We wish you all a Happy and Healthy New Year.

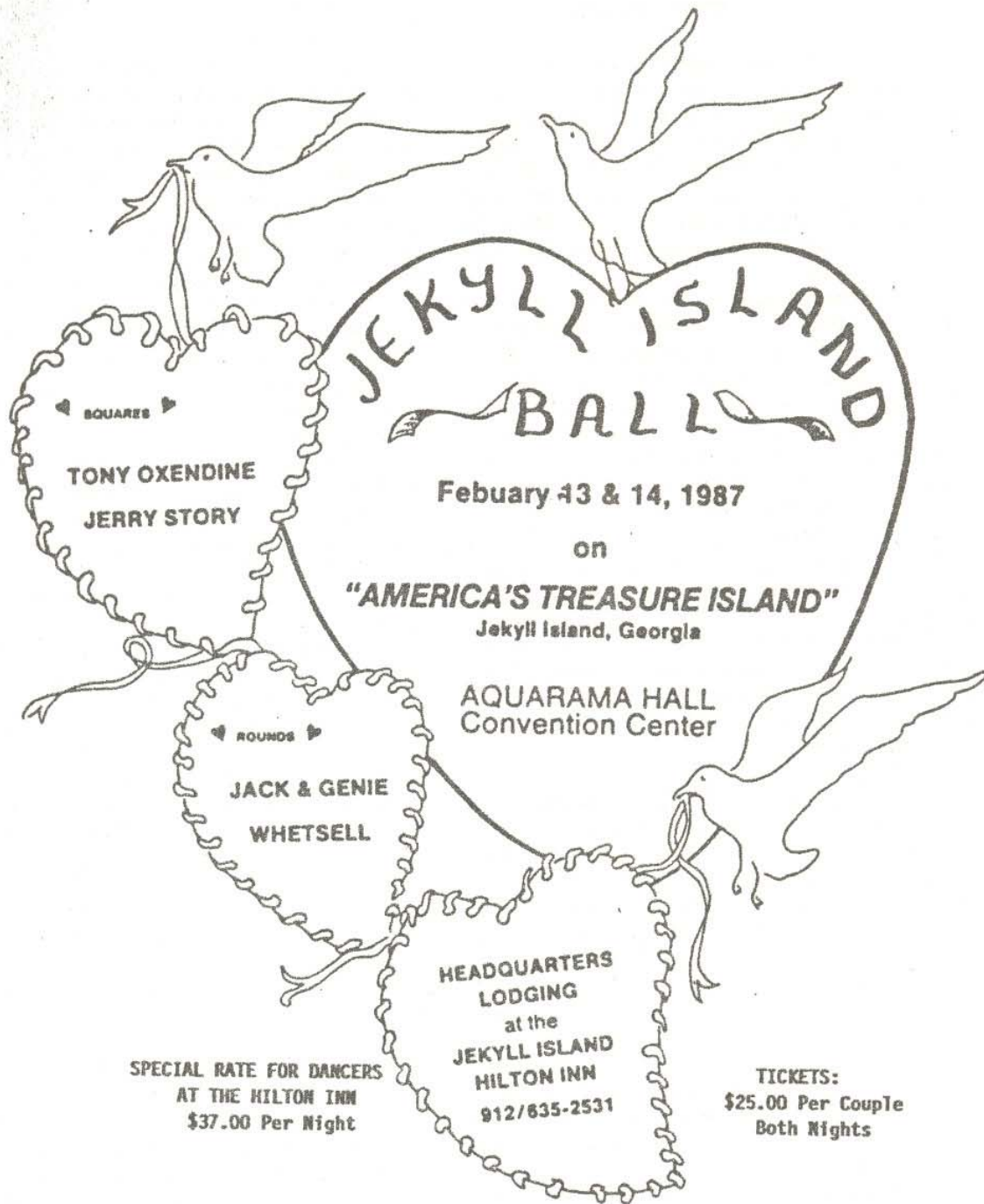

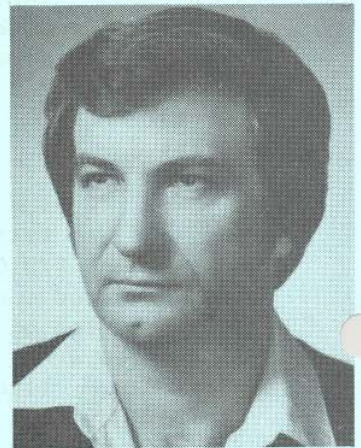

SQUARE & ROUND DANCING

The Square Dance Activity is made up of many facets of dancing. CALLERLAB recognizes this fact and encourages its members to become conversant with others than just square dance calling. The callers have a responsibility to provide a pleasurable program for the dancers. Quite frequently, to provide variety, Round Dancing is included in this program.

While some square dance callers do not include rounds in their program, CALLERLAB'S official position is that squares and rounds go together. They are part of the same family tree. CALLERLAB has an active Round Dance Committee which selects a "Round of the Quarter" for suggested use by its members. It was at CALLERLAB'S request that ROUNDALAB developed a manual for callers who wish to introduce rounds into their square dance program. Dual membership in CALLERLAB and ROUNDALAB is not at all uncommon and CALLERLAB teachers participate in round dancing.

If your area does not include round dancing in its square dance program, encourage your leaders -- callers, cuers, dancers -- to develop a way of including it especially at the Basic, Mainstream and Plus dance programs. All will benefit from it. Squares and Rounds, do, indeed, go together. What the proper balance may be at any particular dance should be at the pleasure of the dancers and worked out cooperatively between the caller and the cuer.

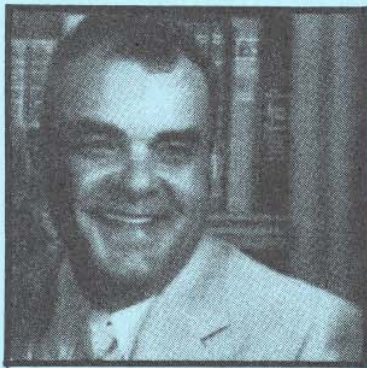

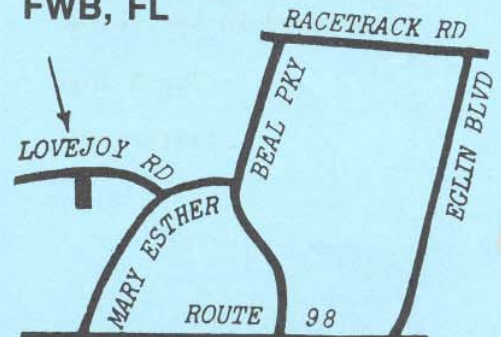

NATIONAL ORGANIZATIONS

What do LEGACY, CALLERLAB, ROUNDALAB, USDA, NSDD, and NSDC have in common? Not the least of these is the fact that they are organizations whose members are dedicated to the premise that the Square Dance Activity in all of its facets, to include Squares, Rounds, Contras, Clogging, Traditional, etc. is the greatest form of recreation there is.

LEGACY is a non-profit international assembly of Trustees representing all facets of Square Dancing, including dancers, callers, cuers, suppliers, publishers, and special interest groups. It is a service leadership organization interested in developing better communication among the many facets of the square dance activity. LEGACY is probably best known for its world wide dancer surveys and leadership seminars.

CALLERLAB is an international association of square dance callers. It is made up of callers who give their time, talent, and resources to promote, promulgate, and improve square dancing in all its forms. CALLERLAB is best known for standardizing the calls and calling techniques throughout the world which now permits dancers from the four corners of the world to dance at any location.

ROUNDALAB is an international association of round dance teachers and brings together round dance teachers from around the world who work to standardize steps and cues, delineate and describe the various levels of round dancing, and promote and improve the activity.

UNITED SQUARE DANCERS OF AMERICA is a national association of square dancers, formed by square dancers, for square dancers and operated by square dancers. USDA is known for its representation of the dancers to other national and international organizations, insurance program for dancers, support and promotion of handicapped dancers, educational programs, support of designation of

square dancing as the National Folk Dance, Commemorative postal stamp, and other activities.

NATIONAL SQUARE DANCE DIRECTORY publishes the directory yearly for all dancers, leaders, organizations and special interest groups.

NATIONAL SQUARE DANCE CONVENTION is an organization with the express purpose of conducting the "World's Greatest Square Dance Event" - the National Square Dance Convention each year.

NATIONAL SQUARE DANCE DIRECTORY

The 1987 edition of the National Square Dance Directory includes a new section covering square dance sewing and crafts. This part of the Directory features helpful hints for all seamstresses, novice through expert. Along with these hints are advertisements for patterns, fabrics, fasteners, sewing books, notions etc. If you like to create your own square dance apparel or would like to learn how, the Directory has a section especially for you.

The Directory has many other sections to aid dancers, callers and leaders alike. The club listings include type of club, program of dancing, when and where dances are scheduled and a contact's name, address and phone number. There is a "New Dancer" section with information of square dance history, etiquette and other items. Directories of festivals, publications, organizations, callers, and leaders are among the many other informative sections. Details on square, round, contra, and clogging products and services add to the usefulness of this publication.

25-WEEK LEARN TO DANCE PROGRAM

Red Bates, Chairman of the Special Committee established to review the Mainstream and Plus Programs to develop a 25-Week Learn to Dance Program, announced the completion of the committee's work, a monumental task involving many iterations of ideas back and forth within the USA and Canada. Results reflect the surveys and thinking of many leaders and are offered to those callers and clubs who wish to try an experimental program. It is designed for areas and clubs who have requested it, using the most popular calls from the Mainstream and Plus Programs. The listing of calls reflects the same numbering scheme used on the existing Mainstream Program and all Plus calls which are included are identified with a (*Plus*) following the call.

Calls from the Mainstream or Plus lists not included in this program should be taught

through workshops following the formal instruction period. This program is designed as a "feeder" program for Plus clubs. Individual modifications to suit local conditions are anticipated. *No* effort should be made to pressure anyone into teaching with this experimental program unless the sponsoring organization makes that decision.

Generally speaking, only standard and the more common formations and arrangements are recommended. If one tries to use all allowable formations and arrangements for each call, this program *CANNOT* be completed in 25 weeks.

We urge any callers and clubs who use this program to document their experience so that CALLERLAB can review and consider any proposed changes prior to formal adoption. If you have any questions, please communicate them, in writing, to CALLERLAB, Box 679, Pocono Pines, PA 18350.

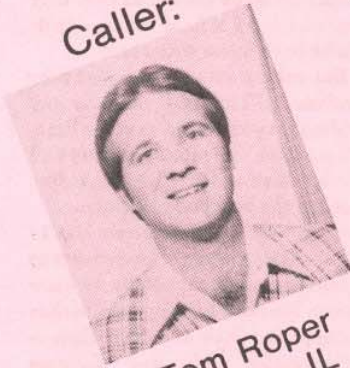

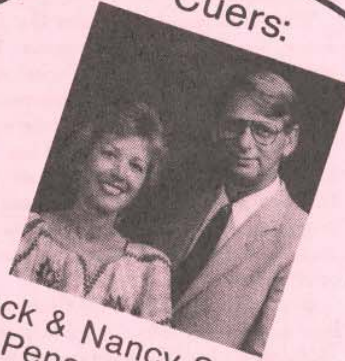

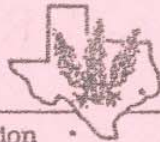
