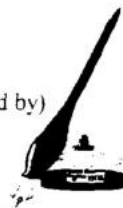

THERE'S STILL ROOM AT THE INN FOR BALTIMORE 2000[®] SQUARE DANCERS

We've made our list and checked it twice. And the good news is that not only are there hotels rooms from which to choose, but space is still available also at the campground and at Towson State University, site of our campus housing. We have space at some nice hotels downtown, as well as at those away from the center of the city.

Remember that parking at hotels away from the city center is usually free, and there will be shuttle service to the convention center from all hotels on the convention registration form.
