WHO and WHAT IS THE NORTH EAST SQUARE & ROUND DANCER'S ASSOCIATIONK?

During the past year as President of NEFSARDA I was amazed to discover how many dancers were unaware that our local dancer's association exists and why such an organization is necessary.

To answer the question **WHAT** is NEFSARDA? - the name of the association is self explanatory. As to **WHO** is NEFSARDA? - the answer is **YOU** and **I** - the dancer. Contrary to popular belief NEFSARDA is NOT just a handful of people meeting every other month. It is YOU and I.

The next question is "just what does NEFSARDA do for ME? The benefits to the individual dancer may not be evident, but, they are there. One of the benefits is NEFSARDA's affiliation with the Blood Bank. Because of our participation in the Florida-Georgia Alliance, should a transfusion become necessary, blood is available to square dancers. (Just a reminder: if you donate blood, be sure to mention North East Dancer's Association so it will be credited to our account.) Another benefit is our insurance program. For a nominal cost (\$1.85 per dancer) we are each insured through USDA insurance should we become injured while at a dance. Without the existance of NEFSARDA neither of these benefits would be available to the individual dancer at little or no cost.

In addition, unlike other associations in the Florida Federation of Square Dancers, membership in NEFSARDA is on a club, rather than individual basis. Therefore, as a club member each of us is automatically a member at no additional cost to the individual.

As is in all things there is a "chain of command" if you will. We begin by joining a club, our club becomes a member of the local association (NEFSARDA), the association is a part of Florida Federation (there are five districts in the State of Florida) and the Federation is a part of United Square Dancers of America. So, as you can see, the overall picture is a far-reaching one.

We all know what the result would be if we failed to support our club. Well, the same is true of failure to support the local, state and national organizations.

I have not been able to come up with a way to explain the intangible benefits of supporting any level of our organizational plan. They too are there, but, perhaps will not be seen, heard or felt by you and I the present dancers. But, if we all work and support each level to our fullest capabilities, future dancers will be able to continue to enjoy dancing as much as we do and will benefit from the things you and I do today.

There are many benefits James has been associated with, but, he is most proud of being Ambassador for Morroco Temple, coordinating the first three Christmas in July dances and we all know what that dance has become over the years.

His career has been so full we could fill this book with it, however, we'll hit the highlights: has called for five National Square Dance Conventions, the first Georgia State Convention in Macon, Recorded on Cicle "O" Records, owner/producer of Brahma Records, Staff Caller for Camp O'Leno for six years, held the first President's Ball and coordinated all others till 1985, served as staff caller/coordinator for English Mountain Retreat and has been resident caller for 12 local clubs and is presently calling for the Swingin' Saints.

Being a square dance caller is Jame's second career - he retired after serving 22 years in the U.S. Navy and a great one it has been. Keep up the good work James and we hope those of you who have not danced to this man will try it - you'll like it.

(Ends and adjacent centers turn $\frac{1}{2}$ by the right & centers turn left $\frac{1}{4}$), Girls Circulate $\frac{1}{2}$, in wave of six, Centers Star $\frac{1}{2}$ by the right while the others Trade. Finish as in a Relay the Deucey, (those who can turn $\frac{1}{2}$ by the Left, trailing girls move up to ends of the wave, all who can turn $\frac{1}{2}$ by the right, girls turn left $\frac{1}{4}$, outside boys move up.)

Ending formation: Parallel Ocean Waves.

The current Plus Quarterly Selections are: *Cross the Ocean*, *Relay with a Star*, and *Rock the Boat*.

ADVANCED QS

For the quarter beginning September 1, 1988, the call *Counteract* has been chosen as the Advanced Quarterly Selection. Authors: Mike Jacobs and Tim Scholl.

Starting Formation: Columns.

Action: Ends Trade and do their part of a Split Counter Rotate $\frac{1}{4}$, Centers Counter Rotate $\frac{1}{4}$ and with the trailing Center acting as a pivot, Cast $\frac{1}{2}$ (Anchor $\frac{1}{2}$).

Ending Formation: Ocean waves.

The current Advanced Quarterly Selections are: *Counteract* and *Anything & Cross*.

MAINSTREAM

Retain Your Lane has been dropped from the Mainstream Quarterly Selection list.

As of this date, there are **NO** current Mainstream Quarterly Selections.

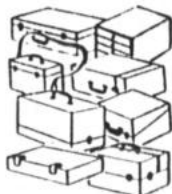

SQUARE DANCE ANGELS

It seems that there's never too much discussed on this subject-- so here we go again. Angels, your presence can make the difference in some learners staying or leaving without giving square dancing a fair chance. Your reason for attending should be to show new dancers what a wonderful activity square dancing can be. It means a lot of smiles and good conversation between tips -- a genuine expression of friendship. A dancer who can be in the right place at the right time with a hand extended to assist is indeed a good helper.

This places a big responsibility on you as a dancer. How you act, dance, and dress will be a deciding factor in a beginner joining a class and staying.

You should wear the simplest square dance attire. The new dancer will look up to you and notice what you wear. Let your outfit look easy to make and inexpensive to buy. Let it be colorful, clean and becoming.

New dancers have a right to expect the "angels" to have a good understanding of the dance figures being taught. Nothing is more distressing to beginners than to find the person who is in the square, supposedly to help them, having trouble simply because they thought they knew what the caller was going to teach. They didn't really need to listen to find he had called it another way.

At first the caller is going to instruct the dancers in the standard patterns and positions. You should omit any special frills or styling habits you might have added to your dancing, so as not to confuse the learners. Do ONLY what your caller is teaching.

One important thing to remember: Don't try and impress your new dancer friends with how good a dancer you are and how well you have learned. This isn't your task if you are there to help. You are a HELPER, just as others helped you when you were in the same situation. There is one person who is teaching and showing the newcomer what he wants them to do -- but he is on the stage and has a microphone in his hand. Let HIM do the explaining! BE A GOOD ANGEL!
