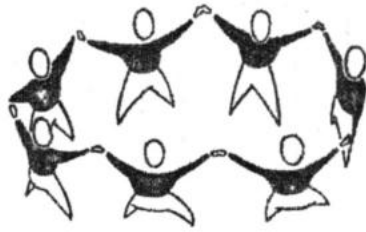

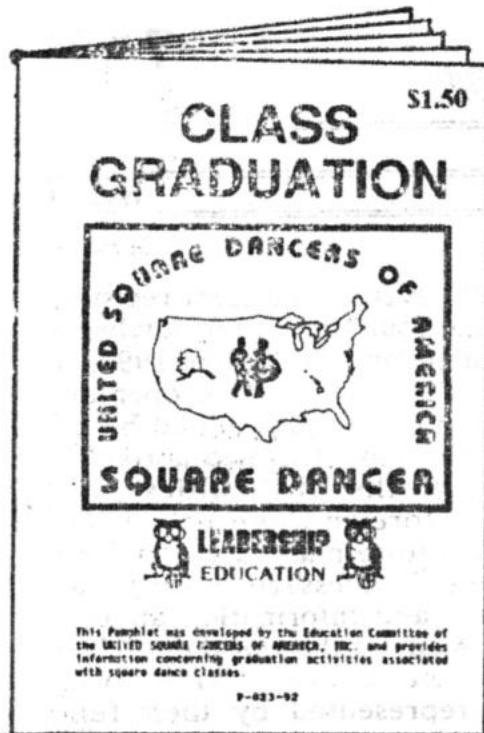

Catch the Pioneer Spirit on the Oregon Trail!

1993 marks the 150th anniversary of the Oregon Trail, the route followed by the westward pioneers who traveled from Independence, Missouri, to Oregon City, Oregon. We would like to encourage those dancers from the northwestern part of the U.S. who are traveling by RV to St. Louis this summer, to follow the route of the Oregon Trail on their way home. The actual route is closely followed by old Highway 30, close to the modern routes of U.S. 80 and U.S. 84.

Today, we can travel the Oregon Trail in a few days time, counting stops for sightseeing and relaxation. The travelers who came west from 1843 until the 1870's took approximately six months to travel over 2000 miles, at the pace of 12-15 miles a day. Imagine keeping house out of a wagon box that measured about 3 by 10 feet!

If you are planning to attend the 43rd National Square Dance Convention in Portland, and will be traveling by car or RV, you may want to consider re-tracing the Oregon Trail route! For more information, contact your public library. Many of the books written about the Oregon Trail include information about how to follow it on modern highways.

Oregon Welcomes Dancers from Overseas!

The Overseas Hospitality Committee is waiting to welcome dancers from other countries who visit the 43rd National Square Dance Convention in Portland. As of March, 1993,

we had over 100 overseas dancers registered and we hope that four times that number will actually be in attendance in June of 1994. The Overseas Hospitality Room will be open every day from 10 am until 10 pm, staffed by hosts and hostesses who have traveled abroad and know first-hand the difficulties facing travelers in a foreign land. Overseas Hospitality will feature many services for the overseas visitor: a message board, travel brochures, maps and information about the Portland area. Maps of the world dotted with pushpins will let dancers know which countries are represented by their fellow travelers. We will be giving away door prizes every day. We hope to be able to provide translator services in many languages for those travelers who find themselves having difficulties with language barriers.

The easiest access to all dancing facilities for the 43rd National Square Dance Convention in Portland will be by shuttle bus. Parking at the Convention Center is limited: Shuttle Passes are recommended for all convention attendees. The motels and hotels served by the shuttles are identified on the "Oregon 'n' More!" registration form. If you have any questions about which hotels are served by the shuttles, please stop by our registration booth at St. Louis and ask! If you are planning to stay at the RV campground, Shuttle Passes will be a necessity. Passes can be ordered when you register for the Convention for \$15.00 a person. After April 30, 1994 the cost will increase to \$20.00 per person.

THE LANGUAGE OF SQUARE DANCE PROGRAMMING

There seems to be a great deal of variety, and some confusion, regarding the designation of dance programs throughout the square dance world. At conventions, festivals, and club dances; and in various publicity releases and publications, one sees program designations such as MS+, MS Plus, Soft Plus, etc. What do these terms mean? Does MS+ indicate that the dancers should know some calls outside of the Mainstream Program? If so, which calls? Or does it mean that, in addition to Mainstream Program dancing, there will be some sort of added attraction?

Terms such as Soft Plus really tell us nothing, since the "soft" part, like beauty, is in the eye of the beholder (or, probably, the caller for the evening). When one sees the MS Plus designation, he probably assumes that the dancer will be expected to know some of the Plus Program calls. However, which Plus calls does he need to know for that particular dance or caller?

The latest publication of the CALLERLAB Basic and Mainstream Programs makes it clear with this statement: "There is NO PROGRAM called the Mainstream/Plus program. No dancer is required to know Plus calls to attend a Mainstream open dance. If such calls are used, the caller is to teach them if necessary. Please advertise dance programs as Mainstream or Plus, NOT Mainstream/Plus."

Proper program designations help dancers find a dance where they can be most comfortable and can have the greatest enjoyment. Club officers must tell callers what program they are expected to call. We need to be more specific and careful in designating dance programs. Club officers and dancers need to be more insistent that callers adhere to the advertised program. Use of vague and incorrect programming language leads to confusion and frustration. Use of the proper terms aids dancers and callers alike.

The correct program designations are shown below. Dancers should be able to dance, in accordance with their definitions, the number of basics or movements shown:

| Advanced Two (A2) | The above programs plus the 79 calls on the CALLERLAB A-2 program |
| Basic Challenge (C1) | The above programs plus the 71 calls on the CALLERLAB C-1 Program |
| Extended Challenge (C2) | The above programs plus the 71 calls on the CALLERLAB C-2 Program |
