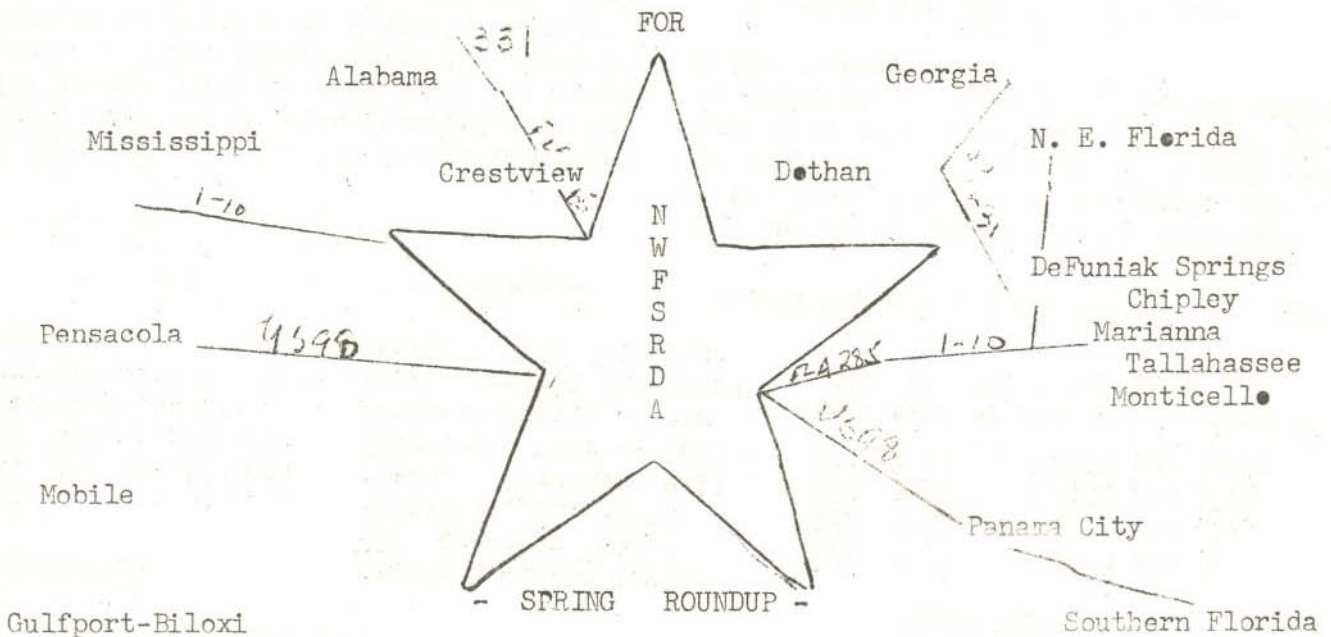

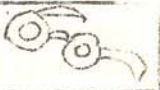
There will be square and round dancing at all levels, clogging, trail-end dances, after parties, educational seminars and clinics, showcases and tours.

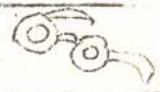

TIPS FOR SQUARE DANCERS

1. Anytime you are turning with someone else, always offer resistance with your turning arm - stiffen it slightly. This smooths out the move and enables one person to exercise control if the other person is unsure of how to do the call. Many squares break down without anyone knowing why merely because people have used limp arms and therefore lost their positioning.

But, sometimes new men dancers are too rough using arm turns with the ladies and are not aware of it. Men, make an effort to analyze whether you are being too strong in arm turns or hand grips with the ladies.

2. Some dancers tend to hold back getting in squares, perhaps waiting to be asked. But other dancers may think you do not get up because you want to sit out, therefore they will not ask you to dance. If you want to dance, be on the floor within 15 seconds after the music starts.. If you stall around, the sets will be filled and you could be left out.

This is especially important when visiting other clubs. While clubs enjoy visitors, they will not pamper their guests. If you want to dance, get on the floor.

3. Dance to as many different callers as you can. Regrettably, some callers advise new dancers not to visit other clubs and not to dance to other callers; this can only hinder the progress of new dancers.

Your caller may advise you against going to a particular club or caller because the level may be too high for you. This is all right, and you should follow his advise. But if your caller advises against visiting any clubs, do not follow advise.

By dancing to different styles of calling, you will improve your knowledge and understanding of square dancing and your ability to do the various calls.

4. Don't knock your club. Help it by being friendly and kind to all members and guests. If you are asked to help on a committee or a job, try and do so; if everyone refused to do any work, there would be no club.

5. Be bold in executing calls. Some dancers hold back on all calls, even ones they know, for fear of making a mistake. This results in the square getting behind and possibly breaking down. It also hides mistakes people are making, and these mistakes could go on being undetected for years. Then they become habits and are much harder to break.

6. Be a dancer, not a walker. (Move to the beat of the music.) Some people walk all the calls rather than dance them. This looks bad, throws the walker's timing off and quite likely throws off the timing of the entire set; result is an uncomfortable dance feeling, and the square is more likely to break down.

7. Shuffle your feet. Lifting your feet will tire you much more rapidly and will break up your dance rhythm.

8. Touch the person or persons beside you. At the completion of ANY figure, you should immediately extend your hands and take the hands of those next to you. This will help you to see the formation you are in (line, wave, etc.) and identify your partner; result is that you will be able to do the next call better.

Hands should be joined within $\frac{1}{2}$ second after the completion of any call. Failure to join hands after a call often results in sloppy lines or waves, which causes the square to break down trying to do the next call.

9. ALWAYS pass right shoulders whenever you pass thru with someone. The only exception is from a left hand wave; there you will step straight ahead.

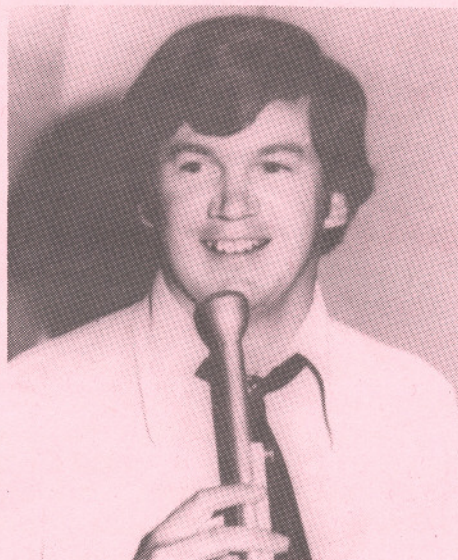

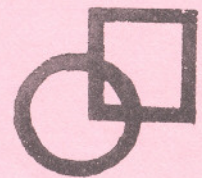
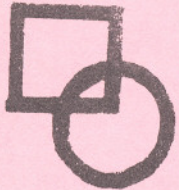
