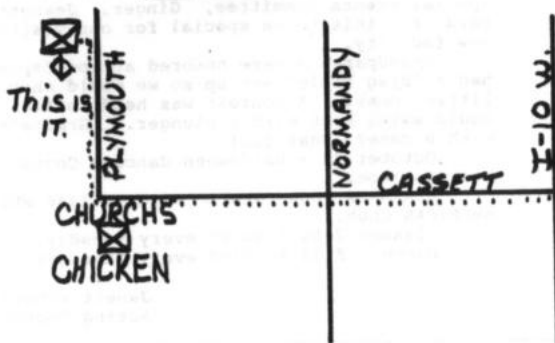

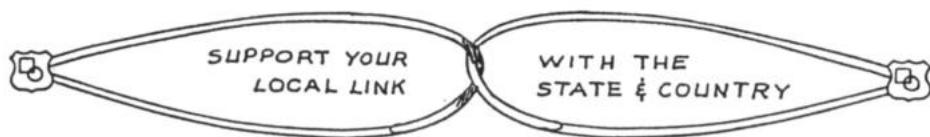

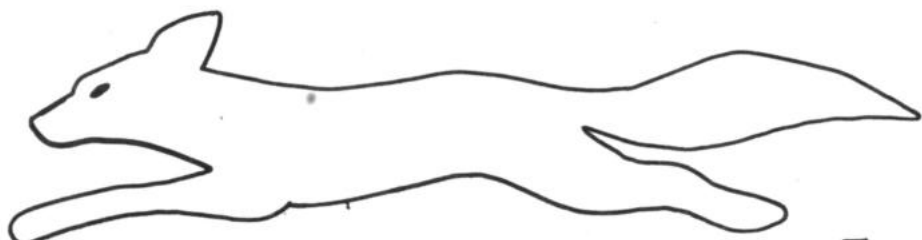
