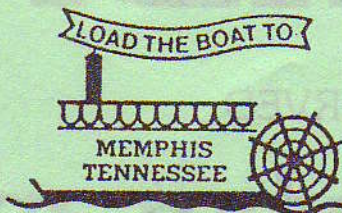

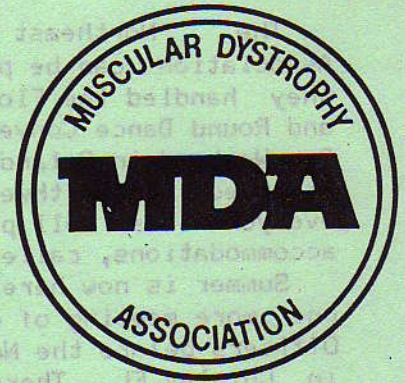

This issue also contained the current Callerlab Programs. Elaine's Kollections sported a flyer inviting all to a free dance a Ragon Hall to help celebrate their 5th Anniversary. The Cued was Les Reider.

An ad announced the Northwest Fall Roundup in Tallahassee with Wade Driver and Elmer Sheffield. Rounds were Cued by Roger and Kelly Bagwell.

LEGACY IX

Legacy held its ninth Conference May 18-21, 1989 at Reno, Nevada. The theme for this biennial meeting was "LISTEN TO THE HEARTBEAT OF THE SQUARE DANCE WORLD". Trustees attending represented many different facets of square dancing, came from 30 different states and Canada and included 28 first time attendees. Together they analyzed present day square dancing and concluded that problems can be resolved with joint effort and cooperation.

The 1989 Legacy Survey conducted this Spring received over 9000 replies so watch for the heartbeat summary in about one month.

Legacy X will be held in May, 1991 at a Mid West site.

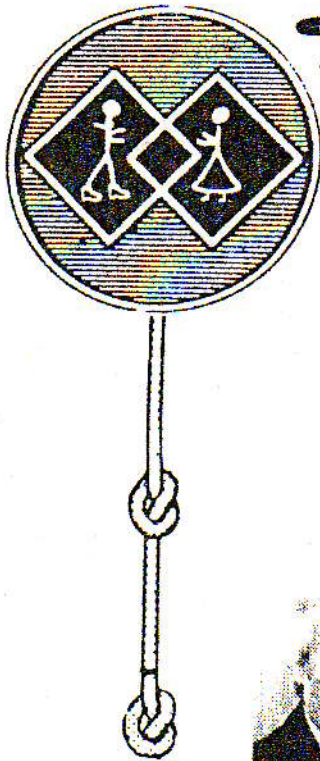

SQUARE DANCER MASTERCARD



Since introduction of the Credit Card Program Nationwide in January, 1989, hundreds of dancers have applied for and received their Square Dancers Silver Mastercard. Do you have yours? The card is available to all dancers - square, round, clogging, contra, line or heritage.

The benefits of this program to the Square Dance activity and individual dancer are many:

a. It is perhaps the best possible means of consistently bringing square dancing to the attention of the public and gaining public recognition as a social force and an economic entity.

b. The program will provide operating funds to support the square dance activity both nationally and locally. All funds will be used only to serve the activity in accordance with the USDA Charter and IRS regulations. One third of all surplus funds from the program will be returned to the affiliate for their local use.

c. The card is **FREE** for the first six months and \$20.00 per year thereafter. The annual percentage rate is 17.7%. There is a thirty day grace period if your bill is paid within one month of statement closing date.

Every dancer can promote square dancing and help their local and national associations by signing up for the Square Dancers Silver Mastercard.

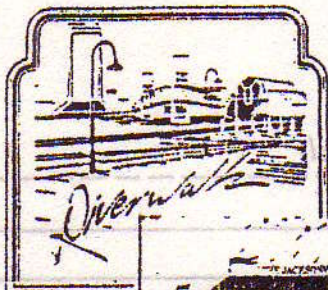

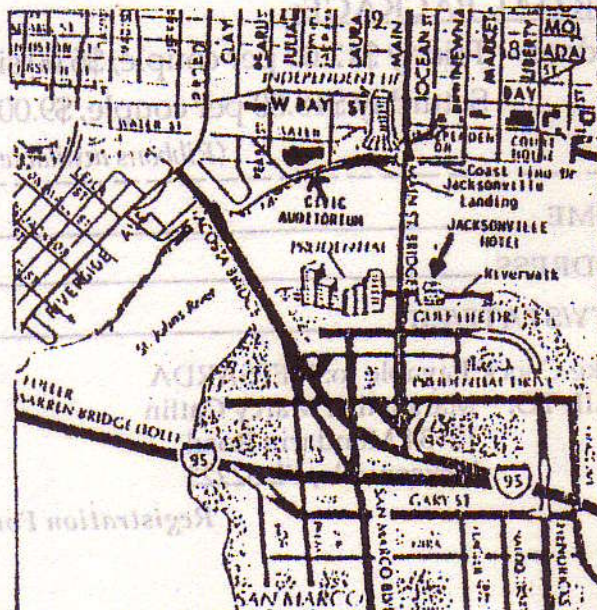
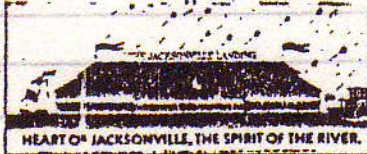
