It's Insurance Time Again

Now is time that all clubs should determine if they wish to subscribe to the insurance program for the coming year.

The rate for 1991 was \$1.90 per member and it is expected that the rate for 1992 will be increased 5 or 10¢ per member.

This insurance covers the club for \$1,000,000 in liability and provides the dancers with secondary accident coverage while dancing at a club sponsored function. Secondary coverage means that if a dancer has primary health coverage this insurance would cover expenses not covered by the primary carrier such as the deductible.

The liability coverage protects the club itself plus the facility where the dance occurs. Most School Boards require this coverage to dance at a school.

I will send out packages to each club as soon as I receive the information from the State Committee Chairman and it is important that each club return their application to me as soon as possible for coverage to start by January 1, 1992. If you have special dances at other locations you must fill out a form for a "Request for Certificate of Additional Insured". All members of a club must be covered for the club to be insured.

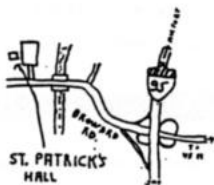

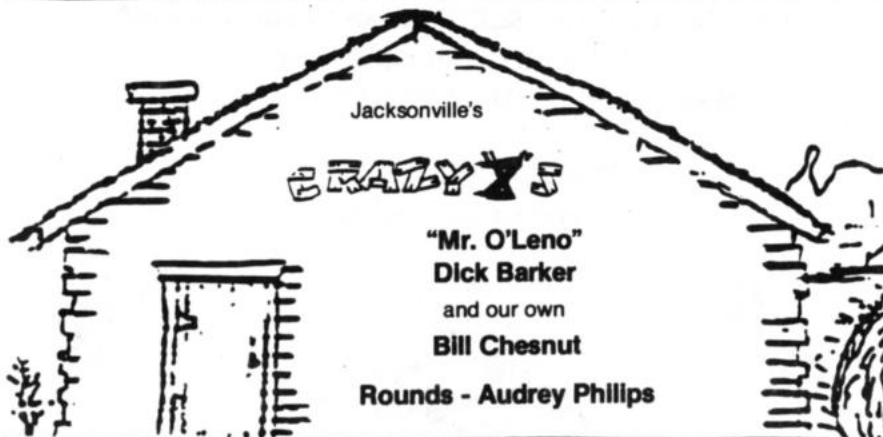

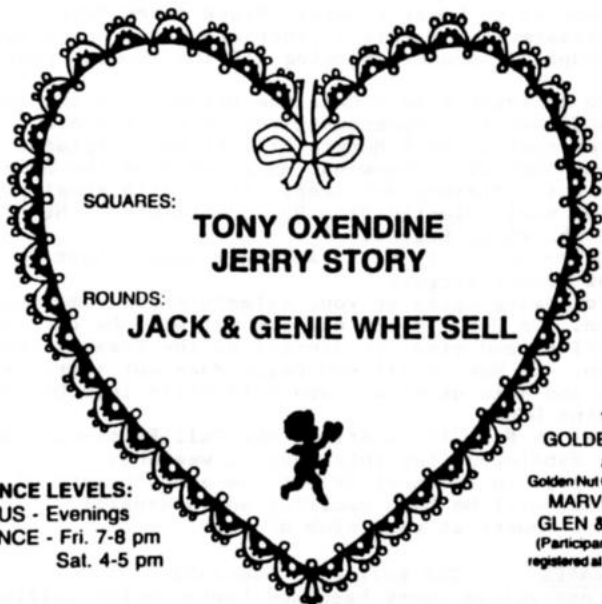

THE SENIOR CORNER

Chuck Joyeusaz-636-0789

A lot of people are asking me about my Senior Program and want to know what it is. Is it a very basic program like a one nighter for the older dancers? Is it just a form of exercise with no beginning or end? Is it a form of the Community Dance Program? Just what is it?

Several years ago I read in one of the National Square Dance magazines that the older dancers were being forced out of club dancing through no fault of theirs. Maybe they lost their partner through death or divorce, or maybe their reaction time had slowed a little and they couldn't keep up with the younger dancers and faster callers. Many of these people devoted several years to Square Dancing and now find that they have no place to dance. They go and sit, but they are no longer included in the club dances.

Based on this article I started a club where we used the basic 49 movements of Square Dancing, but allowed the women to dance the mans part. I also set it up at a slightly slower pace and used a little more simplified figures that did not require split second recall of the movements. In other words, a more enjoyable dancing speed for the older dancers.

Our dances include solo line dances, mixers, quadrills, contras and of course regular square dancing. If someone has an easy Round Dance record that they would like to use, it can be done between tips, as long as I don't have to cue it!! We try to use as many different kinds of dancing as possible so that we all have fun, which is the name of the game.

I have now upgraded two clubs to the Mainstream level, but the concept is the same. Ladies dancing the mans part, a slower pace and a variety of dances. These two clubs are: The Dixie Stars at Paceti's on Wednesday evenings and the Joy Seas Squares in St. Augustine South on Friday evenings. Please call me for details.
