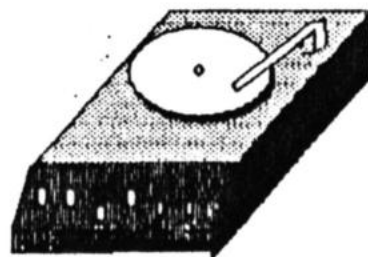

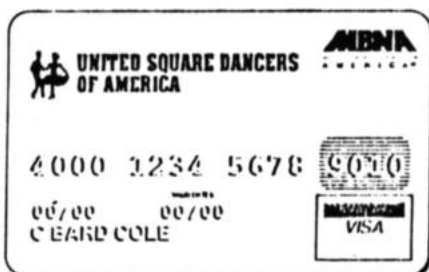

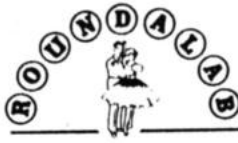

## SQUARE DANCE— AMERICAN FOLK DANCE OF THE STATES

In 1993, LEGACY's efforts to further Square Dance as the American Folk Dance were met with mixed reactions, due in part to the economy, natural disasters and other more pressing events. Against these odds, a total of 18 states have approved legislation making Square Dance and its allied dance forms their American Folk Dance, bringing the total of approving states to 38%.

Colorado dancers, with the help of their legislators, proved the ACLU wrong by becoming the 17th state to approve such legislation. Arizona with the leadership of Lyle Morrow has had SB1038 passed out of committee. Square dancers in Arizona should do all within their power to have their legislators vote in favor of the bill. Mel Tyler is making every effort to have a bill submitted in 1994, designating Square Dancing the Folk Dance of Connecticut, as are Al and Doris Moffett in Nebraska. Dick and Linda Peterson of Maryland, Paul and Glennie Lee Kirby of Mississippi and Laverne and Barbara Harrelson of South Carolina are currently guiding bills through their respective states. Lloyd and Cherie Mergel are backing a bill to be submitted to the North Dakota legislators.

Clay and Val Harris of Minnesota, Jack and Ruth Armstrong of Michigan, Bob and Dottie Elgin of Pennsylvania are actively involved in their various states and would welcome any backing their dancers can give them. Gene and Charlotte

Johnson of Wisconsin have recently been involved in a hearing covering this subject.

So far there has been no 1994 activity in Alabama, Georgia, Hawaii, Indiana, Iowa, Kansas, Kentucky, Louisiana, Maine, Missouri, Nevada, New Hampshire, New York, Ohio, Rhode Island, South Dakota and Wyoming. If anyone in these states is willing to actively lobby for legislation to make Square Dance the folk dance of their state, please contact Frank and Helen Cavanaugh of 20 Wooten Dr., Southampton NJ 08088. They are more than willing to give you all the help you need.

As soon as more states have approved such legislation, a delegation will go to Washington, D.C. to obtain national legislation making Square Dance and its allied forms the American Folk Dance of the United States of America, for all time.

Let us all get involved in this project to give our activity the national recognition it deserves.

**SUMMER TRANSITION: A CRITICAL TIME**

We are entering the summer season and, in many areas, dancing activities will be curtailed. Classes throughout the country have had their graduation exercises. Now the real challenge is before us. We have introduced many new dancers to the wonderful world of square dancing, and we assume that most of them are interested in continuing their new-found hobby. Now let's encourage them so that their enthusiasm doesn't diminish during the summer months. In areas where clubs take a break from dancing during the summer, maintaining the enthusiasm of new dancers may pose a bit of a problem. However, your new dancers can be included in many activities which may or may not involve dancing.

Summertime is a good time to nurture the seeds of those friendships planted during the busy fall and spring classes. Now is the time to make them grow. How about a patio party or a pool party with lots of good food and time to relax and get to know one another? Or a barbecue? Or a picnic? Perhaps the patio or a cleaned out garage (a bonus, incidentally) will provide space for a bit of practice and relaxed dancing. One need not invite the entire group at one time but might consider smaller groups of people with similar backgrounds, abilities etc. And, of course, square dancers seem to make their best recipes when invited to lend a hand to provide food.

Camping trips also offer a great opportunity for including the new dancers in a relaxed, fun atmosphere where they can get to know club members and each other. If you are going to an out-of-town dance or a nearby festival, you may want to invite some of the new dancers to go along. They might be hesitant to go on their own but would jump at the chance to go with someone friendly who could help and encourage them.

Although there will be many workshops available to the newly graduated dancers, do not push them into an experience which might be discouraging and frustrating to them. Instead, encourage them to experience the fun of dancing at the level at which they graduated and to develop expertise at that level for a year or more before they move on to new programs. You will make a welcome contribution to reducing the drop-out rate if you do this.

Please remember to provide that personal touch for the newly graduated dancers during the summer months. Encourage them to appear on the club doorstep with dues in hand when the fall dance season starts.

### U. S. D. A. YOUTH ADVISORY COMMITTEE

The Youth Advisory Committee established by the UNITED SQUARE DANCERS OF AMERICA to promote youth square dancing on a nationwide basis is continuing to pursue the integration of "youth" into the square dance activity. The Committee provides guidance to our youth and the adults working with them, by providing information and guidelines regarding establishing and maintaining youth clubs and organizations.

USDA does not operate youth groups or organizations, but work as a research and development group. USDA would basically be offering "blueprints" that can be used to build youth programs at the local level. There are many cases where adults are willing to set up a youth group but, simply don't know how or where to begin.

There are three basic areas where USDA can offer assistance at this time. This assistance would consist of obtaining and reviewing materials currently in use, developing additional materials and modifying available adult materials where applicable. The materials will be compiled in booklet form for printing and distribution. The three basic areas of assistance are:

PROMOTION/EDUCATION - Materials would include methods to encourage youth participation in the square dance movement. The materials would include such things as how to set up a youth club, how to approach their local school district or park and recreation department or other organizations regarding a hall, how to locate a caller, how to make and distribute flyers, etc.

FINANCIAL GUIDANCE - Materials to explain how to raise funds for club operation and club events.

DIRECTORY - Provide a line of communications between the youth organizations.

Youth Liaison Representatives are being appointed in each of the four USDA Regions. If you desire more information or would like to work with the USDA YOUTH ADVISORY COMMITTEE, contact the USDA Youth Committee Chairman.

## NORTHWEST FLORIDA SQUARE AND ROUND DANCE ASSOCIATION

### HISTORY OF THE ASSOCIATION

This is the third in a series of articles covering the history of the Northwest Florida Square & Round Dance Association. The purpose of these articles is to record the events which resulted in the Association that we have today.

Dateline 1976

Many significant events took place in 1976 which set the future course of the Association. With the original officers having served one term and re-elected for another, the needs of the Association became more apparent. Some of the major accomplishments were:

1. An accident/medical insurance program was implemented. Fred and Leslie Joyner were appointed coordinators.
2. The Newsletter became a monthly publication. A contest was held to name the publication, and Rosemary Franklin submitted the winner--"Panhandle Press." A special events calendar was started to help clubs prevent scheduling conflicts.
3. The association held its 2nd Annual Roundup on Sept. 10-11, 1976. This was a major event celebrating the nation's Bi-Centennial. A Pageant was presented by approx. 100 dancers in period costumes depicting the history of our Country thru dance. The event was held and co-sponsored by Okaloosa-Walton Junior College. Over 300 dancers attended plus hundreds of spectators. Caller was Roger Chapman--Cuer, Kit Waldorf. Members of the NW Florida Callers called the trail-in dance. General Chairman was John Lackey.
4. The educational library was started and material made available to anyone needing information Marty Lackey was librarian.
5. The NW Ass't took a more active role in the State Federation with Joe and Doris Vaccari elected to the board. The State Convention Motto--"Dancing feet to the '76 beat."

As a new organization, meetings during 1976 were held every other month--in Panama City, Pensacola, Tallahassee, Valparaiso, Niceville and Chipley. All meetings were held at a special dance hosted by a member club. Membership as of the April '76 meeting stood at 20 clubs.

At the election held at the Roundup, the following officers were elected:

Treasurer	Larrie and Bill Childress, Panama City

Although much was accomplished, perhaps most importantly, the previously autonomous clubs were now united and working together for the benefit of all. Stay tuned.
