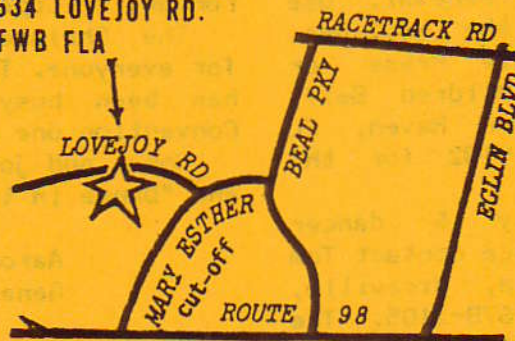

An article in the November 1988 edition of AMERICAN SQUARE DANCE MAGAZINE indicated that two callers recently made a visit to China and that a number of Chinese were in attendance at the National Convention in Anaheim, CA. Some of this group stayed for an additional period in California for some calling instruction by Caller Jack Murtha of Yuba City, CA.

Not only will the Club be Florida's Ambassadors, but they will certainly be "Handicapable Dancing's Ambassadors on this trip.
