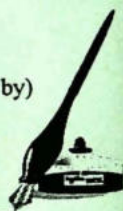

MULTICYCLE SQUARE DANCE LESSON PROGRAMS

Background

1. There are not enough dancers entering the activity through our normal recruiting methods. Most club level dancers have exhausted the "pool" of friends they could enlist to become new dancers. Only new dancers can effectively recruit newer dancers.

2. Our current teaching approach is to provide lessons only once per year. Any dancers who cannot finish an annual teaching program generally will not start again.

3. Most dancers want to dance with their friends. Once per year classes do not allow this to be done until after the lessons are completed and they have completed a Plus workshop.

4. Most clubs like to consider themselves Plus level and new dancers are pushed into that level before they can have fun at the Mainstream level. In too many instances, the dancers just quit.

5. Most clubs cannot recruit enough dancers to make it economically feasible to conduct their own lesson classes.

The possible solution: Multi-cycle lesson programs where dancers involved in lessons can bring their friends into the activity.

What are multicycle lesson program? Multicycle lesson programs work on the pyramid premise that new dancers begat new dancers and that a good entry level for square dancing is Mainstream. They work on the basis of year-round lessons with one Mainstream and one Basic class in session together on the same night with alternating teaching tips for each. The people in the Mainstream segment "angel" the people in the Basic and (hopefully) are dancing with their friends. How do multicycle lesson programs work? A lesson class is started with as many people as can be recruited. A set of 10 or 12 weeks of lessons is given to complete the Basic program teaching only from the standard position. At the conclusion of the first session, a new class for Basic dancers is started on the same

night. The dancers who have completed the Basic session now enter the Mainstream session and teaching tips alternate. Normally a three hour time frame is allocated. As dancers "graduate" from the Mainstream session, a new Basic class is formed and the previous Basic class moves to Mainstream. An observation is that only one class of this nature should be conducted at a time in a city the size of those along the Gulf Coast. If each club tries to do something of this nature initially, the population of the classes will be so diluted that they probably cannot be self supporting; however, as the dancer population grows, more classes should be initiated using the same basic guidelines. The pyramid approach will work in all instances and the dancer population should grow.

One of the keys to the success of these programs is to make the new dancers feel at home in the square dance community and a part of the environment at an early time in the lessons. To do this, each club in the area should sponsor at least one hi-lo dance each month and cater to the new dancers. The definition of a hi-low dance is that the caller will call one tip for the club level dancer (hi) and one tip using only calls known by the new dancer (lo). Club dancers must realize that new dancers are not taught all the bumps and grinds, waist swing do-sa-do's, etc. and they should not impose their will on the new dancer. Club callers must use only the material the new dancer knows and then only from standard position. There is nothing wrong with workshopping an extended application of calls the dancers have been exposed to; however, no new calls should be used as it is still the **teacher's** responsibility to teach.

What happens to the dancers who complete the course? If the clubs in the area do not dance a Mainstream program, two approaches can be taken. One, a dance using only Mainstream calls can be established. A caller can be contracted for that dance or callers can alternate. Two, if the local clubs choose to do so, they can set their level of dance to Mainstream and have announced Plus tips if the membership desires to retain some degree of a "Soft Plus" level. (A personal observation is that along the Gulf Coast the level of Plus is "soft" to say the least. We would be better off having the callers do their homework and provide enthusiastic, interesting, and different Mainstream with

emphasis on extended applications rather than more calls.)

It is a rule of nature, however, that some dancers will want more of a challenge than even extended application Mainstream. For these dancers, a once per year Plus workshop should be provided and a solid Plus club should be available. In areas with a dancer population the size of Mobile, Pensacola, Ft. Walton Beach, Panama City, Tallahassee, etc., it would seem logical to have one solid plus club in the city and the rest Mainstream. For the Plus dancers who want more of a challenge, an Advanced level club should be provided.

Will this approach work? It has worked in other parts of the country. It takes education and teamwork on the part of the dancers and callers and a desire to increase the dancer population. It also takes callers who are willing to participate for very little if no initial financial reward. It takes dancers who can see beyond the "we never did it this way before" attitude and a strong desire to save square dancing. The reward to both dancers and callers can be a major increase in dancers which will result in bigger and better dances for us all.

Regardless of who calls at the Roundup, I want it to be the best ever and to continue to be better each year hereafter.

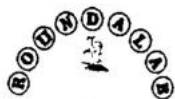

INTERNATIONAL ASSEMBLY OF "TRUSTEES" OF THE SQUARE DANCE ACTIVITY

LEGACY conducts its 13th biennial Meeting

LEGACY, the International assembly of "Trustees" of the Square Dance Activity held its 13th biennial Meeting in Salt Lake City, UT. Twenty-six years ago, before many of the major organizations of today were conceived, LEGACY's main purpose was to be a leadership, resource, communication center - a THINK TANK. Trustees (as its members are called) - then and now - represent EVERY facet (dancers, callers, cuers, prompters, leaders, publishers, suppliers, and special interest groups) within the square dance activity. Education, Ethics, Heritage, Leadership Training, Public Relations, Communications, Outreach, Standardization, Economics, working with others are among the many concerns LEGACY has addressed over the years.

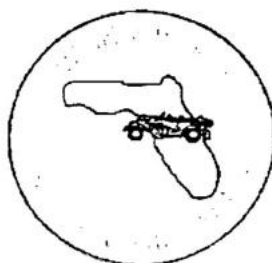
This year, in Salt Lake City, trustees brain stormed whether LEGACY had reached the goals set by its founders back in 1973. LEGACY's XIII theme for its meeting echoed the trustees response "LEGACY the SALT that Enriches and Preserves" - with each breakout session giving the trustees more food for thought. At the closing session the trustees decision was that LEGACY should continue to provide communication, knowledge of, and education for, the operations of all the phases of square dancing in order to promote, protect and perpetuate the future of the activity through mutual understanding and cooperation throughout the world. The trustees also proposed that LEGACY should focus more effort on serving as the connector or the interface between Square Dance's heritage and the future of the activity.

Recognized for having served six years on the Board were retiring trustees Louise Cole (UT), Chairman Bernie & Carolyn Coulthurst (WI), Joe & Jean Hartka (MA), Gene & Charlotte Johnson (WI) and Bob & Janette Kemper CTN).

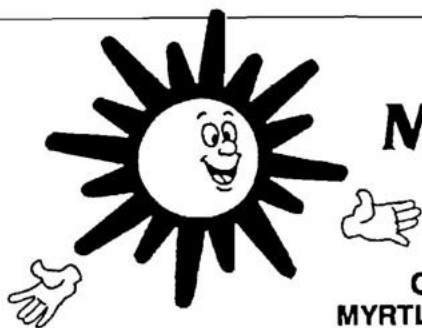

Panama City, February 14, 1998

- The net worth as of 2/14/98 is \$7782.61.
- Tom Hancock reported that 20 of 21 clubs have paid their insurance. He also reported that the Florida Federation of Square Dancers will meet on Feb. 21 & 22. The delegates will choose the new state outfit.
- USDA - Thirty states have adopted Square Dance as their state dance, which represents over 100,000 dancers. Everyone is urged to use the USDA credit card. A portion of the funds generated from the cards help support the Youth and Handicapable dancers.
- Julian Rosdick reported plans for the '98 Roundup are going well. Larry Letson from McAllen, TX will be the featured caller on Saturday night, October 24th. Several NWF callers will call Friday night and Saturday.
- Cliff Allen reported that the next meeting of Legacy will be May 14-16.
- Vic Rhodes submitted the audit report for the period covering October 1996 to October 1997. All the records are in order for this period.
- Shirley read information received from Ruth Tiefel of Quincy concerning the purchase of association jackets. If clubs are interested, delegates need to notify Shirley.
