If you were unable to attend the 44<sup>th</sup> State Convention in Lakeland in May, you missed a good time. The center has been completely renovated. The halls were nice and big, the sound generally good, the calling excellent, and a central area for a quick snack. Make your plans now to attend next year. We need to support the other associations in their efforts to bring all dancers a good convention. It will be our turn again in 2002 and we will surely want and need the other four Florida associations support.

The spring meeting of the NWF Association was held in Pensacola on June 13<sup>th</sup>. We were disappointed that neither the Tallahassee nor Panama City areas were represented at the meeting. Hopefully, our summer meeting on August 29<sup>th</sup> in Panama City will be better attended. This will be a very important meeting as we will elect officers to serve for 1998-99. We will also consider approving guidelines for clubs to apply to the association for a grant to help defray expenses of advertising for new dancers.

Tom Hancock (Ft. Walton Beach) was appointed as Chairman of the Nominating Committee. Harry Rudy (Tallahassee) was appointed as Chairman of the 1998 Dancer of the Year Committee. Thanks guys for volunteering to serve on these very important committees.

At the May 24<sup>th</sup> Federation meeting it was announced that a committee will be appointed to look into the feasibility of changing the date of the State Convention from late May to sometime earlier in the year. An earlier date will enable our dancers who are part-time citizens of Florida to attend the convention before they leave for their summer homes. If a change is approved, it will be several years before it can be implemented. The committee members will be made up of dancers, callers and cuers. Please express your views on this important matter to any of your Federation delegates so that they can pass the information on to the committee members. The more information the committee has the better decision they can make.

We are in the final stages of putting Northwest's Dancer of the Year Plaque in the Strawberry Squares Hall located in Plant City, FL. All five Florida Associations now have a plaque honoring their dancers of the year in the hall. This is also the site of Florida's Hall of Fame. When you are in that area, be sure to drop in and take a look at the plaques and dance with the folks.

Northwest has a new "Showcase of Ideas" display. The new theme this year for the entire state is "Square Dancers are a Florida Treasure." Jack and Pat Lorusso and Tom and Dorothy Kracht of the Emerald Coasters in Ft.

Walton Beach designed and produced the display. Thanks a bunch for an outstanding product. The showcase was displayed at the State Convention in Lakeland, the Billy Bowlegs Dance in Ft. Walton Beach, the Fiesta of Five Flags Dance in Pensacola, and the 47<sup>th</sup> National Square Dance Convention in Charlotte, NC. If you missed it at these dances, you'll have an opportunity to view it when you go to the Roundup in October.



### **NEW FLORIDA STATE SQUARE DANCE OUTFIT**

May 26, 1998

The new Florida state square dance outfit is a white eight gore skirt on the outside with eight hidden colored gores on the inside which flare out when twirled. These colored gores are about one-half the width of the outside gores and are in alternating rainbow colors of yellow, blue, pink and pale green. The colors represent the following: yellow, the sunshine state; blue, the ocean; pink, the sunset; green, the continuous green season. Tiny colored bows sit above each hidden gore of the same color.

The top is a white peasant blouse with tiered sleeves of green and yellow topped with a blue ruffle. A pink bow sits at the center top of the ruffle to discretely pick up the remaining rainbow color of pink.

The man's white shirt has alternating rows of the same rainbow colors on the yoke. The pants can be white or one of the rainbow colors.

The instructions on preparation will be sent to each association president for distribution within the next few weeks.

- Fred appointed Tom Hancock to chair the Nominating Committee and Harry Rudy to chair the Dancer of the Year Committee.
- The Amendment to Standing Rules, Guideline III was approved. The amendment codifies the procedure for selecting NWFSRDA's Dancer of the Year.
- The next NWFSRDA meeting will be August 29 at Grand Square Hall in Panama City.
