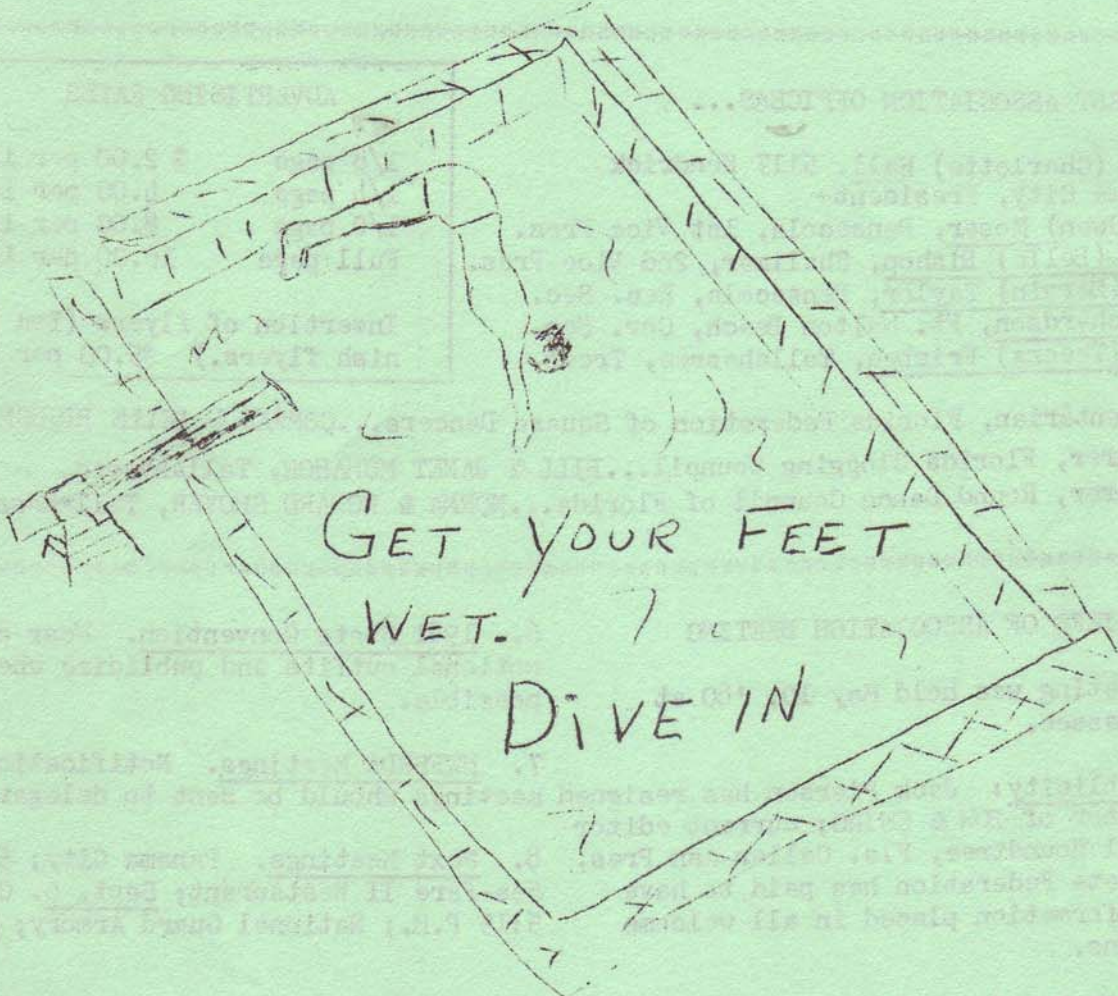

LEGACY... FLORIDA LEADS...

Square dancing is alive and well in Florida! But alive and GREAT would be better, says Esther Stoltz. Esther and her husband Walter of Bartow, Florida along with George & Judy Garland, Jim & Bunny Whiteman of NE Florida Assoc.; and Chet & Julia Vetter, WC Assoc. - all of them LEGACY Trustees - were panelists at a recent LEADS meeting at Fort Walton Beach for NWFSRDA and area dancers, callers and leaders.

LEADS stands for Leadership, Education And Dancers Seminars.

TOPICS of Discussion - Association & Club Representatives (Delegates) or officers and their duties. It was pointed out that Delegates are expected to attend association meetings or make positive arrangements for an alternate to attend in his place.

One of the most important functions of the delegate is to carry back to his club a full report. They are expected to attend, when possible, all association functions such as Roundups, etc and to urge their clubs to attend.

Tips on how to be good listeners, the Art of Leadership, the Perfect Club; Question and Answer periods concerning dancer-caller cooperation, levels of dance, etc. - all this and much more was covered.

DANCERS MUST BALANCE CALLERLAB - Square dancing has been subject to many changes in the past few years and it may be questionable as to whether all these changes are for the better.

Do you think it possible that many of these changes are a result of the opinions of a minority, but highly vocal, group within the movement?

Who dictates policy? Are Leaders mainly listening to the minority? It is unquestionably the responsibility of the experienced square dancers and leaders to express opinions. If not, the future of square dancing can only be shaped by the minority opinion.

Most callers sincerely want to please the dancers and are anxious to improve the movement - so let YOUR caller know your ideas.

"..Callers are only one small segment of a very large fraternity. For the benefit of the whole, every segment has

need of a floor to voice opinions and discuss directions. LEGACY must provide a place," says Charlie Baldwin who is one of the founders of Legacy.

CALLERLAB...

The Mainstream Program has been revised as follows: Dropped- Inside Out, Outside In, & Single File Turn Back; Added- Touch to a Wave, Touch $\frac{1}{4}$, Alamo Style/Balance, Turn Thru, 8-Chain Thru, Sweep $\frac{1}{4}$, Pass to the Center, & Spin the Top. Touch & Touch $\frac{1}{4}$ were placed in Extended Basics. The list is now numbered (1-34) Basics; (35-47) Extended Basics; (48-68) Mainstream.

Quarterly Selection list: Dropped- Make Me a Column, Two Steps at a Time, Touch $\frac{1}{2}$, & Touch $\frac{3}{4}$. In the future there will be no new selections during the summer.

No changes in +1 or +2 lists. Cloverleaf and Spin the Top should be reviewed and used this summer.

SUBSCRIBER MEMBERSHIP is now offered to callers that meet all requirements except attendance at Callerlab Conventions. Dues are \$40.00 annually. If interested in becoming a Subscriber, get a recommendation from a Callerlab member and send it with their request and your dues to Callerlab, Box 679, Pocono Pines, PA 18350.

Fine programming offered square dancing from Mainstream (MS) to Challenge (C1) levels. Clogging and round dance programs were very much in evidence and all programs were well attended.

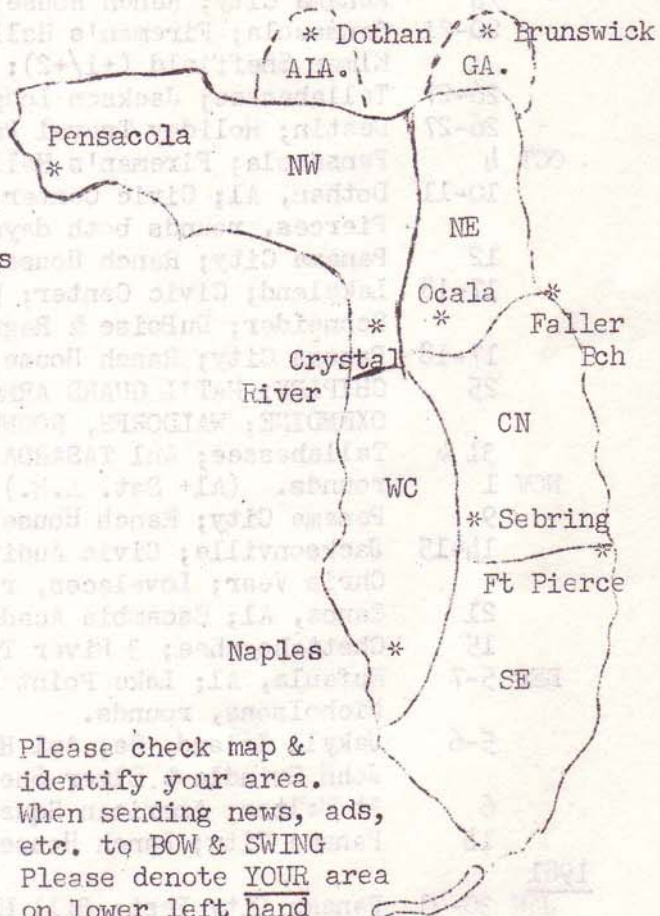
