NORTHWEST FLORIDA SQUARE AND ROUND DANCE ASSOCIATION

HISTORY OF THE ASSOCIATION

This is the ninth in a series of articles covering the history of the Northwest Florida Square & Round Dance Association. The purpose of these articles is to record the events which resulted in the association we have today.

Dateline 1982

This was a banner year for the Association under the able leadership of its President Frank & Betty McCallister.

1. The Newsletter, The Panhandle Press, continued to improve. Joy Richardson was editor. Jack Larusso and Joe Vaccari were on the staff. Distribution to individual members was initiated. Six (6) issues a year were published. A special Christmas issue contained many ads from dancers and callers extending greetings to all. Copies printed: 400.
2. The 1982 Northwest Square Dancers Cookbook was compiled by Belle Bishop and Joy Vaccari. Three hundred copies were printed and a free copy given to Roundup attendees. Others were sold at \$2.00 each.
3. The 8th Annual Roundup was held in Chipley with Elmer Sheffield, Jack Lasry and the Smoyers. The 29th State Convention-Star Thru in '82-was held in Lakeland. The National Convention was in Detroit. Many Northwest dancers attended these events.
4. The first mid-year meeting of the United Square Dancers of America (USDA) was held in Pasarda Hall. Representatives from throughout the country were in attendance. The Belles & Beaus hosted a special dance for the attendees.
5. The Treasurer reported a balance of \$3,490.81 at years end. Individual membership stood at 182 as of March 1982. Club membership was 22.
6. Callerlab announced the following quarterly selections: Hinge and Flutter, Release the Column and Red Hot.
7. The following officers were elected to serve in 1983 and were installed at the Roundup:

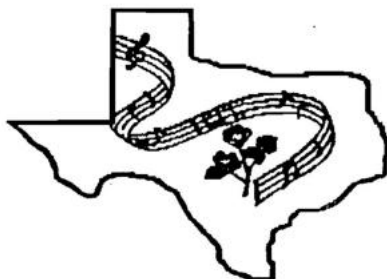

LEGACY

Paradigms in our Square Dance Activity

LEGACY, the International Assembly of "Trustees" of the Square Dance Activity, in conjunction with the National Square Dance Convention, presented two one-hour sessions each day at the June National Square Dance Convention. A number of LEGACY trustees served as moderators and panelists at these daily sessions in Birmingham, Alabama.

Much has been said and written about the changes that have been, and are, occurring within the square dance activity. Using the quote that "Dance, to survive, cannot remain unchanged, and like any living thing, must either develop or disappear," the first session concentrated on why the picture has changed, and the need to look beyond certain stereotyped ideas or boundaries that are possibly keeping some positive changes from being made. It was noted that modern technology has made major changes in callers' and cuers' equipment, as well as aid for the hearing-impaired dancer. Also noted was how the dress code has been modified to include prairie skirts.

A lively but thoughtful and positive discussion occurred as the attendees began to reflect on current practices. Suggested were some brand new approaches to making the square dance activity more marketable, new methods of recruitment with different approaches to conducting classes. They also touched upon different positive approaches they thought the National Executive Committee of the NSDC should try, and way in which the major organizations could work together. As the group left, all were given a "pair of dimes" to remind them that what seems impossible today could be done tomorrow to enhance the

activity and lead us into the 21st century.

The second hour dealt with the topic, "Planning a Year of FUN-filled Activities." This session enlarged upon a quote from Sigmund Freud that, "Every human being needs some positive things to look forward to." Reminding all that when events are scheduled and planned with lots of lead time, there is a much better change that they will be presented well and enjoyed by both dancers AND planners, the moderator and panelists proceeded to discuss the three-page hand-out outlining eighteen months of fun-filled activities. Twelve points were offered for the planning of every successful activity. Several times during the audience participation periods, the additional successful ideas and activities described by the attendees came faster than the pen could record!

All agreed that setting and attitude, along with the planning, go a long way to making a good time. Also stressed was the importance of being super-friendly and really meaning it. Having a new member work along with a "seasoned" couple on a fun activity was mentioned as one way to ease new members into becoming actively involved. When the hour was over, participants continued their sharing of ideas in the hallways.

"GO FOR THE MAGIC" NATIONAL CONVENTION PLANS CONTINUE TO UNFOLD

On September 29, the 46th NSDC Committee Chairmen took part in a "Hard Hat Tour" of the Orange County Convention Center and the facilities are truly awesome.

As previously reported there will be a total of 20 air conditioned dance halls comprising a total of 385,000 square feet of dance space. After seeing the areas being set aside for dancing we can honestly say that we've never before had the pleasure of dance floors so suited to square and round dancers enjoyment. It is safe to say that even the most particular dancer will find nothing to complain about here.

When dancers arrive at the Convention Center they will be able to pick up their Registration Packets with ease. The area set aside for this purpose is convenient to both of the main entrances of the facility.

With up to 90 busses available, travel to and from the Center will be no problem. All hotels and motels which are listed on your registration form will be serviced by these busses, with several available at each location during peak hours. Bus Passes will be available on your registration form for a

charge of \$20 for a four-day pass. Plus you can ride the I-Ride system at a minimal charge. The I-Ride operates from 7am to 12 midnight, with a bus arriving every 10 minutes at each of the 45 stops along its route.

There will be plenty of parking (at least 5000 spaces) at the facility for those who choose to drive in. Upon arrival at the facility the driver and each passenger will be given a Free One-Day Pass for the I-Ride enabling them to go anywhere on International Drive without having to move their car.

With numerous areas set aside for grabbing a quick bite to eat and vendors with everything imaginable for sale, the Committees of the 46th NSDC have planned for your every need. And of course if you choose to leave the Convention Center there are many restaurants and shops to be found on International Drive.

For all this and more, plan to attend the 46th National Square Dance Convention in Orlando, June 25-28, 1997
