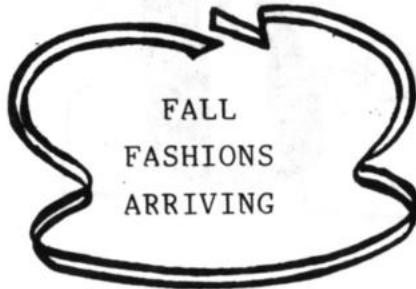

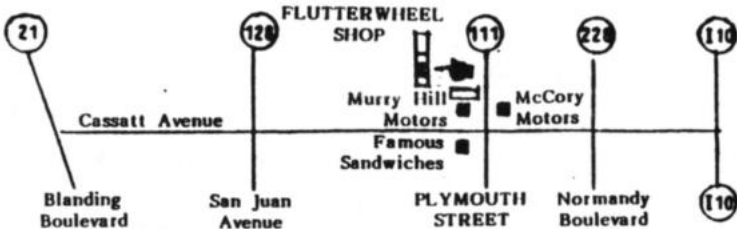

SQUARE DANCERS - CHEAP ?

This article is reprinted (in part) from the USDA News which had excerpted it from the Cues and Tips magazine of Central Ohio. It has an important message to convey - especially since September is recruitment month, we must think of the impression we give others and hope none of us ever do anything to tarnish the image of square dancers. It is based upon a scene from a TV sitcom wherein a waitress complained to a customer that "eight square dancers had sat in the diner for three hours and left her a \$.78 tip".

Ellie DeBald, Editor of the Cues and Tips, writes "That's not good PR for us! But we recalled a night that a restaurant manager chased a Caller to the parking lot after a group of 20+ dancers sat together; running the waitress' feet off and left an exceedingly small tip. Like \$2.00 at that table." She stated how embarrassing it was and thought that as square dancers we all suffer from the thoughtlessness of a few.

She writes further, "Lots of times we have heard that square dancing is "cheap entertainment". It isn't, it may be inexpensive for an evening, it may be a bargain, but it's NOT cheap, and I don't like to think that square dancers are "cheap".

So, let's start a campaign. Let's not, as we recruit new dancers in the next few months, use the word "cheap". When we go out after a dance in our attractive outfits that tell the world who we are and what we do for our pleasure, be sure to leave at least a 15% tip. If your feet are aching after three hours of dancing, your server's feet may be reaching the end of an eight-hour shift and probably hurt too. Better yet, for really good service, make that 20%. Just chalk it up to a further investment in a wonderful evening out."

There is no need to belabor the point as her message was very clear cut. Many of us will sit over just a cup of coffee for more than an hour at a restaurant after a dance. It is only natural to sit and linger as we do not want the fellowship and socializing of a fun evening to end when the last note of music is struck. However, let's make sure that the restaurant and waitress feel it is worth their while to wait on us and look forward to having us return. To quote the USDA News: "Don't let the forgetfulness of a few dancers hurt our square dancer's image. Our image is very important to the activity as well as to you!"

The Rollaways have started off the new 1990-91 season with a great class of 22 and with 11 more coming the second night.

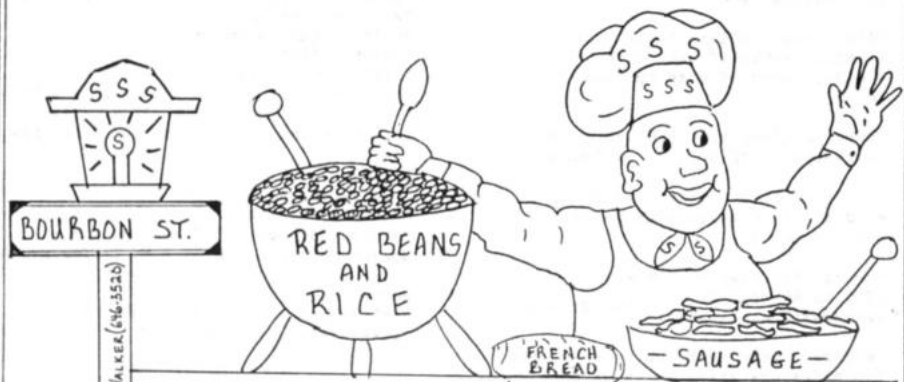
We danced on plaster and trash the whole summer as Sandalwood was getting an overhaul, but I'm happy to say, the work is finished and we are in good shape again.
