BMI/ASCAP LICENSING PROCEDURES

**ATTENTION: Florida Federation President
Association Presidents
All other interested parties**

A press release from the American Callers Association appearing in the May 1996 issue of Bow & Swing contains information pertaining to licensing procedures for State and National Conventions which may be misleading to leaders of dancer's associations in the State of Florida. Please be advised that there is no need for any Association, Club or Dancer in the State of Florida to contact A.C.A. or either of the licensing agencies for information and in fact would be detrimental for any dancer or association to do so.

The Florida Federation of Square Dancers has an existing agreement for licensing with both BMI and ASCAP. Therefore no further requests for licensing information should be made to either of these organizations. Nor should A.C.A. be contacted for forms or other information.

This agreement, which has been in effect since 1990, pertains to dancer's association and/or club functions only and is separate from any agreement made with Callerslab, Roundalab or any other caller/cuer organizations.

The licensing agreement between the Florida Federation and BMI and ASCAP would be seriously jeopardized if any individual dancer or association contacted the agencies on their own. NORTHWEST FLORIDA SQUARE AND ROUND DANCE ASSOCIATION

HISTORY OF THE ASSOCIATION

This is the Eleventh in a series of articles covering the history of the Northwest Florida Square & Round Dance Association. The purpose of these articles is to record the events which resulted in the Association we have today.

Dateline 1984

As the Association entered its tenth year, square and round dancing continued to grow in Northwest Florida. The Panhandle Press issues of 1984 are full of flyers promoting dances: Shantytown Shufflers with Damon Coe, Panhandle Promenaders Spring Fling, Pensacola's Valentine dance with John Saunders & McCords, Modern Squares 3rd annual Spanish Trail Festival, TASARDA's fifth annual festival, Rambling Roses 1st anniversary dance, Panama City's Christmas Ball to name a few. Some of the other major events were:

1. The 10th annual Roundup was held in Chipley with Elmer Sheffield, Darryl McMillan and the Waldorfs'.
2. The Association initiated membership dances to promote membership. The first membership dance was held October 20, 1984 in Blountstown, sponsored by the River City Ramblers. Jack White was the caller.
3. The 31st annual State Convention—Dancing and More in '84—was held in Lakeland. The National Convention was held in Baltimore.
4. The Pensacola Special Steppers were made honorary members of the Association at the 32 annual Pensacola Festival. Frank Cherry, caller, Taw Nancy, and each member of the Steppers were presented a Northwest Florida badge. Past presidents of the Association did the honors.
5. The Northwest Callers Association announced the new president was Jack White. Marvin Taylor was the Association insurance chairman. Janette Rae was chairman of the by-law revision committee. An organ bank was established. State Federation delegates were Grady and Janette Rae, Frank and Betty McCallister, Marvin and Olena Taylor and Vernon & Elaine Olberding.
6. The Treasurer reported a balance of \$3,650.86.
7. Officers elected to serve for the coming year:

FLORIDA FEDERATION STATE SQUARE DANCE OUTFIT

At the Florida Federation of Square Dancers Working Weekend February 17 & 18, 1996, it was approved to set in motion the process of selecting a NEW Florida State Square Dance Outfit.

In order to publicize and encourage dancers throughout Florida to participate, the Federation needs the help of each Association President and all Square and Round Dance Publications state wide.

Let it be known that anyone can submit an outfit, keeping the following guidelines in mind:

1. Keep the design simple with easy construction.
2. A design compatible to women of different sizes.
3. Availability of pattern.
4. Availability of material.
5. Accessories such as, shoes & petticoat, be a color the majority have.
6. Outfit should be for both men & women.
7. Outfits to be constructed and presented to Outfit Committee at February 1997, Working Weekend, along with a copy of pattern and logo.
8. Committee will select a minimum of 3 outfits to be displayed and voted upon at the full Federation assembly at the Sunday meeting. Voting shall be by ballot only.

To avoid any conflict with the current Florida Federation State Outfit or the 1997 National Convention Outfits, we suggest the new outfit not be worn until 1998.

Your Committee People are to be commended for making it so great.


We sincerely thank you for all your help, and your committee people's help in making our job easier at the Ways & Means table for the 46th National Convention.

And whether or not they should be facing the wall.

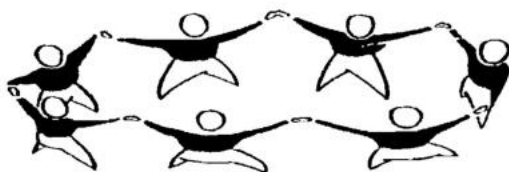
But when the round dance is performed properly,

INTERNATIONAL ASSEMBLY OF "TRUSTEES" OF THE SQUARE DANCE ACTIVITY

1996 PROMO-PAK NOW BEING PREPARED

Square dancers everywhere are interested in exchanging ideas on promoting square dancing and bringing new friends into the activity. The 1996 Promo-Pak is a packet of promotional ideas offered by LEGACY to clubs and associations as a help in recruitment for their next dance sessions.

Traditionally, September is celebrated as Square Dance Month in the U.S. In other countries, the time frame for beginning classes differed. Now that many groups are offering square dancing to the public at ten or twelve-week intervals, the Promo-Pak is useful on a year-round basis.

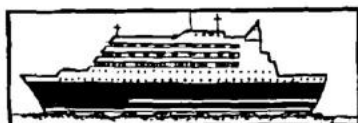

ERNIE "HOSS" & KIT WALDORF

Hoss and Kit began teaching rounds in 1974 and have since taught an average of one to two classes each year. They regularly lead multi-level round dance clubs, such as the Seaside Rounds of Pensacola, FL; Roundels of Ft. Walton Beach, FL (a club they helped form in '74); and the Happy Soles of Mobile, AL. The Waldorfs also began a RD group in Canoe, AL; no club was formed, but some of the dancers still dance today. They teach some high-intermediate/advanced rounds and still hold National Carousels charter #165. They regularly call/cue for SQ/RD dance clubs in FL and AL as well as lead numerous special dances, weekends and annual festivals throughout the Southeast.

The Waldorfs have taught rounds at several Florida State Conventions, Alabama's '92 SQ/RD Convention, five National Conventions, Florida Round Dance Council, Dixie RDC meetings and was MC and cued at two Universal RDC's. In addition to membership in these organizations, they are members of ASARDA and ARDTA (Chairman '94 RD Weekend), and are long-term members of NWFSRDA, NWFCFA (Hoss & Kit, Past President & Secretary, respectively; Kit - Secretary '94 & '95), ROUNDALAB, FCA, CALLERLAB ('91 & '92 Round of Month Committee), FRDC (several past and current Round of Month Committee.) and all local SQ/RD organizations. The Waldorfs served as RD Staff/Chairman at Fontana, North Carolina for 12 years; RD/SQ staff for Copecrest Resort in GA for two years; RD/SQ staff of Fontana's Golden Leaves Festival for two years; Co-staff Mt. Hi Advanced RD Special in Fontana for two years; and have taught and danced demonstrations at Fontana's Accent on Rounds. They also chaired rounds and squares for the '86 Florida State Convention and Rounds at the '91 Convention. They choreographed the '86 Squares exhibition and performed round dance exhibitions both years. They also participated, by request, in a RD exhibition for a State Convention chaired by the SE Florida Association.

The Waldorfs' published choreography (Dances in difficulty Phases II thru VI) includes recordings on Grenn and Lou Mac RD labels. For their dances, they have received over 70 Round of the Month awards from various areas throughout the USA. Some of their best known are SPANISH COFFEE, WALTZ OF THE ROSES, YOU ONLY YOU and ALONE IN SAN ANTONE.

Hoss, a caller for over 30 years, has recorded on the Chicago Country Branch Square Dance label. He calls regularly for a club in Pensacola, is alternate caller for other clubs and does a number of special engagements. Hoss and Kit greatly enjoy providing the SQ/RD program together, which they do often.
