## NEFSARDA INSURANCE

It's nearing that time of the year again. This is just a reminder that the insurance enrollment will again be in November and December. I will provide more information at the November delegates meeting. This is just something you may want to think about. We have been having trouble with the Malls this year concerning demos. They want assurance that the dancers are covered when doing demos. They don't want to run the risk of being sued. This insurance cost just pennies and it protects each dancer no matter where you are dancing in the United States. Medical costs are so high! Most primary insurances will pay up to 80%. But do you realize how much 20% can amount to, especially if the injury prevents you from working for a few weeks. CAN YOU AFFORD TO BE WITHOUT IT?
