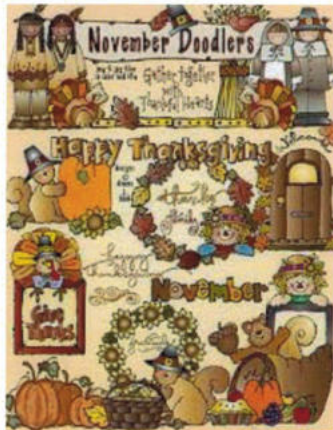


PROCLAMATION

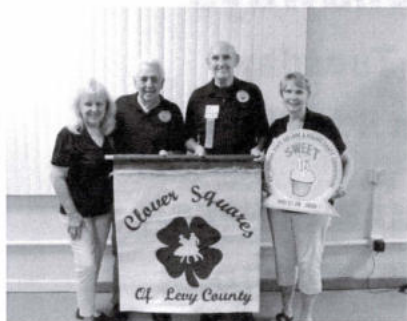

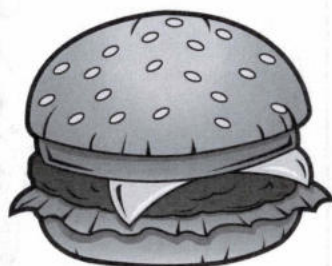

2016 State Convention Chairmen at the Williston Peanut Festival



So you have been talked into being the club banner chairman

So you have been talked into being the club banner chairman or are considering volunteering but have no idea what the job requires. First, your club has a banner, as do most other clubs. It is a big rectangular piece of fabric with the clubs name on it. Usually there is one big banner and 3 or more smaller ones for other clubs to steal. Here is a basic list to get you started.

Banner Chairman Duties:

Steal banners.

- Schedule and promote banner raids and visitations.
- Notify clubs when we are making a banner raid.
- Get a form filled out at visitations and banner raids.

Keep track of banners

- Who has our banners?
- Keep the banners we have stolen until they are retrieved.

The duties sound simple enough until you start to plan your first banner raid and think about how to get people to come on the raid. When Susan and I held this duty at the Silver Fox Squares it was easy because Susan did most of the work and we had Mary Starling to tell us what to do.

I would start by deciding how many banner raids you can get members to participate in or you wish to organize. It is not required that the banner chairman goes on all banner raids but it is easier to lead from the front. When you have decided how many raids you wish to lead, you next have to decide who you can visit and when. This is where the rules come into play.

Rules:

You must have 8 dancers to steal a banner. They do not have to be couples.

- You must have 8 dancers to retrieve your banner.
- You must have 4 dancers to have a visitation form signed.
- You have to have a visitation form signed for the banner raid or visitation to be counted.
- You must notify the club you are visiting if you have enough visitors to steal a banner. This is so that club is prepared for the extra dancers.
- The visitation forms must be turned into the appropriate NEF-SARDA representative to be tabulated.
- You can not take a banner from a club that normally dances on the same day of the week as your club, but you can get a visitation form signed. This is because the other club would not be able to retrieve their banner without going dark.
- Only a set number of visits per club are counted per year.
- Not a rule, but it is always good form to let someone keep your banner a couple of weeks before retrieving it.



To decide how many visitation you can get out of your club, ask one of the long time members how many visitations were made the previous year. On nights your club is dark you should schedule visitations to other clubs that dance that night. This should be easy as everyone is used to dancing that night and you only need 4 dancers for a visitation. The Rollaways and Seabreeze Singles often schedule themed dances when they know the other is dark.

For banner raids to other clubs find out when they are having a themed dance and try schedule raids at those dances. The clubs have worked hard on the themes to attract visitors and are appreciative of your attendance.

When you have made a visitation schedule let the other club officers know. They will help promote visitations. Personally invite people. Ask them which dates or day of the week will work best. If the visitation is a long distance car pooling can be fun. We have found out some interesting things about fellow dancers on long trips. Make your own club email list so you can easily remind people when visitations are coming up.

Talk up the fun everyone had on the last banner raid. Meet for dinner before the dance. If you know that other dancers will already be going to visit a club, call around and see if you can find a couple other dancers to super size to a banner raid. Make sure visitation forms are available to all club members. Anyone is allowed to get a form signed if 4 dancers are there.



NEFSARDA Delegates Meeting

July 12, 2015

NEFSARDA Delegates Meeting opened at 3:00 p.m. at Holiday Inn Commonwealth, Jacksonville, FL. Joe Hardcastle led us in Prayer and Pledge of Allegiance to the American Flag.

Pat McMillan, President, welcomed everyone to the meeting.

Nominating Committee: Jerry Wright, Chairperson, presented names of nominees for the 2016 NEFSARDA Board. New nominations are: President(s) Kathy and Jack McKinney; Recording Secretary(s) Margaret Cahan and add Mary Ann Baugh; Corresponding Secretary(s) Julie Franciskato and add Paula Dion, Treasurer(s) Betty Smith and replace L. Smith with Suzanne Tower; and Pat and Lamar McMillan will become Immediate Past President(s). Nominations will be voted on during October meeting. Kathy McKinney made a motion to accept nominated names and Anita Taylor seconded the motion. Motion carried. Report filed.

Florida Federation: Anita Taylor, President of FF said the Federation is taking resumes for Parliamentarian. This will be for a 5 year commitment with advancement to Secretary, Treasurer, Vice President and President. If interested contact Anita for more information and must submit resume by First of August.

Recording Secretary: Margaret Cahan asked if there were any corrections to minutes of April 12, 2015 NEFSARDA Delegates Meeting. No corrections. Kathy McKinney made a motion to accept minutes as read and Anita Taylor seconded the motion. Motion carried. Minutes filed.

Vice President: Debbie Miller gave report and said we had our May 30, 2015 5th Saturday dance which was enjoyed by all. Our next 5th Saturday dance will be held in Lake City at the Richardson Community Center on August 29, 2015. Dance will be called "Dog Days of Summer" and hot dogs and trimmings will be served. Report filed.

Correspondence Secretary: Julie Franciskato is still on vacation but sent her report and all paperwork needed. Lamar McMillan sat at her table and checked in delegates etc. Report filed.

Treasurer Report: Betty Smith said as of June 30, 2015 we had \$5,776.76 in the treasury and as of May 31, 2015, \$18,239.31 in C.D.'s. Anita Taylor made a motion to file the Treasurer's Report for audit, and the motion was seconded by Tom Herscha. Motion carried and reports filed for audit.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Club Visitations: Bill and Paula Dion reported Rollaways and Seabreeze Singles were leading in visitations so far this year with 35 and 18 respectively. Report filed.

Florida Federation: Anita Taylor, President of FF announced the Florida Federation is planning on filing "Intention for 2021 National Federation Convention" to be held in Tampa. If Florida does get the 2021 convention it will mean a lot of people will be needed to work because we have to put on a small convention in 2020 and large one in 2021.

Joys and Concerns: Linda Tester asked if a club has a special dance to please not send her a flyer expecting her to attach it to the memo, but instead write about the special dance in your email message. Many times the recipients of "Dance Notes" can't seem to open the attachments.

Fall Festival: Pat Herscha said it is time to focus on the upcoming Fall Festival. She thanked Kathy and Jack McKinney for spreading the word about the festival all over the East Coast on their recent trip to New England for the National Convention last month. Clubs get your ads in the program book by sending to Mark Fetzner by Sept. 1st. She can give you the form you need. All clubs were asked to donate a gift certificate to the Fall Festival, but so far only Clover Squares has donated one.

NEW BUSINESS:

President Pat said several callers and cuers have discussed with her that they would like to add more calls to what they are teaching the new dancers. It had been thought we could bring in more new dancers by having more than one class a year, however, this has produced about 89 new but only partly trained dancers. Basic dancers learn 45 calls, and mainstream are supposed to learn 120. NEFSARDA had agreed to pay the 2nd \$100 to clubs who had more than 1 class during 2015, but only during 2015. This practice will not be continued after December 2015.

Linda Tester, Insurance, said if a dancer joins club he or she must be insured. If he or she dance without joining, they do not have to have insurance.

President Pat brought up the subject of having another free fish fry just for square dancers to enjoy. Originally she suggested it be held at Moose just before one of their Thursday dances so we would not have to rent a hall, or pay for callers and cuers. Susan Moon, Grand Squares, suggested we have it on a 5th Saturday because those out of town clubs would not be able to come to Moose on a Thursday night by 5:30 p.m. Vice President Debbie Miller said the next 5th Saturday has already been planned as "Dog Days of Summer" with hot dogs, and there will be no more 5th Saturdays until after new year comes because the "Fall Festival" takes its place. After some discussion it was decided to table the suggestion for now.

Kathy McKinney said the 5th Tuesday dance we had at Rollaways' club was very successful. We need to plan to have another 5th Tuesday dance.

Kathy McKinney said she has shirts for the 2015 State Convention. She and Linda Testor displayed the new "Traveling Artifact" which looks like a giant pink cupcake. It opens and there are raffle tickets to be sold and other info the clubs need. This artifact will be carried from club to club to advertise and raise money for the 2015 State Convention. If any raffle tickets are sold a check should be sent to Kathy McKinney.

By-Laws: Anita Taylor and Val Newsome are still working on the updating of the bylaws.

Club Announcements were made:

Pat Herscha made a motion to adjourn the meeting and Linda Tester seconded it.
Meeting adjourned.

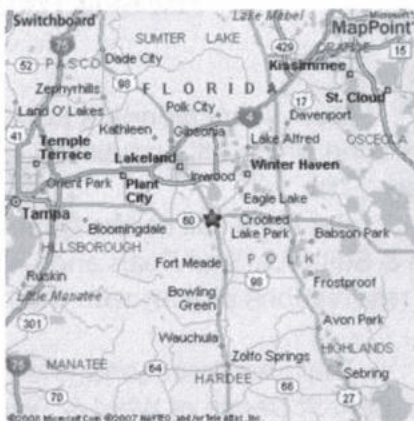
West Coast Association's 41st Annual Fall Fun Fest

I know many of you have danced to Tim in the past and know what an energetic caller he is. Some of us in the West Coast Association area got to dance to Ross Howell recently, and you won't be disappointed with his calling either! And of course, all of you know the husband and wife duo of Jimmy and Carol Griffin from St. Pete.

Dancing will be at the Bartow Civic Center, 2250 S. Floral Avenue, where two halls will be available for dancing. The main hall will alternate Mainstream, Plus, and Rounds, and the smaller hall will be for Advance dancing.

Have you ever been to Bartow? This quaint historic town is the town seat of Polk County. They have a historical museum and a geology library in downtown Bartow as well as several restaurants and shops for your enjoyment.

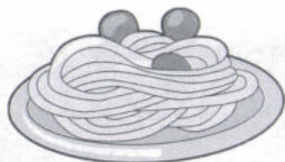
