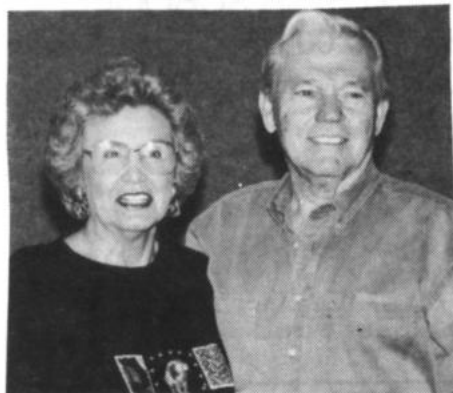

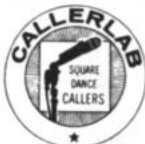

CALLER'S CORNER

(By Ed Foote — From USDA News July – Sept '96 issue)

When a caller says "Promenade, don't slow down," whisper to your partner whether you are heads or sides. This is primarily the boys responsibility because the girls assume the identity of the man with whom they are dancing.

Why the whisper? Because you

know that 99 % of the time the next call will be "heads (or sides) Wheel Around." If you do not know what you are, you will be slow in reacting to the call, which could result in the square breaking down. I see these breakdowns happen regularly, and they could be eliminated simply by knowing what you are.

CUER'S CORNER HAPPY DANCERS

Nothing will promote the Round Dance and Square Dance activity more than happy dancers. When we are all smiling, others think this looks like fun.

Sometimes there are physical occurrences that make us not happy dancers. Legs hurt, arms ache? Relax, help is on the way. Just a few ideas to help make our dance steps comfortable and easier to execute:

1. Bend those knees. We bend our knees when we walk, and we have to bend them while we dance. It's hard to walk or dance stiff legged.

2. Step lightly and stay off of

your heels. We don't need to plant our feet. Use the heels for balance.

3. Hold those arms up — each his own. There's nothing worse than trying to hold up a weight bearing partner.

4. Most of all, wear comfortable shoes that will glide on the floor. Leather soled shoes help. Sometimes tennis shoes may feel great but grab the floor and stick to it.

Happy feet, legs and knees equal happy faces and happy dancing.

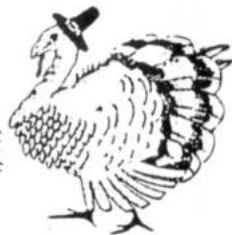

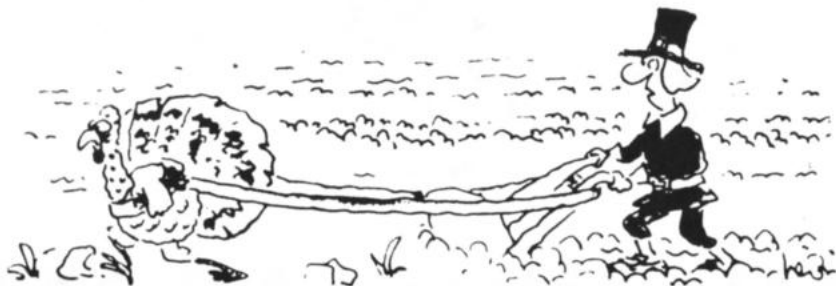

STITCHIN' TIME

Reprinted from AmericanSquare Dance Magazine –
August '96 — Article written by Phyllis Murgage

(EDITOR'S NOTE: Thought this article had some good tips that our readers could use. If you have any comments, questions, or suggestions please write to: Phyllis Murgage, 458 Lois Lane, Sedro-Wolley, CA 98284.)

Have you ever gotten fusible web on a teflon ironing board cover? If you cover the web with waxed paper and press it lightly with an iron, it will take the web off the cover.

Do you have a problem with buttons coming off shirts and blouses? If you will take a little seam sealant or Fraycheck and dot the threads on the inside of the garment before laundering it, the threads will be sealed and are less likely to come off.

Is your thread rack overflowing? No place to put those extra spools of thread? Cut a plastic drinking straw in half and place one half on the thread rack's spindle – you now have room for two spools of thread on each spindle instead of only one.

Use fusible interfacing scraps to repair tears or add extra strength to the stress points of tissue patterns or tears in clothes.

Do you have problems inserting a new needle in your serger? You can either remove the presser foot and place a pocket mirror right side up over the feed dogs, or if you have one,

a dental mirror on a long handle. Drop the presser foot down and tape the mirror so that you can see where the needle is to be inserted.

Do you have a problem getting the backing off fusible webbing after you have applied it to the fabric? Make a slit on the paper backing with a razor blade or Exacto knife before you fuse it to the fabric. Once fused, it will be much easier to remove the paper backing. I prefer using the "X" type of marking.

Here is one that is also good for the husbands (and callers). Many electrical cords can be inserted into the outlet or into the electrical unit in only one direction. Mark the "right side" of each plug with colored tape. Saves time switching until you get it right.

Do you have a problem making your pockets come out exactly the same when you are pressing down the seam allowance? Make a cardboard template of the pocket, then when you have to shape the pocket, all you have to do is fold the fabric, cut the edges around the template and press to create perfect pockets with crisp edges!

Square Dance Etiquette

Square dancers pride themselves on being friendly and courteous on and off the dance floor to both dancers and non-dancers alike. It is good square dance manners to join the nearest square needing a couple. Introduce yourself (a stranger is just a friend whom you haven't yet met). Listen to the caller. After a tip, applaud the caller and thank your fellow dancers. And most important, "Have Fun and Smile".

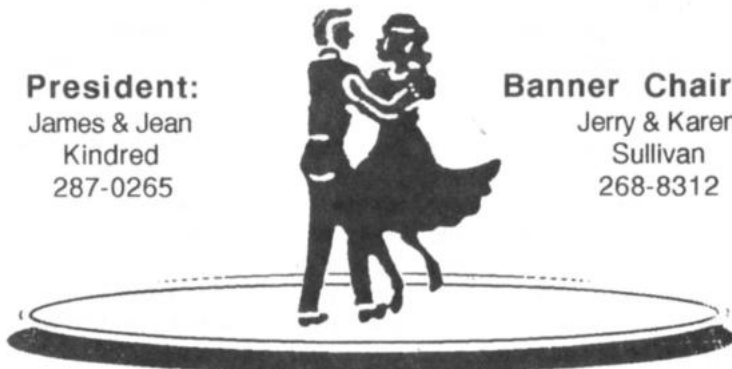

PORTRAIT OF A CLOGGING INSTRUCTOR

By Donna Robbins (Part one)

This is about me! If you think it's presumptuous for me to write about myself, let me explain — I've had several offers from Clogging friends, wanting to do it: most recently from Kelli McChesney, who's only known me the last four years. In each case, I was asked to write down my Clogging "history", including dates, etc. I decided if I was going to do that, I may as well write it myself.

My interest in Clogging began in 1972, at a dance festival in Gatlinburg, TN, with my caller-husband, John. I saw the **Tennessee Mountain Cloggers** perform and was totally "hooked"! It wasn't until 1977 that I was given the opportunity, as a member of the charter class of the **J-Ville Cloggers** (no longer in existence). After Clogging for two years with that club, I was encouraged to start a second club for the Westside, (even though I have always lived on the Southside). The **Clogging Robins** was formed in 1979, after I graduated 30 Cloggers (including the Church Priest and his daughters) in the fellowship hall of the Church of The Nativity. The only other experienced Clogger was my younger son, Jonathan, who at 13, went thru class with me. My daughter, Kim, and older son, Eddie, joined later. I picked up from Sheila Popwell and other Georgia Cloggers, the trend of short skirts without crinolines (so you could see the feet!). I tried to eliminate the expense in costuming — after all you had already spent \$20.00 for shoes and taps and \$15.00 for lessons!

My primary objective was to get more exposure, bringing more people into this fun, family oriented activity, so I solicited for exhibitions. I ended up with contracts with the Major Malls in Jacksonville, giving half of all fees

earned back to the club to be spent on its members — it worked! I was holding classes of 50 to 75 people and the club had grown to over 100 members. A lady came up to me at one of my shows - she was impressed with my routine of "Y.M.C.A." (we even did arm movements, "jumping jacks", to the chorus)! Since I didn't run a summer class, I sent her to the **J-Ville Cloggers**. Her name is Marge Callahan!

Imagine the thrill of picking up the Sunday Florida Times Union paper and seeing, on the front page, a color photo of the **Cloggin' Robins** doing an exhibition at the local mall.

We outgrew the Church hall and moved to a civic center and then on to Joseph Stillwell School where we've been Clogging ever since.

In 1981, the **Robins** did an exhibition at the Baker County Fair in Macclenny on a flatbed truck. I was called by the Agriculture Director and asked to teach a class in Macclenny. Not wanting to travel, I suggested they come to Jacksonville. She insisted there were too many and they wanted to make use of the Agriculture Building. I agreed to go if they signed up at least 50 people, thinking that would be the last of it. They had over 100 people, so after the class and workshop was completed, (16 weeks), the **Bear Country Cloggers** were formed and lasted for over seven years. It was not an extension of the "Robins". They had their own identity and totally different people. They were dedicated and some of the best Cloggers I've ever had. However, when they started to have "people conflicts" (not with me but with each other), I folded the club. I love the activity, but I have a low tolerance for stress and negativity

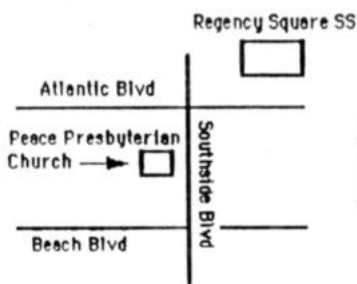

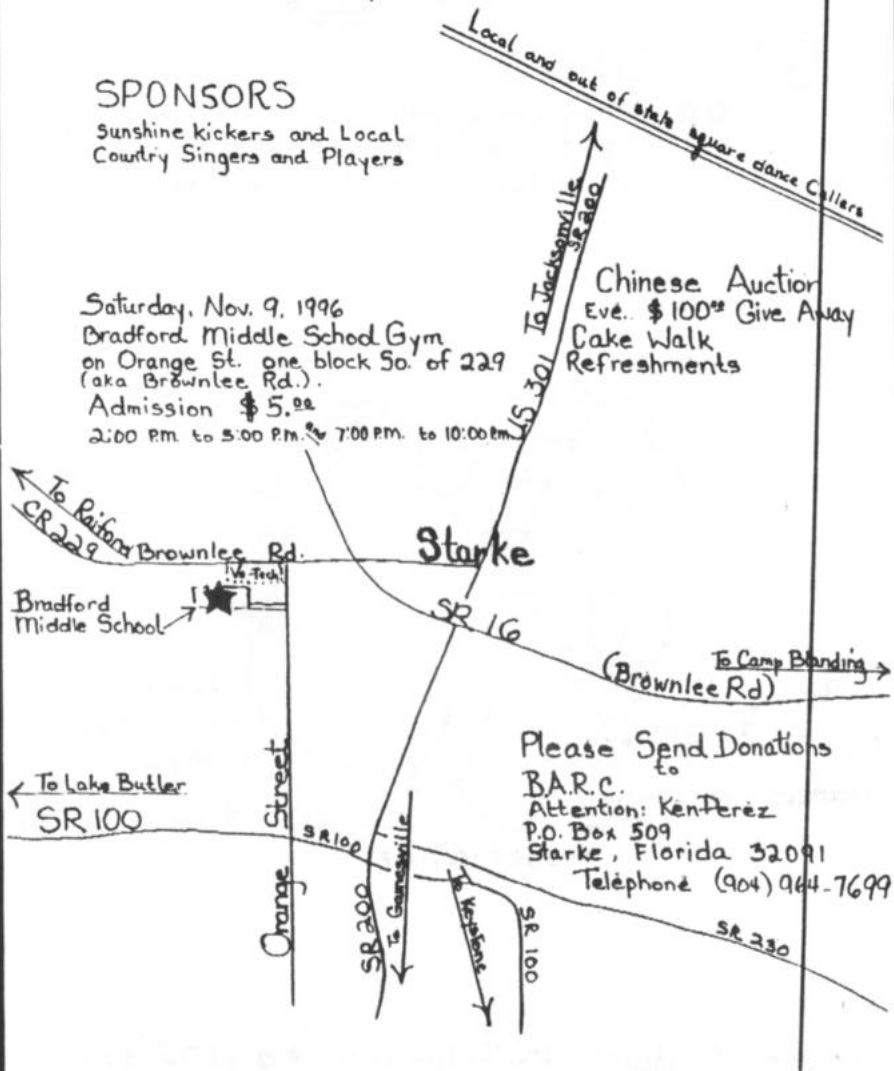

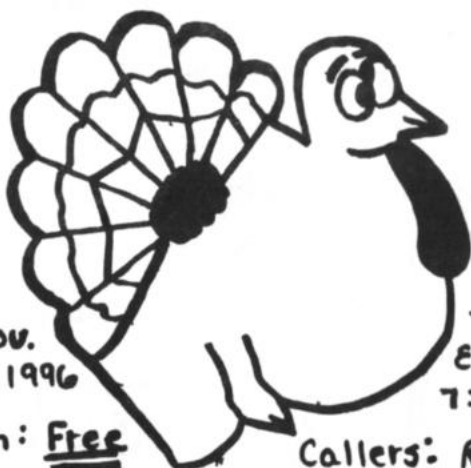
