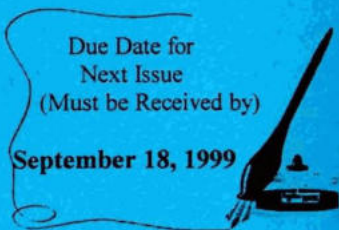

### HOW FRIENDLY ARE WE

(Reprinted from *Travel On*, Mar - May '99)

(Reprinted from *USDA NEWS*, Oct/Dec 1998)

A couple or a single looking for a square dance club to join, devised the following point system....

- \* If someone smiled at them — 10 points
- \* If someone sitting near them greeted them — 10 points
- \* If someone told them their name — 100 points
- \* If someone asked them to come back — 200 points
- \* If someone introduced them to another couple — 1000 points
- \* If someone introduced them to the caller — 2000 points

They visited eighteen clubs. Using the point scale, none of the clubs had more than 100 points! Their conclusion.....

.... The club may be meaningful, do great things for their community, and be

active and friendly, but when a visitor finds no one cares whether or not he/she is there, that visitor's not likely to come back, let alone join your club.

If a visitor came to your next square dance, what rating would they give your club?

At the beginning of each new year, we may see many new faces at club dances and clubs we are visiting. Everyone has the responsibility to make sure that these new faces are made to feel welcome. It takes at least two years to understand the finer points of square dancing; even longer sometimes to understand club organization and member/officer responsibilities and realize the true benefits of being part of the program. ## FLORIDA SQUARE & ROUND DANCE HALL OF FAME

### -Two Northwest Couples Inducted-

Two Northwest Association couples were inducted into the Florida Hall of Fame during the 45<sup>th</sup> Florida State Convention held in Lakeland over Memorial Day Weekend.

Marvin (deceased January 1997) & Olena Taylor, and Cliff & Jean Allen were honored by their peers in a moving presentation during the opening ceremonies on Sunday evening. Two other couples were also inducted - Art & Martha Springer and Worley & Nan Carrier.

The criteria for nomination and selection for the Hall of Fame is very strict. Nominees must have had ten or more years involvement in Square and Round dancing in Florida. The nominee must have had a significant Statewide impact as a Caller, Cuer, Dancer, Promoter, Teacher, Organizer, Vendor or Publisher and given much time and unselfish labor to the Square & Round Dancing. Just the fact that the nominee is a popular dancer or all around "good fellow" is not enough to qualify that person. This is a rare and distinct honor but highly deserved by the Allens and the Taylors.

The accomplishments of the Taylor's and the Allen's are too numerous to detail here, however a few facts follow:

### **Marvin and Olena Taylor**

Marvin & Olena Taylor had been active square dancers for 25 years and contributed tremendously to the furtherance of the square dance activity in Florida and in Northwest Florida. They were one of the principal organizers of the Northwest Association, served on the committee which drafted the bylaws and was one of its first officers. They were one of Northwest's first delegates to the State Federation and helped Northwest become a full member of the Florida Federation thereby unifying the State. They served almost continuously as Federation delegates for almost 23 years.

They were the General Chairman of the 28<sup>th</sup> Florida State Square and Round Dance Convention, which was the first State Convention ever hosted by the Northwest Association. They served as Advisors/Vice Chairmen for the 1986, 1991, and 1996 State Conventions. The Taylors were the second President of the Northwest Association and served two consecutive terms. They were truly pioneers in leading to the unification of the Northwest area, leading the Northwest Association into the State Federation, and to becoming hosts for the State Convention every five years.

### **Cliff & Jean Allen**

Cliff and Jean have been active Square Dancers for over 25 years. Their dedication to the furtherance of the Square Dance activity has been demonstrated by their active participation at the local, area, State and National levels. At State level, they have worked tirelessly since 1984 when they became Northwest delegates. In 1989 they were elected to the State Executive Board, serving in every office, and culminating as President in 1993-94. They served as State Convention Chairmen for the 1991 and 1996 State Conventions. They were the Florida delegate to USDA for two years and have been LEGACY International Trustees since 1995. They were Assistant Chairmen of Education and Vice Chairmen of Panels for the 46<sup>th</sup> National Square Dance Convention in Orlando. They have shown they can lead, but more importantly they encourage less experienced dancers to become leaders and to be more active at all levels of Square Dance organizations. They are currently serving as Presidents of the Northwest Association. Cliff and Jean have truly earned the honor of being inducted into the Florida Square and Round Dance Hall of Fame.

Plaques for the Allens and the Taylors have been placed on display at Strawberry Square, Plant City, - the permanent home of the of the Hall of Fame.

Congratulations to the Allen's and Taylors from all Northwest Dancers and thanks for all of your hard work.


## 2002 STATE CONVENTION
