SQUARE DANCER'S INSURANCE PROGRAM:

IT'S TIME FOR ALL NEFSARDA SQUARE DANCE CLUBS TO START MAKING PLANS TO PARTICIPATE IN THE USDA INSURANCE PROGRAM.

As in the past years the program begins on 1 January and the coverage and cost remain the same, that is, \$1,000,000 Liability plus Medical Payments coverage at a cost of \$1.85 per dancer.

There have been incidents at Jacksonville square dances recently which point out all too clearly that every club should not pass up this very inexpensive coverage.

So, now is the time for each club to discuss this important issue and be ready to make application during the month of November or early December. I will have application forms and more detailed information to pass out at the November meeting of NEFSARDA.

Please be sure that your club delegate or an alternate is present at this meeting.

CALLER'S CORNER: WHY HAVE A BASIC 45 PROGRAM?

According to a National Poll taken by the American Square Magazine of callers and instructors across the U.S., all figure between a 40-50% drop-out rate for a new mainstream class. This represents half of the dancers are never able to enjoy "Our Favorite Hobby". This problem is nationwide and everyone is trying to figure out why!! If square dancing is so much "FUN", why are over half of the people dropping out?

It has been noted that there are many reasons for the drop-out rate and there is no simple solution to the problem. Callerlab has put some of the best minds in the dance field on this problem and the only answer they can agree on is to establish a level where a person, for one reason or another, can learn at an easy pace and a shorter time frame. If a person is having difficulty in a "Mainstream" class or has been forced to miss several classes and is in danger of being "Dropped", that person has the opportunity to remain in the Square Dance Program, but, at a different level. Since all of us must pass through the Basic 45 movements on our way to the higher levels, why not have a club that stops at that level. Not only would this level retain the dancers that would have been lost to our activity, but, could also be the holding pool for next year's classes!!

The Basic 45 Level is much more interesting than the Recreational or One Night Party Levels, and a resting step on the ladder to the other levels of dancing. Some people may not want to progress higher or may not have the time for the additional classes, but, want to be able to enjoy the Fellowship of our Dancing Community. This is the natural place for them to dance until they can go higher.

One of the biggest problem areas is the shortage of men dancers to the women who want to dance. This is the ideal level for mixed squares as none of the more complicated movements are used. This is also the ideal entry point for a new Caller to learn the trade. For the Caller as well as the Dancer, the building blocks for square dancing is in Basic Program. For these reasons, Callerlab has recommended that there be at least one Basic 45 Club for every three upper level clubs!!!

The success of the Basic 45 Program is in the hands of the "Upper" level clubs in the square dance community. If you treat the Basic dancers as "Old Foggies" or those that couldn't make the grade, you will wipe out the desire for those people to remain in the activity. I have never heard anyone knock the Elementary School system, the Junior or Senior High systems and believe that everyone should be in College!! Yet, this is exactly what we do to someone in the Basic Program. When we plan our Dances we set the level and anyone that can't do it should not get in our square. Please don't misunderstand me, I do not believe that there should not be higher levels of dance, however, I do believe that a dance for a "special

occasion" should be programmed for all of the levels of dance with the tips being "announced" tips. This being the case, remember that the "Upper" levels of dancers can all dance the Basic Level, but, the Basic dancers cannot dance the higher levels. As an example, the normal dance has six to eight tips in the program. If two tips were given to the Basics, three tips to the Mainstream, two tips to the Plus and one tip to the Advanced, all dancers would at least have a chance to dance. If rounds and cloggers were scheduled between tips, the dance would appeal to a lot more dancers!! It was not too many years ago that this was the dance format. Just maybe this is the reason why square dancing has lost its appeal to the multitude of ex-dancers that once filled the halls across America.

With the above facts in mind, please don't look down on the Basic 45 Dancers. Remember that you were at the 45 Level only a few years ago. Encourage your friends to get into the Basic Program as an introduction to Square Dancing. Come dance with them so they can enjoy your company now instead of having to wait a year and when they are ready, help them in joining your Club's class for additional learning. I truly believe that the dancer going from the Basic Program into the "Mainstream" classes will have a much lower drop-out rate and after all, that is what we are trying to do.

BANNER STEARLING & RETRIEVING GUIDELINES

1. A banner may be stolen by a minimum of one full square, whose participants are in good standing as club members, displaying club badges of the club they are representing and pay admission.
2. A banner can be stolen only on a regular club dancing night.
3. If two clubs appear on the same night to steal a banner from the same club, the first visiting club to announce their intentions to steal a banner to the host club President or Banner Chairman, will be allowed to steal the banner. Other clubs may steal badges, shirts or whatever host club may offer.
4. A club (out of courtesy to the host club) should advise their intentions to steal their banner by making contact at least three days before their dance.
5. A banner may be retrieved by a minimum of one full square, whose participants are in good standing as club members, displaying club badges of the club they are representing and pay admission.
6. A club retrieving their banner should advise the host club of their intentions at lease three days prior to their dance.
7. A club should not retrieve their banner and steal a club banner at the same time, even if more than the minimum visitors are present.
8. A club having had its banner stolen will make every effort to recover stolen banner in a reasonably short time. Friendly reminders that you have a stolen banner is advisable after a reasonable length of time.
9. A club should not steal a banner or retrieve its banner when their club caller is a guest caller of the club they are visiting.

PLEASE NOTE: A request was made that some guidelines for stealing and retrieving banners be furnished. These are only guidelines. If you have any questions or recommendations please contact Shad or Clarice Shadwell at 744-6865. We would like to have a compatible set of guidelines for all clubs to follow. Thanks.
