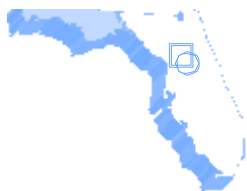

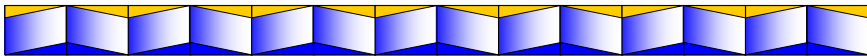

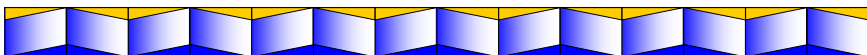

Also it was discussed about Tampa as a potential candidate for the site of the 2021 National Square dance Convention. Paul and Cheryl Miller were appointed to head up and continue the Convention and whether or not for Florida to present its intention to bid at the 2015 National square Dance convention in Springfield, MA. Next Federation Meeting February 28<sup>th</sup>. All Associations must vote on changes to constitution and articles of incorporation:

### Articles of Incoorporation

#### Article II

The nature and object of the corporation shall be as follows:

Section 1. Organized exclusively for charitable and educational purposes to promote the extension of square and round dancing in the state of Florida by ededucating the general public of the healthful and recreational opportunities in square and round dancing. This includes the making of distributions to organizations that qualify under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Coce or the corresponding section of any future federal atax code.

#### Article VII

Section 3. Upon majority vote of the Board of Directors to dissolve the Coperation, the Executive Committee shall, after paying or making provision for the payment of all the liabilities of the Corporation, dispose of all the assets of the Corporation exclusively for the benefit of the corporation to any exempt corporatin or entity organized for purposes similar to those set forth under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (or the corresponding provisions of any future United States Internal Revenue law) as the directors shall determine.

### CONSTITUTION

#### Article II

The purpose of the corporation shall be as follows:

Section 1. Organized exclusively for charitable and educational purposes to promote the extension of square and round dancing in the State of florida by education the general public of the healthful and recreational opportunities in square and round dancing. This includes the making of distributions organizations that qualify under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code or the

corresponding section of any future federal tax code.

Removal of: Article X: Dissolution

This is stated in the articles of Incorporation Article VII.

It was moved by Wanna and seconded by Cheryl to accept the changes.

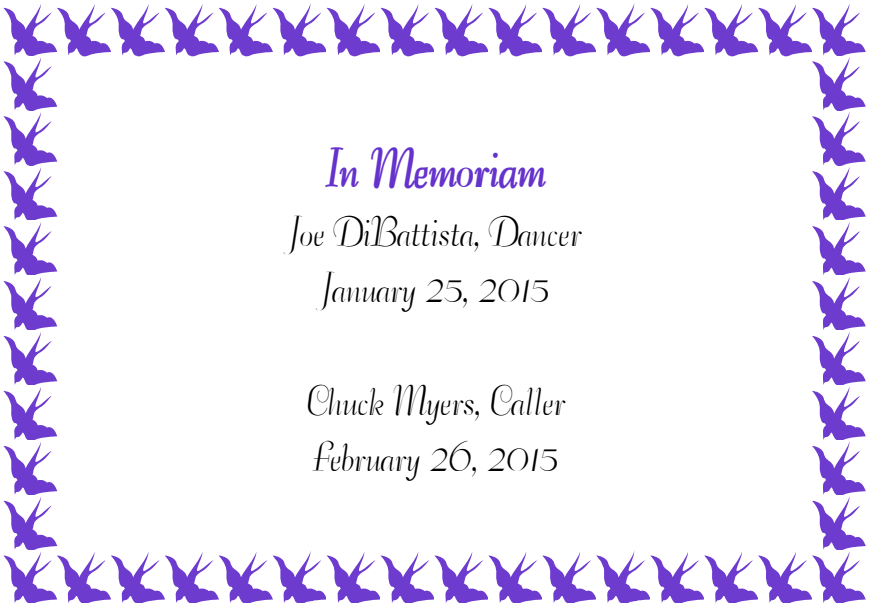

Are you a "Single" dancer? Well, please do come to the Convention as there will be a "SPECIAL Singles Hall" on Friday

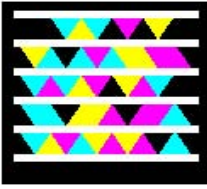

## HEARING ENHANCEMENT

What to expect at the 64<sup>th</sup> National Square Dance Convention® (Along with some tutorial information for interested dancers.)

Hearing enhancement systems literally place the speaker at the ear of the listener and dramatically reduce background noise.

This background noise may include sideline talking, motor or fan noise (e.g. heating or air conditioning unit), floor noise (made by the dancers' feet moving), etc. Hearing loss is invisible and can occur at any age. However, it is more prevalent as age increases. More than 50% of people over age 50 have a hearing loss significant enough to impact their understanding of speech, especially in a background of noise. As the average age of square dancers increases, so does the impact of hearing loss on the activity. Look at the demographics of our group. There are many older dancers, and chances are high that a hearing enhancement system would be beneficial almost anywhere we go to dance. The use of a hearing enhancement system has extended the enjoyment of many people who dance in our square dance activity.

**What is ADA?** ADA stands for the Americans with Disabilities Act. The Americans with Disabilities Act gives civil rights protections to individuals with disabilities similar to those provided to other individuals on the basis of race, sex, national origin, and religion. It guarantees equal opportunity for individuals with disabilities in public accommodations, employment, transportation, state and local government services, and telecommunications. It states that one must furnish auxiliary aids when necessary to ensure effective com-

munication. For new building construction and alterations, fixed seating assembly areas that accommodate 50 or more people or have audio amplification systems must have a permanently-installed assistive listening system. This must be done without extra charge to the persons using the system. Although the act does not require alterations to existing facilities if undue burden on the owner of the facility can be proven, it does infer that hearing disabled individuals are to be provided with appropriate equipment, whenever possible. It's the law. There is a similar requirement in Canada, at least for new construction.

**Why use FM systems?** FM (frequency modulated) signals fill a room and will penetrate some walls and partitions. These signals do not require "line of sight" direct contact between the transmitter and the receiver. FM signals generated by hearing enhancement transmitters travel several hundred feet. Infrared systems provide excellent sound quality, but require a direct "line of sight" transmission. This is virtually impossible to achieve with dancers moving around the floor. Induction loop systems also provide good sound quality, but are not portable and could not be moved from hall to hall.

**How many FM frequencies are there?** There are 10 wide band frequencies (channels) and 77 narrow band frequencies (channels). For square dance venues, the wide band channels are used.

**What is the recommended frequency to use?** CALLERLAB has recommended the use of a wide band channel at a frequency of 72.9 MHz. By having a standardized frequency, dancers who own receivers can attend a variety of dances and travel outside of their home area without having to change frequencies. Sometimes a different channel frequency must be used because of local radio interference, and sometimes because more than one hall is set up for simultaneous operation on different channels.

**What are the components of an FM hearing enhancement system?** The system is composed of a transmitter and a receiver. Multiple receivers can be used with one transmitter. The transmitter plugs into the caller's/cueer's amplifier and sends the "Voice Only" signal

to the receivers. A battery powered receiver is worn by each dancer using the system.

**Are there multiple channel transmitters and receivers?** Most manufacturers make multiple channel units. It is important to remember that there are 10 wide band frequencies in the ADA band plan. At a large square dance convention or festival, several different channel frequencies may be in use. At the 64<sup>th</sup> NSDC®, the primary channel will operate on 72.9 MHz. Other channels must also be used in order to prevent radio interference between adjacent dance halls. Each hall will have a sign posted near the caller/cuer position where the transmitter frequency will be displayed. The dancer should tune to the “active” channel when entering a different dance hall.

**Can there be bleed over between adjoining halls if transmitters are being used on the same channel in both halls?** Yes. A receiver will pick up the strongest signal. If halls are adjoining (or if they are upstairs/downstairs from each other), it is best to use different frequencies. The 64<sup>th</sup> NSDC® will have a carefully considered channel plan designed to insure that no radio interference will occur between dance halls.

**How does the dancer couple the receiver to his/her ear?** Many dancers use a small rubber tip (ear plug) that is inserted into the ear. These tips can be easily cleaned and stay in place while dancing. Other dancers use an ear speaker or a set of headphones. A thin cable runs from the belt-pack receiver to the ear device. The dancer has a volume control on the receiver.

**Why do dancers buy their own receivers?** Many dancers choose to buy their own receivers. They do this for personal reasons, including ease of travel between groups (they can use it with different clubs on different nights), sanitary reasons, and to assure that a receiver is available whenever they want to use it.

**What brand of system should one buy?** There are several manufacturers of hearing enhancement systems. An Internet search will easily take you to them. One should

compare features, quality, ease of use, durability, price, etc., and make decisions accordingly. A good approach might be to consult with someone who understands the technology and the application. Above all, remember to purchase “ADA Compliant” equipment to insure interoperability with other ADA Compliant systems, no matter where you travel and dance.

**Who should buy the system?** The answer to this question depends upon your personal needs. Some dancers have purchased complete systems. Some transmitter units have been purchased by clubs and their members buy their own receivers. Some systems are shared by several groups using the same hall.

**Can dancers use their personal receivers at places other than square and round dances?** Yes. They can use the receiver at any establishment that uses an ADA Compliant system. This includes churches, theaters, auditoriums, museums with walking tours, court rooms, etc.

**The 64<sup>th</sup> NSDC® will provide ADA Compliant Hearing Assist transmitters in square and round dance hall. Look for the channel frequency posted near er/cuer position.**



## AGAPE SQUARES NICEVILLE

Hi, from the **Agape Squares** in Niceville, Florida. The Club that has taught so many dancers through the years, who have now gone on to join new Square Dance groups that have formed in the area. The Club usually meets on Monday nights from 7:00-9:00pm at the Crosspoint Methodist Church (formerly The First United Methodist Church). If we are teaching a new class, we hold it from 6:00-7:00pm on Monday nights.

Our Caller, Berlon Graham is trying a new method of teaching to encourage the participation of new square dancers. He has divided the square dance moves into three class levels. The Basic Level, dances from 6:00 to 7:00pm, Mainstream work-shop is from 7:00 to 8:00pm, and the Plus Level workshop/ Dance is from 8:00 to 9:00pm. We have had a good turn-out of dancers, up to 5 squares, and everyone seems to be having a good time.

We graduated our first Basic Level class on January 26<sup>th</sup>, and started a new Basic Level class, of twenty students on February 23<sup>rd</sup>. The new class includes at least six couples, as opposed to the usual participation of predominately single dancers.

The new method of teaching is working out, so that the graduates of the Basic Level help angel the new class and continue to learn in the Mainstream workshop. The Mainstream graduates, angel and help the beginners at the Mainstream level, and the veteran Plus Level dancers help with all three levels. In this way, everyone is able to dance at their level at some point during the evening, and can also continue to learn new moves, depending on how late they wish to stay during the course of the evening.

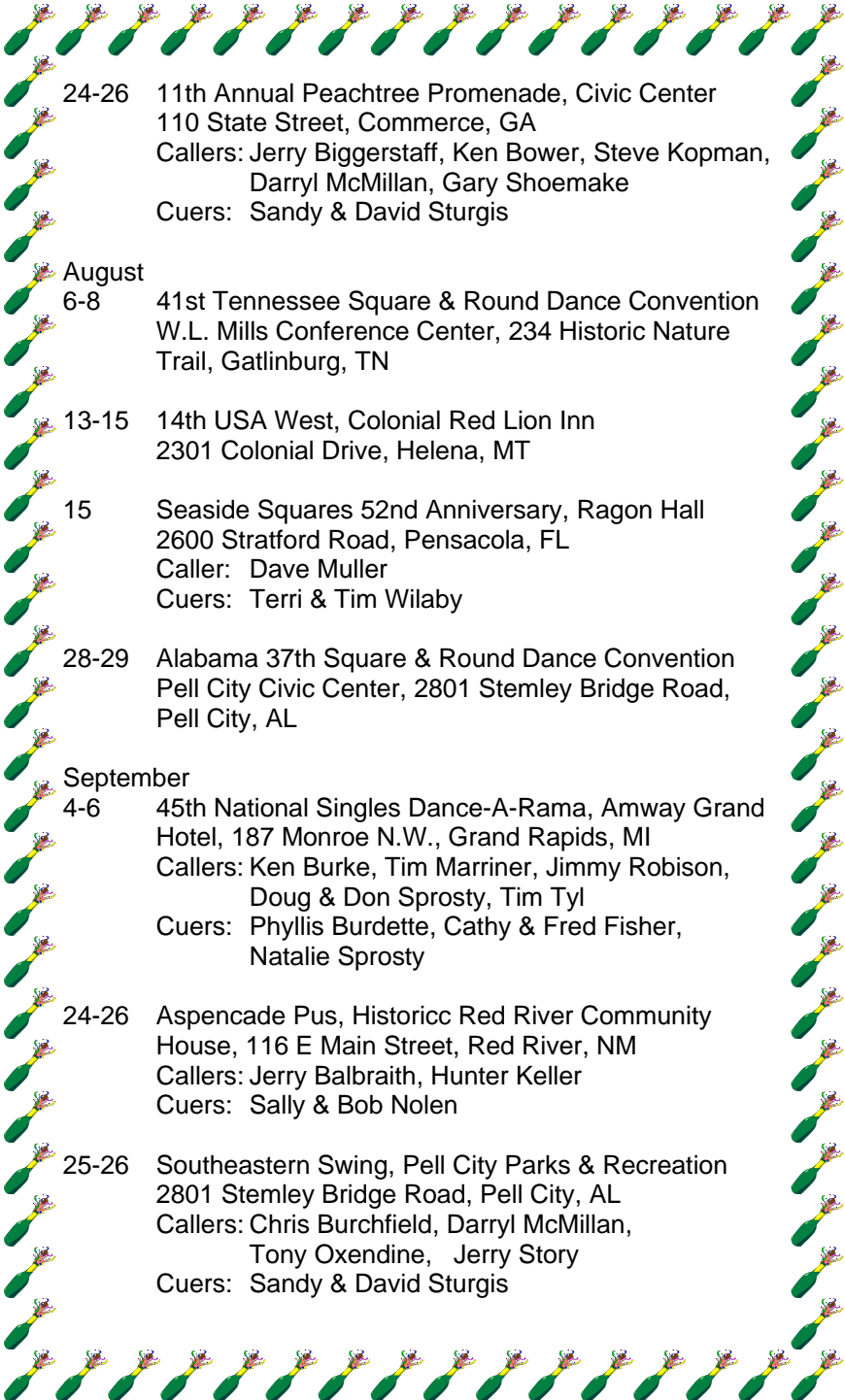

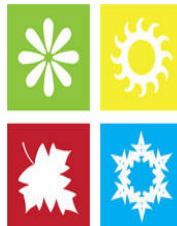

Square Dancing: From the Outside Looking In

Two native New England callers are featured at this year's keynote address. Paul Cote (now of Texas) and Ted Lizotte (of New Hampshire), will try and take a step out of the box and take a look at our activity from "outside the dance hall".

Paul and Ted began calling together in 1988 as "The Duo!" Despite some resistance by "the establishment" they quickly became New England favorites, known for their singing calls and harmonies as well as their on stage chemistry.

In the 26+ years as Ted and Paul have been calling, many things within the dance hall have remained the same – things outside the activity have not. During their Keynote Presentation they hope to shine a light on some of these items, to hopefully spark conversation and ideas about how to embrace change rather than resist it. They hope you'll join them at 1:00pm Friday in the MassMutual Center Arena.

## Frequently Asked Questions

1. We will be driving to the convention. We need to know where to park our car where it will be safe as we attend the convention. We want the most economical means available. We are not familiar with the area.

**Answer:** Springfield is growing and parking lots are being taken out of service for construction of a casino. Parking is at a premium. If you are housed at any hotels listed with Convention Registration & Housing, you may leave your car parked at your hotel, buy a bus pass (\$50 per person) and do all your travel on a bus to and from the Convention Center. We have created four bus routes for hotel transportation to reduce the length of time on the bus. From the hotels outside the routed area, park your car at the Eastern States Exposi-

tion / Big E gated lot. There is bus transportation exclusively for the parking and camping. A bus pass at \$50 per person is required to be transported back to your car (no parking fee). The Big E is 1.5 miles from the Convention Center.

2. If I don't eat seafood, have food allergies, or am looking for vegetarian selections, what food choices will I have in Springfield?

Answer: All restaurants will make exceptions, offering vegetarian selections as well as their specialties. Springfield offers food options of poultry, beef, pork as well as seafood. We have fast food and full meals at any level of sophistication you desire. If you enjoy ethnic foods, we have that as well. Check at the Convention Center for our "Eating Out" display with the restaurant map and menus from the multitude of restaurants in Springfield. They all know you're coming!

3. Do we square dance at any time during any of the tours. I am wondering about how to pack for this. I would love to leave stuff in the car and take only what is needed.

Answer: All Half-day, 1-day and Multi-day tours during the week do not include dancing. We will be square dancing only on the 6-day New England Adventure Tour. We will dance in all 6 states so you can earn your USDA Traveler's Badge signatures. These dances will be short "more like a flash mob" in casual traveling clothes - no dressing up for these dances.

4. Are there any hidden costs, gratuities to be added, extra items that must be purchased while on tour? I am talking about big expenses.

Answer: No, everything is included in the tour price. When purchasing meals or merchandise on your own, expect sales tax of not more than 7%. If you feel that a person did a great job, please extend them the extra gratuities.

5. How does the insurance work as far as cancellations, if we have to cancel any events?

Answer: Follow the cancellation policy on the Insurance Application Form from the [64nsdc.org](http://64nsdc.org) website set up by The Travel Group.

6. Is there any free time on the tours?

Answer: On any of the Half-day, 1-day and Multi-Day tours, the Tours Brochure will indicate meals, shopping and free time on your own. On the 6-Day New England Adventure, we have specific times for some arranged tours and events with short times for browsing & visiting.

7. Is there a shuttle to and from the airport and Amtrak?

Answer: Yes, for Bradley International Airport, contact Valet Park of America 1-800-599-8916. For you on Amtrak, take a taxi waiting outside the station.

8. Can we buy a bus pass after we get to the Convention?

Answer: Yes, we offer two different bus passes. For contracted hotels through our Convention Registration & Housing, you can purchase a bus pass when you pick up your packet for \$60 (\$50 prior to Convention). For non-contracted hotels, we strongly urge you to buy the Park & Ride Shuttle Pass for \$50 per person (this includes the parking fee and issues you the auto admission tag for your mirror). Originating at the Eastern States Exposition / Big E / Convention Campground this is a secure parking area for your personal vehicle parking. The parking lot at the Big E is 1.5 miles from the Convention Center supplied by an exclusive bus route. Your hotel reservation will verify your ability to purchase this Big E pass.

9. Is there any dancing earlier in the week?

Answer: Yes, starting Sun, Mon, & Tues there will be round dancing at the Sheraton Hotel with Roundalab. Check the website for Trail Thru dances prior to convention and dancing schedules in Springfield the week of convention.

10. If we go on the 6-Day New England Adventure, where do we park our car and where do we stay after we get back?

Answer: To prepare for the 6 day tour, you must sign in at the Sheraton Monarch Place Hotel and board your lug-

gage on the bus. For those returning to the Sheraton, your extra luggage can be stored at the hotel for your return. Those needing secure parking, you will drive to the Big E Gated lot and be picked up there by the bus. After the tour, you will be returned to your vehicle. ## Better Dance Hall Sound – In The “Big Halls”

What to expect at the 64<sup>th</sup> National Square Dance Convention®

A few years ago, I attended a National Square Dance Convention where I overheard two couples having a conversation in the hallway. One couple told the other “We just left the Plus Hall with a headache after three tips.” So, why did they have a headache?

These days, convention centers are frequently being used for National Square Dance Conventions and the acoustics in those big concrete exhibit halls are extremely harsh. The sound systems are set up at the front of the dance hall and the caller turns up the volume until the dancers at the back of the hall indicate they can hear. The speakers are mounted on stands, but not really high enough for the size of the hall. The “Nationals” hire contractors to provide sound in the dance halls. The 64<sup>th</sup> NSDC® will hire two sound contractors, one for the “big halls” and another for all the other halls.

At our convention, the contractor for the 2 biggest halls will be a local company that provides sound systems for concerts, college graduation ceremonies, etc. In June 2013, we invited the company owner to a benefit dance that we ran in the venue that will be

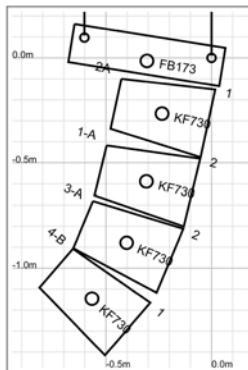
our big Plus hall so that we could teach him a few things about our activity. The most important thing we taught him was the importance of every dancer being able to understand every word spoken by the caller. We had him come back with a sound system for our Pre-Convention dance in the same venue in February 2014.

In between June 2013 and February 2014, a concept for sounding the same hall was discussed at length. There were two serious problems that needed mitigation:

In a typical large hall, the dancers at the front of the dance floor are blasted with high volume in order for the dancers at the back to be able to hear.

In a hall with poor acoustics, the sound that reflects from the hard surfaces will produce standing waves that result in unintelligible speech, especially near the back.

Two of the speaker arrays shown were used, each one supported high above the floor:



At the top is a mounting bracket, to which 4 separate speakers are attached and hanging. The mechanical supporting arrangement is such that the 4 speakers are at different angles relative to the dance floor. The top speaker is projecting towards the back of the

dance floor, the bottom speaker is projecting towards the front of the dance floor, and the 2 middle speakers are projecting towards intermediate areas of the dance floor. The sound system provides for individual control of the volume for each speaker. This results in the ability to push more sound towards the back of the hall, less towards the front, etc. Because of the speaker height, each dancer has a direct, unobstructed path between their ears and the speakers.

Elevating the speaker arrays high above the dance floor, and tilting them at an appropriate angle, achieves mitigation of the reflected sound. Think about this. What if the sound coming from the speaker was angled downward and reflected from the floor rather than reaching the back wall directly. The sound reflecting from the floor would be traveling upwards when it reaches the back wall. That sound is now traveling upwards towards the ceiling where it will be reflected again. This third reflection sends any remaining energy down towards the front of the dance floor (where the sound from the speakers is the loudest). The reflected sound that reaches the front of the dance floor has bounced 3 times and is so weak that it is barely noticed.

The results achieved with this approach were outstanding. The same arrangement of 4 speakers in a stack, with a stack on each side of the caller, will be used in our big Plus Hall. This is Exhibit Hall B in the MassMutual Center.

A similar system will be used in the Arena where the Live Music dancing will take place with the Ghost Riders Square Dance Band. In this case, the speaker stacks will be increased from 4 speakers in a stack to 8 speakers in a stack. The band will be located at one end of the Arena with a stack on each side of the stage. In this case, the speaker stacks will be "hung" from above rather than using a Genie Lift as we are doing in the Plus Hall.



## TNT ROUNDS PENSACOLA

We certainly enjoyed our holidays, how about you? Just enough of a refreshing break so we could come back to teaching the next class, Waltz. The class has settled into a steady roster of 26 students. And they are such a delight to teach!

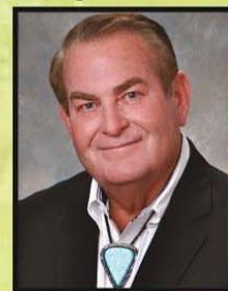
