The National Convention is now history and all of you who worked so hard and faithfully can now rest and be proud of Florida's participation in the 46th National Convention. Thanks for all of your hard work.

Thanks also to the Tallahassee Whirlaways and the Pensacola dancers for holding Trail Thru Dances to the National Convention. Northwest Florida received positive publicity throughout the state regarding these two dances.

Great dances held in our Association this quarter:

- In April, PASARDA held a charity dance in their hall at Ft. Walton Beach for the local shelter for abused women. They presented a check for \$350 to the shelter's representative.

- In April, Seaside Rounds held their 20th Annual Rounds Weekend at Ragon Hall in Pensacola. Guest cuers were Jerry & Barbara Pierce. Thirty-four couples enjoyed the weekend of workshops and dancing.

- On June 6-7 PASARDA hosted their 38th Annual Billy Bowlegs Festival. Joe Fioretti of Homosassa, FL called and Bob & Lynn Van Atta of Prairieville, LA cued. All the dancers had a great time.

- The Pensacola Twirlers hosted the Fiesta of Five Flags dance on June 14th. They had 25 squares moving gracefully over the floor. Chuck Myers of Pensacola called and June Leverette of Tallahassee cued. Don Tristan DeLuna and his Court visited the dance. After the award ceremony, the Court had a great time dancing with our dancers.

The spring meeting of NWFSRDA was held in Ft. Walton Beach on May 31st. Pertinent items are listed below for your information:

- Current net worth is \$5,023.95. The budget is on track for the first seven months of our fiscal year.

- Gary Ping, Editor of the Panhandle Press, reported that he is happy with the club articles being submitted and requested that all clubs continue to submit articles for future issues. He also requested information on all dances be submitted. Flyers are very economical

- The association has increased its membership by over 25% this year. We hope to be able to do the same next year. Each member needs to get a new member.

- Julian Rosdick reported that preparations for the 1997 Round Up are proceeding smoothly. He predicts (and hopes!) 200 dancers will attend. Mark October 24-25 on your calendar.

- The proposed changes to the By Laws were passed out to all attendees. We will vote on these proposed changes at the August 9th meeting in Marianna.

- Tony & Patti Gee, Chairpersons of the Dancer of the Year Award Committee, reported that the Dancer of the Year award instructions will be mailed to all clubs in June. Be sure to give your nominee a great write-up listing their accomplishments in your club and your community. The winner will be announced on Saturday night at the Round Up.

- Glen & Ann Price were appointed Chairpersons of the 1998 Nominating Committee.

- Bill Donahue, President of the NWF Callers Association, gave an informative presentation on an alternative method of teaching (10-10 Program) new dancers. If you have any questions regarding this method, please give Bill a call at (904) 477-8389.

The Association dance was held on May 31 at PASARDA Hall in Ft. Walton Beach. We had great attendance - 13 squares of dancers! The callers were Bill Donahue, Chuck Myers, Jack White and Ben Williams. The cuers were Al Doolittle and June Leverette. Bob Poyner also called a tip for us using his best yodeling voice. Seventy-five folks stayed for the After Party and were treated to several skits presented by Jerry Williamson and his cast of actors/actresses. Chuck & Bobbie Myers led the group in several songs. The best cooks in Northwest Florida (maybe in all of Florida) furnished many delicious pies for the party. The pies were served after we had all sampled too many delicious goodies during the dance. However, we are proud to say that once again our dancers rose to the challenge and made the ladies who furnished pies feel appreciated by eating all of them! Our sincere appreciation to all who made this dance so much fun.

The contribution of the NWFSRDA to the unfortunate people of

North Dakota & Minnesota was just outstanding. We collected more than 500 pounds of various supplies and \$125 in cash. We received a letter of appreciation from the Gulf Breeze United Methodist Church (see copy elsewhere in this issue of the Panhandle Press). Thanks again to all of you who helped these people in their time of need. Once again you have confirmed what we have always known - square dancers are kind and caring people.

It was reported to us that two couples of new dancers experienced a very disturbing incident at the Fiesta Dance in Pensacola. From the information we received, it appears that four couples agreed to form a "pat square." Two of the couples were not yet on the floor when the new dancers tried to join the square. They were pushed aside by the two couples who were late getting on to the floor. The new dancers were very upset (as **any** of us would be!). One couple was so upset that they left the dance early. We believe that this incident is an isolated one in our Square Dance Community and hope that the new dancers were excluded from the square thoughtlessly and not maliciously. We must **all** remember that we were new dancers at one time. Three of the **DON'TS** of Square Dancing are: 1) **Don't** walk away from a square or walk through a square; 2) **Don't** hold a place for anyone in a square; 3) **Don't** form cliques and dance in the same set all the time. We all have friends that we enjoy dancing with, but we need to make a special effort to be considerate of the feelings of others. We sincerely hope that by making everyone aware of this incident, all of us will be more conscious of our actions and remember to do everything that we can to help all dancers have **fun**.

We want to express our deep appreciation to all who helped produce three major dances in our area in June. We especially thank all the dancers who danced with us. Your attendance made the dances successful. We hope that all of you will support the '97 Round-Up in October in the same outstanding manner. Our goal is 25 squares at the Round-Up. Help us meet this goal.

The next NWFSRDA meeting will be on August 9 in Marianna at Wimberly Warehouse, 4438 Franklin St. (dance on a wooden floor). The meeting will begin at 3:00 PM and the dance at 7:30 PM. Northwest Florida callers and cuers will staff the dance. We're also

going to have another After Party. Don't miss the meeting and dance folks! We're working to make each one better and better but we need your participation to succeed.

On the "not so well" list we all wish Peter Richardson, our caller, and Jim Hinson, square dancer, a speedy return to the good health they have always enjoyed.

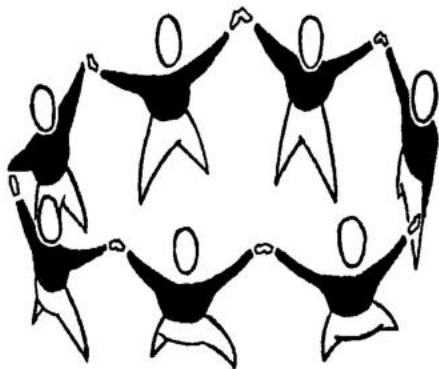

THE CALLERS' CORNER

"An Idea Whose Time Has Arrived"

Since this is the first article, I thought it only proper that the President of the NWFC be the one to introduce it. I just received my Callerlab notes from the March meeting in California. It was interesting to me to find that a great deal of interest has become apparent in a short-term class for beginner dancers. This program would revolve around a 20-week course, to be exact, graduating students at the Basic Level. Although I don't completely agree with the Basic Level Entry Program, I do agree with the concept of shorter classes. I will go further in saying that a need for an accelerated course is more in my liking.

As an example, in California I was instrumental in putting together an eight-week course - to be continued with another eight-week course, and then another additional one to fill out the year. This took 9 months to complete with 3 different groups participating - each group helping the newer group until at the end of the school year, all would graduate together - thus the term 10-10-10 or 8-8-8. Now I would like to take this step a great deal further. Instead of 30 or 24 weeks as a final destination, let us suppose that we could put together an accelerated course that could be taught in 15 hours - all in one weekend. This would mean that brand new dancers could learn around 40 or 45 Basics, or the equivalent of a half-way destination, all in one weekend. We could then follow-up on a designated night once a week for the rest of the month and learn the remaining Extended Basics as per Callerlab. This could be a great way to have on-going classes every month, with a new class beginning the first weekend of every month, followed up with additional instruction for the rest of the month.

I am very much interested in some feedback from clubs and callers alike to see where this might take our square dance program. I, for one, would like to see a new approach to recruiting more people to our activity, because, as we all know, things as they are now are not working. I am now working and implementing a direction to attain this idea.

If clubs are interested, please feel free to get in touch. Just think - the club dance night could be devoted to square dancing rather than part class and part square dance at club level.

I know an accelerated program does work, since I have successfully done it for 15 years in California.

DANCER RECOGNITION

Two major programs within the Northwest Association and the State of Florida recognize dance accomplishments in supporting and promoting Square Dancing:

The Northwest Dancer of the Year's name, club name and city is then included on a special plaque and displayed at special dances and meetings. The award is made at the Round Up each year.

B. Florida Square & Round Dance Hall of Fame Program

The Florida Hall of Fame recognizes significant contributions that have had a **statewide** impact with **ten or more years**

involvement in Square or Round Dancing in Florida. Nominees may be a dancer, caller, cuer, promoter, teacher, organizer, vendor or publisher who has given much time and unselfish labor to the activity. Just the fact that the nominee is a popular person or an all-around "good person" is not enough to qualify that person. Nor is it enough to have had a major impact only within one's own association.

The Hall of Fame Committee is comprised of two couples each from the three state organizations. Namely, Florida Federation of Square Dancers, Round Dance Council of Florida and the Florida Callers Association. This committee does not determine who is selected for the Hall of Fame.

A Selection Committee comprised of a cross section of dancers, callers and cuers from each of the five-area associations vote on the nominees. Members of the Selection Committee are unknown to one another. The votes are then counted by the Hall of Fame Committee to determine if a nominee has received enough votes to be inducted into the Hall of Fame.

New Hall of Fame inductees are recognized at the State Convention each year. Plaques of the inductees are on display at Strawberry Squares in Plant City.

The Northwest Association has two couples in the Florida Hall of Fame: Joe & Joy Vaccari, Ft. Walton Beach, inducted in 1989 and George & Johnnie Eddins, Pensacola, inducted in 1994.
