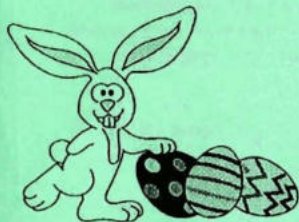


The Festival will be held at Grand Square Hall January 17 and 18. Chuck Myers will call and Lynn and Bob Van Atta will cue.

"1997-A NEW BEGINNING"

Well, since I am the newly-elected President of the Northwest Florida Callers' Association, this should be a logical time to try and fire-up the square dancers in the Northwest area to make 1997 a new and successful year for all clubs and dancers. This can be accomplished if we all can in some small individual way be a positive dancer ready to assist in not only club functions, but area functions, such as association dances, both dancer and caller-sponsored functions.

As we all know, the Panhandle area needs a kick in the pants, so to speak, to increase our dancer participation. Our #1 agenda, of course, is to pursue and increase the number of dancers through square dance classes. Consider the method that might accomplish this. There seems to be a trend nation-wide to have short-term classes, such as a 10-week course, followed

by another 10-week course and again by another 10-week course. The whole idea, of course, is to have a continued course of action on an on-going new class that would start every 10 weeks instead of every 44 weeks. This can be done if clubs and callers will cooperate together. The callers should run weekly classes for 2 hours each and every last week of the month should be devoted to a bonafide hoedown geared to the dance level of the student. All clubs should participate together in the hoedown dance by joining each other for one big dance - maybe even sharing profits after expenses.

I know this appears to be a pretty big step for the clubs and callers to take, but we must find a way to increase our dance program in the Panhandle area. If the clubs could work together on this project, I know it will work. The hoedown should possibly be on a Saturday or Sunday night, so as not to interfere with club functions.

I would like very much to hear from all the dancers who would care to enhance and add to this idea. Maybe by some strange and wonderful way, the square dancing in our area might very well take an up-swing, which we so desperately need.

As an afterthought, we all know that the Panhandle area is loaded with facilities to handle our needs. We have square dance halls in all areas - Ragon Hall in Pensacola, Pasarda Hall in Fort Walton Beach, and Grand Square Hall in Panama City, as well as facilities which are now being used for club functions. What I would like to see happen is --- everybody talk to everybody and let's start a trend that will spark the whole square dance world into watching the Florida Panhandle grow into what it once was a few years ago. That is, a place for everyone to come and enjoy this wonderful activity of ours. I will personally do all I can to further the success of this endeavor. May I ask each and every one of you to do the same?

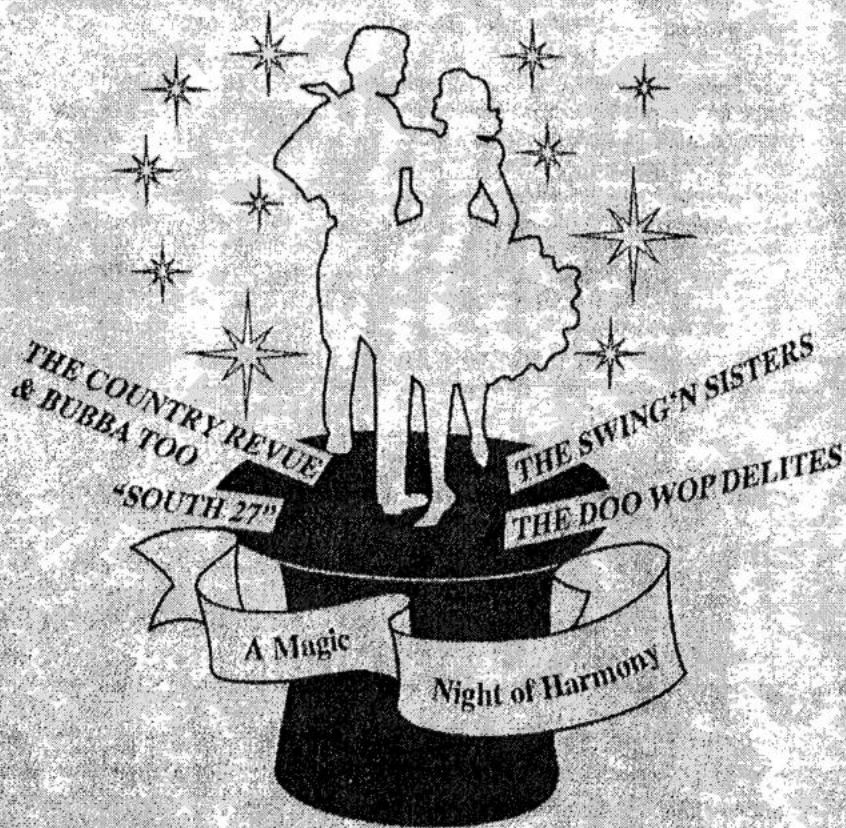
We also send our condolences to Ann Poyner on the recent loss of her father, Harron Coon, Sr. The following is a note of thanks we received from Ann:
