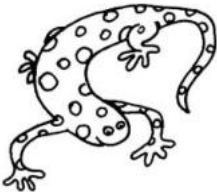

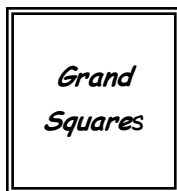

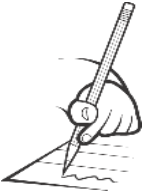

### Lazy Man's Krab & Mini-Shrimp Dip

Prepared by Bill Morgan (Silver Fox Squares)

First drive to Wal-Mart and purchase the following ingredients'

- 1 Small can of 'Tiny Shrimp'
- 1 Small package of 'Flake Imitation Krab meat'
- 1 Box of Captain's Wafers
- 1 Tub of Santa Barbara Bay Deli Style Dip - Crab Salad (In the Deli coolers)
- 1 Tub of Seafood & Shrimp Salad with Dill (In the Deli coolers)

Then drive Home (before you start preparation)

Preparation:

Take all ingredients out of the Bag

Open and drain and rinse the small can of Tiny Shrimp

Open All Packages (except the Captain's Wafers)

In a large bowl combine all the ingredients

Mix well

Chill for at least an hour

Server with the now opened Captain's Wafers

Hint: if you place the dip back into the tubs (to chill and transport) you will have enough for the Chef to have later. You will however have to have your own box of wafers.

## **Where did Round Dancing come From?**

Our modern round dance developed from the pioneer days along with square dancing. In order to not have to stop dancing, the early dancers would, between tips, dance such things as the early, simplified waltzes, polkas, schottisches and other dances which have been lost in history. Over the years, the inclusion of the more modern ballroom rhythms and figures were introduced, culminating in our modern round dance which has reached the point of being recognized as a dance form all its own .

As square dancing became more complicated with more and more complex figures added, so did round dancing, Routines became more precise, and there were a growing number of them. One of the major changes in round dancing was the addition of the Latin rhythms - cha-cha, tango, rumba, etc. This addition opened up a whole new area of teaching/learning/challenge. Later on, some of the English ballroom steps began to find their way into round dance routines, and there was greater attention to body and head position.

As in square dancing, not all dancers were pleased with or accepted some of the changes. Many were quite content with the easy two steps and waltzes. These changes inevitably led to the development of "levels" of round dancing - not to indicate that one level of dancer might be better than another level of dancer, but to provide a means of identification and communication. Today, you will find round dances generally divided into four groups: Easy Level, Square Dance Level, Intermediate (which has three sub-divisions), and Advanced. The classification is based upon the steps in the dance, the timing and timing changes, positions and sequence.

For all attendees, you will be provided a unique Oklahoma convention badge. While on our web site ([www.62nsdc.com](http://www.62nsdc.com)) explore the tours we will offer. We will offer three tours

before the convention begins, and many more through out the convention. Oklahoma City is growing. If you attended our 52nd National Square Dance Convention in 2003, you won't believe the changes. For the 62nd we have 5 downtown hotels under contract. Four of these are across the street from the Cox Convention Center. Hampton Inn & Suite (our 5th) is three blocks from the convention center and surrounded by many fine restaurants that

are part of Bricktown Entertainment

District. These five downtown hotels do require a 4 night minimum stay (Wednesday through Saturday). You'll notice that with one exception all of our convention hotels allow 1 to 4 people per room for one price. Each of the downtown hotels will have their own parking facilities and there will be fees.

The eleven **hotels** on South Meridian will have free parking. We suggest you purchase a Bus Pass for each person traveling to and from the Cox Convention

Center. If you drive you will have to pay to park each time you enter any of the parking garages. Our busses will only stop at convention sponsored hotels and the State Fair RV Campgrounds. Here again you see that our convention hotels allow one to four guests per room for the same price.

**RV Camping** will be at Oklahoma Fair Park, NW 10th and May. We have 300 spaces reserved for the dancing RVers. All spaces have at least 30 amp and water hook ups. There are a few 50 amp spaces. There is a dump station on site and for a fee the "Honey Wagon" will come to your RV space.
