The daily schedules, that come only with the Program Book, include the dance schedules, the room number and location of all educational events. The daily schedules are pocket size and can easily be carried while at the Convention.

The Sew and Save Book has helpful sewing tips, information about the dresses on display, and information about the sewing machines being used in the Sew and Save Room. If you're sewing your own clothes, this book should be able to offer some wonderful tips to help shorten your sewing time.

The Syllabi for the Rounds, Clogging and Contra include dancing routines for each of these types of dancing.
